COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at a Meeting held at the Mayor's Office at 12 o'clock M., on Wednesday, October 30, 1901.

Present at roll call—Robert A. Van Wyck, Mayor; Bird S. Coler, Comptroller; Randolph Guggenheimer, President of the Council, and Robert Muh, Chairman, Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen.

The minutes of the meeting held October 11, 1901, were approved as printed.

In behalf of the Committee appointed at the meeting held April 10, 1901, to ascertain facts and to devise ways and means of relieving the over-crowded condition of the Women's Prison, Kings County, the President of the Council reported that the prison had been examined and that the Committee were about to report, when they were called before the Grand Jury in connection therewith. That body appeared to be satisfied that one wing of the Penitentiary could be made available. The Commissioners of the Sinking Fund having no jurisdiction over the transfer of prisoners, a further report is unnecessary.

He therefore requested that the Committee be discharged, which was granted.

The following report and resolution were received from the Board of Education relative to a renewal of the lease of premises on the northeast corner of Morris Park avenue and Lincoln street, Van Nest, Borough of The Bronx:

To the Board of Education:

The premises being necessary to relieve Public School 26, Borough of Richmond, and the rental asked, \$360 per annum, in my opinion being full but not excessive, I would recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund authorize the Comptroller to execute a lease of the premises known as the German Evangelical Lutheran Church, Richmond turnpike, Linoleumville, Borough of Richmond, for a term of one year from the date of occupation, to be certified to by the Board of Education, at an annual rental of \$360, payable quarterly, to include fuel and Janitor's services, the owner, German Evangelical Lutheran Church of Linoleumville, Borough of Richmond, reserving the right to use the premises on Sundays and Christmas Day, and to pay all taxes and water rents.

OCTOBER 18, 1901.

Hon. BIRD S. COLER, Comptroller:

SIR—Hon. John Whalen, Corporation Counsel, in communication to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund October 10, 1901, says:

"I transmit herewith, for the sanction of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, a proposed lease, approved as to form, of the twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth floors of the Gerken Building, Nos. 90 and 92 West Broadway, now used by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in condemnation proceedings assigned to the Bureau of Street Openings in this Department.

"Under the provisions of sections 258 and 997 of the Greater New York Charter it is made the duty of the Corporation Counsel to provide the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment with suitable offices, and after January 1, 1902, these Commissioners are required to meet only in the offices provided for them by the Corporation Counsel.

"There are now pending in the Bureau of Street Openings 414 different condemnation proceedings relating to property in the various boroughs of the city.

"The proposed lease is the same in terms, and at the same rental per floor, as the lease held by the City of New York of the ninth floor of the same building, used by the Bureau of Street Openings.

"The rental in question will be charged to each special proceeding, and the City will be reimbursed out of the assessments for benefit.

"As the floors in question have been arranged to meet the requirements of hearing rooms for the sessions of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, I deem it advisable that a more permanent arrangement be made with the landlord of the Gerken Building than the one now prevailing, namely, from month to month."

Under the provisions of section 217 of the Charter the premises can only be leased after being presented to and passed upon by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund. This section provides that "it shall be the duty of the Comptroller, after due inquiry to be made by him, to present to the said Commissioners a statement in writing of the facts relating to any real estate proposed to be leased, the purposes for which such lease is required by the City, with his opinion, and the reasons therefor, as to the fair and reasonable rent of said premises."

The purpose for which the premises are to be leased is stated "as now used by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in condemnation proceedings assigned to the Bureau of Street Openings in this Department."

I have examined the premises, the twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth floors of the Gerken Building, and consider them well suited for the purpose in view, and in area not more than sufficient.

As heretofore reported by me on March 3, 1896, on the occasion of leasing the ninth floor, the building is a first-class structure, fireproof throughout, with two elevators run by electricity, and the whole electric plant connected therewith being of the highest standard. The rooms are supplied with hot and cold water, and the sanitary arrangements are excellent. The building is heated by steam by direct radiation and lighted by gas and electricity.

