Only a few days left.

Beginning **Tuesday, February 1, 2022**, volunteers who have not submitted appropriate documentation to meet the vaccine mandate and have not applied for a medical or religious reasonable accommodation through NYCEM will be placed as inactive and unscheduled from

volunteer shifts until they are in compliance.

- To submit vaccination records, please e-mail an approved proof of vaccination to: <u>CERTVaxVerification@oem.nyc.gov</u>.
- To request a reasonable accommodation for either religious or medical please follow the steps <u>HERE</u>

All NYC CERT members MUST provide proof of vaccination (as per below protocol) or receive approval for an accommodation prior participating in any inperson CERT-related activity, including deployment.



The New York City Winter Weather Plan is activated. National Weather Service issued a Winter Storm Warning in effect from 7 PM Friday through 7 PM today Citywide. Continue to monitor your email for the latest forecasts and other updates relating to winter weather.

For our snow measurers - New York City Emergency Management is requesting your assistance. Please be reminded that you do not have to officially activated to submit snow measurements. Any help that you can provide is always appreciated. If you do not have your measuring stick, you can still participate. As explained during training, you may use any ruler to take the measurements.

There are now two ways to submit you're your measurements – using your mobile phone or

internet browser on your computer desktop.

Please note: When using the mobile app, it will be asked to turn on your GPS location access in order to provide the National Weather Service with more accurate data that can be mapped.

Snowfall measuring tips:

- The ruler must have one-tenth of an inch increment.
- Before your first measurement, identify the most undisturbed and representative area(s).
- Take multiple measurements. Discount outliers and AVERAGE the readings. The final result will be that average number to the nearest tenth of an inch, e.g., 3.2.
- Unless conditions change drastically, you will likely measure in approximately the same locations during an event. Watch your step and try to keep these areas as undisturbed as possible.
- When to measure: no more frequently than every three (3) hours.
- If snow changes to rain or sleet, take a measurement as soon as possible.
- Remember, sleet is treated as snow.
- Although there may be no snowfall, indicate "0" readings through the website as well.






