Brooklyn Call-down



A call-down of Brooklyn CERT members was performed on Tuesday evening for a missing boy in the Canarsie section of Brooklyn. Within an hour, 19 NYC CERT members were available to deploy at a moment's notice. Luckily, the boy was found just before CERT was deployed to support the search effort. We do want to send a special thanks to our Borough Coordinator, Angela Thompson and Deputy Borough

Coordinator, Elba Melendez along with leaders from Brooklyn Divisions 5, 6 and 7 - Division Chiefs Nancy Walby and Susan Flaschenberg and District Leader Robert Gochfeld who performed call-downs to availability. Last but not least, we thank the many volunteers who were prepared to deploy.

While CERT did not deploy for the search, this experience did serve as a good mobilization exercise to test Brooklyn's communication and readiness. The structure and process was reviewed the following day with borough leadership to discuss potential improvements in the process going forward. All updates will be provided in future newsletters.


Staten Island Deployment

NYC CERT Communication Guidance



- All lines of communications represented are a mutual communication between one and (to) the other (e.g. Borough Coordinator communicates information to Division Chief and vice-versa).
- Please allow for a timely response (Anything urgent, please feel free to Cc: CERT Program Staff (CERT@oem.nyc.gov)
- The communication structure should not be broken by bypassing any position as indicated. We encourage you to

exhaust all communication through direct lines first. No position should reach out to another above their direct line without exhausting communication's direct line first (e.g. District Leader does not email Deputy Borough Coordinator without first connecting with their Division Chief).

- This will provide situational awareness for leadership at any level within the communication structure.
- If you continue to not receive a response, the level of communication should be respectful when reaching out to the next person. Inform of your tried attempts. Leadership may be able to fix that communication.
- Any new inquiries should again be communicated to that first line of communication.



Manhattan Leadership gathered for their monthly check-in earlier this week. The division leaders discussed upcoming events that they are actively coordinating. Program staff reminded leadership of the current registration process and how to display events on the [CERT Event Calendar](#) which is amplified in the weekly newsletter. Leadership is also compiling a yearly calendar of recurring events to have Division leadership planning ahead.



Queens Division 1 met this week to review their experience at this year's National Night Out and the the multiple locations attended. This review also included a conversation on the importance of a continued relationship with their local police precincts like the 108th pct, which would be essential in having NYC CERT support the Long Island City Fireworks show next year.



Manhattan Division 1 members hosted their monthly meeting this week. Outside of general team business, an important take-away was NYC CERT Program staff discussing that if members are unable to support an entire shift for any opportunity, they should reach out to the volunteer or organizational lead and express their availability. While most deployments have a strict start and end time, some events may be flexible.

NYC CERT Program staff hosted a **Member Support Meeting**. During the meeting, staff welcomed new graduates, long standing members and district leaders. These meetings are offered regularly for CERT members at all experience levels to attend and request clarity and/or general information on a range of topics including how to register for events, report volunteer hours, as well as discussing best practices with one another.