The area of each floor is 2,235 square feet, which at the proposed rental, \$4,000 per floor per annum, is at the rate of \$1.79 per square foot per annum, which I consider reasonable for this class of office building.

Included in this rental, and as expressed in the proposed lease, "The landlord will furnish Janitor service, steam heat to warm the offices and halls during the cold season from October 15 to May 15, also the necessary gas or electric light in said premises, and the use of water for ordinary purposes, in said premises without extra charge."

The proposed lease runs "from the 1st of October, 1901, for and during the term of five years thence next ensuing * * * yielding and paying therefor * * * the annual rent or sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) * * * payable * * * in equal monthly payments, to wit: on the last day of October, 1901, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), and a like sum on the last days of each and every month thereafter during the said term."

These frequent payments are somewhat unusual, but I know of no objection to them, and there may be some reason in their favor.

It will be noted that the counsel in his letter says, "The rental in question will be charged to each special proceeding, and the City will be reimbursed out of the assessments for benefit."

In my opinion the lease of the premises may be properly authorized by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for the term of five years, commencing on the 1st of October, 1901, as

requested by the Corporation Counsel in his communication to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund dated October 10, 1901.

The following communication was received from James H. Scrimgeour, protesting against the leasing of premises known as Avon Hall for the Brooklyn Public Library:

OCTOBER 24, 1901.

Hon. ROBERT A. VAN WYCK, City Hall, New York City:

DEAR SIR—There is to be a meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, I am informed, this afternoon to decide upon the advisability of changing the site of the Brooklyn Public Library to Avon Hall on Bedford avenue, from its present location at Brevoort place. I think that a mere glance at the proposed new site would be sufficient to convince any reasonable man of its utter undesirability for library purposes, and I am sure that the citizens of the Bedford section would almost unanimously oppose such a change. Probably they would have given some outspoken indications of the expression of their feeling in this matter if this meeting had not been unknown to almost every one. I am quite sure that a petition, if sufficient time were given, could be obtained with hundreds of the best names in our section of the city.

Hoping that you will consider very carefully this change before allowing it to be done, I remain,

The President of the Council made an oral report of his examination of these premises and the inadvisability of leasing the same, whereupon the Comptroller offered the following resolution:

Which was unanimously adopted.

The Comptroller presented the following report of the Engineer of the Department of Finance relative to the lease of property at Flatbush occupied by the Long Island State Hospital:

OCTOBER 21, 1901.

Hon. BIRD S. COLER, Comptroller:

SIR—Hon. Henry S. Kearny, Commissioner of Public Buildings, Lighting and Supplies, in communication to the Comptroller, September 30, 1901, submits a communication from Evan F. Smith, M. D., Secretary of the Board of Managers of the Long Island State Hospital, in relation to extending a certain lease of property at Flatbush now occupied by the said hospital.

The communication is as follows:

"By direction of the Board of Managers of the Long Island State Hospital, I hereby notify you that it is the intention of the Board of Managers of the Long Island State Hospital on behalf of the State of New York, to avail themselves of the privilege of extending from and after October 1, 1901, the term of the lease of the property at Flatbush, now occupied by said hospital, which was leased to the State of New York, by a certain indenture of lease, bearing date the 1st day of October, 1895, made and executed by Thomas Fitchie, Supervisor at Large, of the County of Kings, on behalf of the County of Kings, under and by virtue of the provisions of chapter 628 of the Laws of the State of New York, passed May 11, 1895, to the State of New York, and recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Kings in Liber 1 of conveyances, at page 528, in Section 15, Blocks 4832, 4833, 4834, 4835, 4836, 4617 and 4618, as in said lease provided."

Section 3 of chapter 628, Laws of 1895, authorizes the lease of this property to the State for a period of five years, with the privilege of extending the same from year to year, not exceeding five years additional."

