DEAR SIR:—In conformity with the requirements of section 119 of chapter 378 of the Laws of 1897, known as the Greater New York Charter, we transmit herewith the results of our examination of the receipts and disbursements of the office of the Chamberlain for the first quarter of 1900.

The balance in the City Treasury, Sinking Funds and Miscellaneous Accounts on March 31, 1900, was \$15,831,915.14, which agrees with the balance as stated in the Chamberlain's books, and also the certificates of the officers of the several depository banks of concurrent date.

M., two desperate negro men, Frank Emerson, alias Johnson, and Arthur Flanagan, committed on a charge of burglary, made their escape from the Seventh District Prison by sawing two bars at the lower part of their cells. With these bars used as bludgeons they killed Hugh McGovern, Keeper, who was on duty on the tier, and struck down George Wilson, a self-committed prisoner, before he could give the alarm. Keeper Brady, who was on duty in the lower part of the prison, called up the speaking tube, but, receiving no reply, went up stairs and found the lifeless body of Keeper McGovern, and "Trusty" George Wilson bound, gagged and unconscious. A hurry call was sent for an ambulance, but the physician found Keeper McGovern dead. Wilson was taken to the Roosevelt Hospital and regained consciousness. One prisoner, Emerson, was killed by falling from a window in the attempt to escape, but Flanagan succeeded in getting away, and is still at large. On file.