Under the provisions of this law, the property described below was leased by the Supervisor of Kings County to the State of New York for a term of five years from October 1, 1895, with privilege of extending same from year to year, not exceeding five years additional; buildings and appurtenances to be solely used for the accommodation and maintenance of the insane, and for the purposes of a State Hospital.

"All those two certain pieces or plots of land, situate, lying and being in the Twenty-ninth Ward of the City of Brooklyn (formerly the Town of Flatbush), bounded and described as follows:

"First Parcel—Beginning at a point on the westerly side of Albany avenue, as the same is now opened, where a fence stands on the southerly boundary line of these premises, the said point being nineteen feet eleven inches southerly from the northerly side of Clarkson street, as the said street is laid down on the Town Survey Commissioners' Map of Kings County; running thence northerly along the westerly side of Albany avenue four hundred and seventeen feet eleven inches to another fence; thence westerly along the said fence three hundred and ninety-nine feet; thence southerly along another fence four hundred and seventeen feet nine inches to the first-mentioned fence standing on the southerly boundary line of the said premises at a point nineteen feet nine inches southerly from the said northerly side of Clarkson street; and thence easterly along the last-mentioned fence three hundred and ninety-nine feet to the place of beginning.

"Second Parcel—Beginning at a point on the easterly side of Albany avenue, as the same is now opened, where a fence stands on the southerly boundary line of these premises, the said point being twenty feet two and one-half inches southerly from the northerly side of Clarkson street, as laid down on said map; running thence northerly along the easterly side of Albany avenue five hundred and eighty-five feet six inches to a fence standing on the northerly boundary line of these premises at a point twenty-three feet one inch northerly from the southerly side of Winthrop street, as laid down on the said map; thence easterly along said fence six hundred and fifty-four feet five and one-quarter inches to a point nine feet two inches northerly from the said southerly side of Winthrop street, and sixty-five feet eight and one-half inches westerly from the westerly side of Troy avenue, as laid down on said map; thence northeasterly twenty-three feet seven and one-half inches to a point twenty-six feet ten inches northerly from the said southerly side of Winthrop street, and fifty feet westerly from the westerly side of Troy avenue; thence again easterly, still along said fence, six hundred and twenty-five feet to a point twenty-six feet ten and one-half inches northerly from the southerly side of Winthrop street; thence southerly one hundred and ninety-four feet one inch to a point twenty-five feet westerly from the easterly side of East Forty-sixth street, as laid down on said map; thence easterly four hundred and forty feet to a point sixty-five feet westerly from the westerly side of East Forty-eighth street, as laid down on said map; thence southerly parallel with said East Forty-eighth street one hundred feet; thence easterly two hundred and twenty-five feet to the centre line of the block between East Forty-eighth and East Forty-ninth streets, as said streets are laid down on said map; thence southerly along the centre line of said block two hundred and ninety-one feet eight inches to the fence standing on the southerly boundary line of the said premises at a point sixteen feet and eight inches southerly from the northerly side of Clarkson street, as laid down on said map; and thence westerly along the said fence nineteen hundred and sixty feet to the place of beginning.

"The said two parcels together containing twenty-six and sixty-two one-hundredths acres, as shown upon a map or survey of the same made by Fred Thomas, City Surveyor, September, 1895, with all the buildings and improvements thereon, occupied or used for the insane on the 1st day of October, 1895, together with their equipment and fixtures for the term of five years from the 1st day of October, 1895, with the privilege of extending the same from year to year, not exceeding five years additional, etc."


No renewal of the lease was made at the expiration of the five-year term, the premises being occupied on a hold-over lease.

At this stage of the proceedings the Chamberlain appeared and took his seat in the Board.

The Comptroller presented the following report of the Engineer of the Department of Finance relative to the application of William P. Wuest for an opportunity to purchase premises on DeKalb avenue, west of Classon avenue, Borough of Brooklyn:

OCTOBER 23, 1901.

Hon. BIRD S. COLER, Comptroller:

SIR—On September 25, 1901, the following application was received:

"I am instructed by William P. Wuest to write to you making application for an opportunity of purchasing premises on the south side of DeKalb avenue, 100 feet west of Classon avenue, being about 84 feet front and rear and 100 feet on each side, and being further known as Lots Nos. 5, 6 and 7, on Block 55, in the Seventh Ward of the Borough of Brooklyn.

"Kindly advise me of your determination in the matter, and oblige,

The records of this Department show that on March 30, 1889, the former City of Brooklyn purchased a site for station-house, etc., on the southwesterly corner of DeKalb avenue and Classon avenue, Borough of Brooklyn, the same being 184 feet 1 inch on DeKalb avenue by 96 feet 7 inches on Classon, by irregular. Consideration, \$24,250.

A station-house and appurtenances were erected for the use of the Fourth Precinct, but such improvements only cover a plot 100 feet by 96 feet 7 inches on the corner, leaving vacant a portion of the land acquired.

This vacant portion is shown on the tax maps of the Seventh Ward of the Borough of Brooklyn as Lots Nos. 5, 6 and 7, on Block 55, being 84 feet in front by 100 feet deep.

Under date of October 5, 1901, a letter was addressed to the Commissioner and Chief of Police setting forth the facts as above stated, and requesting to be informed if the vacant lot was used by the Police Department for any purpose, or if any plan was contemplated for its improvement. Further, if not required for police uses, that the same be turned over to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

In reply, the Chief Clerk of the Police Department, under date of October 12, 1901, addresses the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund as follows:

"The Police Commissioner this day, on reading and filing communication from Edgar J. Levey, Esq., Deputy Comptroller, dated October 5, 1901, and report thereon of David McMahon, Sergeant in Command of Headquarters Squad, Brooklyn,

"Ordered, That the plot of land purchased by the former City of Brooklyn for station-house purposes, adjoining plot occupied by the station-house of the Fifty-sixth Precinct, southwest corner of DeKalb and Classon avenues, Borough of Brooklyn, as shown on tax maps of the Seventh Ward of Brooklyn as Lots Nos. 5, 6 and 7, on Block 55, being eighty-four feet in front by one hundred feet deep, be and is hereby turned over to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for such assignment as may be desirable, or to be sold for the benefit of the City, the Police Department having no use for such plot for police purposes."

I do not see the advisability of disposing of this property at the present time, as it appears to me to be a desirable location for a number of the many purposes for which the City is now buying or leasing property, possibly for a library site. The plot is valued on the assessment rolls for 1901 at \$3,500, and in my opinion has a market value of between \$7,000 and \$8,000, the latter price being approximately the proportion of the total price paid in 1889.

I would therefore advise you that I consider the application to purchase the plot should be denied and the applicant be informed that the same is not for sale.

The Collector of City Revenue should be informed of the action of the Police Department in turning over the property and should be instructed to take charge of the same until an assignment is made for some other City purpose.



"That heretofore your petitioner sold and conveyed to Frederick A. Davis said Lot No. 2, situated on the northwesterly side of Third avenue, 40 feet 2 inches northeast of Twenty-fifth street, northeast 20 by 100, shown in blue lines on said diagram, by full covenant and warranty deed, dated and recorded February 1, 1887, in Kings County Register's Office, in Liber 1714 of Conveyances, page 85; and that as to said lot so conveyed to him, this application is made at the request and for the benefit of petitioner's said grantee, and does not seek to acquire any right or title in said land against said grantee. Petitioner owns the balance of said plot."

Said petition is duly verified by said Thomas Pitbladdo, and he therein states that in making this application he makes the same as to said Lot No. 2, for the benefit of his grantee, Frederick A. Davis, to whom he conveyed the same by full covenant and warranty deed, and makes no claim to the old road as against him.

I have confirmed all the statements made in said petition, and in view of the opinion of the Corporation Counsel, frequently expressed in previous similar cases, that the old Gowanus road was a Dutch road, and upon its abandonment, the title to the same reverted to the Government; that the interest of The City of New York in the land included within the limits is very slight and in no way substantial, and that a nominal sum would be sufficient for a quit-claim deed; and in view of the fact that similar releases to the one above requested, and made by The City of Brooklyn, under resolutions of the Common Council, and since consolidation by The City of New York, under resolutions of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, have been made for a nominal consideration, it would appear to me that there is no objection to granting the application of Thomas Pitbladdo in this instance.

No. 2801 Third avenue, being premises in the rear of quarters of Engine Company 41, for a term of one year, from January 1, 1902, at an annual rental of seventy-five dollars (\$75), payable quarterly, and upon the same terms and conditions as contained in the existing lease; Emma Henneberger, lessor.

—the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund deeming the said rents fair and reasonable and that it would be for the interests of the City that such leases be made.

The Comptroller presented the following report relative to proposed lease of premises corner of Java and Franklin streets, formerly occupied by the Astral Branch of the Pratt Institute, for the Brooklyn Public Library:

OCTOBER 24, 1901.

Hon. BIRD S. COLER, Comptroller:

SIR—Frank P. Hill, Secretary pro tem. of the Brooklyn Public Library, in a communication to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City of New York, under date of September 18, 1901, states as follows:

"At a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Brooklyn Public Library, held September 17, the Secretary was instructed to notify you that the Board had accepted the Astral Branch formerly owned by the Pratt Institute, as a Branch of the Brooklyn Public Library system, dated from September 15, 1901."

—and in a subsequent communication under date of October 15, 1901, he states as follows:

"At a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Brooklyn Public Library, held September 17, 1901, it was voted to request the Sinking Fund Commission to make a lease of the rooms now occupied by the Astral Branch, corner of Java and Franklin streets, with the owner, Morris Building Company, No. 207 Ryerson street, for two years from September 15, 1901, at fifty dollars (\$50) per month, including heat."

I have caused an examination to be made of the premises corner of Java and Franklin streets, Borough of Brooklyn, formerly occupied by the Astral Branch of the Pratt Institute, and which was by resolution of the Board of Directors of the Brooklyn Public Library, on September 17, 1901, accepted as a branch of its system, and would submit the following report:

The premises are located on the northeast corner of Java and Franklin streets, on the first or street floor of a large brick building, constructed as a model tenement, occupying the entire frontage on the east side of Franklin street, between Java and India streets, known as "The Astral," and owned by the Morris Building Company, George L. Olney, Secretary, No. 207 Ryerson street, a corporation said to be controlled by parties interested in the Pratt Institute.

A branch of the Pratt Institute Library has been located there ever since the erection of the building, and I learn that a rental of \$50 per month has been heretofore paid for the use and occupation thereof and steam-heat furnished by owner.

I am informed that this Branch Library was taken over with the understanding that the name "Astral" be retained and the people employed there accepted as part of the force of the Brooklyn Public Library.

The premises consist of one large room, 32 feet by 38 feet, giving a floor space of 1,200 square feet, which, at the rental asked, namely, \$600 per annum, would give a rate of 50 cents per square foot.

Light and janitor service are to be furnished by the City; the lessor is to clean and care for the sidewalks in front of said premises.

As no mention is made in the application as to time of payment of the rent, I would recommend that it be paid quarterly. I am of the opinion that the terms of the proposed lease, viz.: \$50 per month, payable quarterly, for two years from September 15, 1901, lessor to furnish heat, are reasonable and just, and that the same may properly receive the approval of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

BOARD OF ARMORY COMMISSIONERS.

NEW YORK, October 25, 1901.

A meeting of the Armory Board was held this day, at 11.30 o'clock A. M., at the office of the Mayor.

Present—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, Brigadier-General James McLeer and Brigadier-General George Moore Smith.

The minutes of the meeting held September 26, 1901, were read and adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, Brigadier-General James McLeer and Brigadier-General George Moore Smith.

Resolved, That the Armory Board does hereby approve the bill and expense for the survey of the site for the First Battery Armory, on the southerly side of Sixty-sixth street, east of Columbus avenue, Borough of Manhattan, by Henry Mesa, Civil Engineer and City Surveyor, amounting to one hundred and forty dollars (\$140), and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be requested to concur and the Comptroller authorized to pay the same.

LOCAL BOARD.

BOROUGH OF QUEENS.

The Local Board of the Borough of Queens, City of New York, held its meeting at temporary Borough Hall on October 18, 1901, at which were present Alderman Luke Otten and the President of the Borough of Queens, Frederick Bowley.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

The following was duly adopted:

Whereas, The President of the Borough of Queens, City of New York, did submit to this the Local Board of said borough "Map or Plan" showing additional streets in that part of the Second Ward, Borough of Queens, bounded by Laurel Hill boulevard, Laurel Hill avenue, Montgomery avenue, Clinton place, Clifton avenue and Newtown creek, which was transmitted by the Board of Public Improvements, City of New York, to the Local Board of this borough for its consideration and action thereon; and

Whereas, Public notice was given of public hearing to be afforded thereon, at which time and place so advertised no person appeared in opposition to the approval of such map or plan; and

Whereas, It is the opinion of this Board that the adoption and filing of said map would be to the best interests of this city, as the preliminary requisite to the City acquiring title to the streets running along in part on both sides of the Long Island Railroad tracks, as shown on said map, the speedy physical construction of which is of great importance to avoid imminent danger to life and limb which workmen are made subject to in that section on account of the absence of proper streets whereupon to pass to and from their place of employment; therefore

Resolved, That the Local Board, Borough of Queens, City of New York, at its meeting held October 18, 1901, hereby approves of said map, and urges upon the Board of Public Improvements, said city, that it give the matter its favorable consideration and speedy action.

Also,

Resolved, By this the Local Board of the Borough of Queens, City of New York, in meeting assembled October 18, 1901, that recommendation be and hereby is made to the Commissioner of Public Buildings, Lighting and Supplies, for the erection and maintenance of a public electric light on Pierson street, between Jackson avenue and the Long Island Railroad tracks, in First Ward, Borough of Queens, City of New York.

Also,

Whereas, Alderman Otten, at meeting of this the Local Board of Borough of Queens, City of New York, held October 18, 1901, did represent to it that he has repeatedly made application to the several City Departments having jurisdiction over matters covering the highways of Bay-

side section of the Third Ward of this borough, especially to the sunken condition of Bell avenue, south of Crocherson avenue, which has become a pond of foul water and a receptacle of all sorts of foreign matter, which is not only unsightly, but also a menace to public health; and likewise to have the disturbed flagging along Lawrence Boulevard, from Bell avenue to First street, replaced and reset; but that, although the Health Board and Highway Department have caused inspection to be made thereof, yet nothing further in a material way has been done toward filling-in, draining, and repairing flagging, to remedy the matters complained of by him; and therefore earnestly demanded that official notice of such neglect be taken by this Board, and its influence be exercised toward having the requirements of the public, as above indicated, speedily responded to, and which the recent rains emphatically demonstrates the urgent necessity thereof.

Now, in view of the aforesaid, it is Resolved, That recommendation be and hereby is made to the Health Board, the Highway and Sewer Departments, that it promptly devote its best endeavors towards remedying the matters above complained of by Alderman Otten in a manner satisfactory to all concerned; and further

Resolved, That the President cause certified copy of foregoing to be transmitted to the heads of the several Departments respectively, as mentioned herein.

In the matter of legally opening Borden avenue, representative of the New York Land and Warehouse Company appeared and desired that its protest should be noticed and certified to the Board of Public Improvements, but was unable to inform the Local Board as to the ground of objections entertained by his principal, whose treasurer was absent from town and left instructions for him to make such request. In order to afford an opportunity to said company's absent representative to formally submit in writing the reason for its opposition to favorable action upon the subject-matter aforementioned, final action thereon was, on motion, postponed for two weeks. Adjourned to November 1, 1901.
