Whereas, the Division of Inspection has submitted to this Commission appeals filed by the appellants noted from orders issued against the following premises, the granting of which appeals would necessitate a variation of law; and

Whereas, the said Bureau of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made of the premises in each case and upon the report submitted gives the following statement of facts and recommends accordingly:

1. Premises affected: Buffalo, 1317 Elk st.; appellant, Kellogg Products, Inc. 2—Properly encase exposed gears over vats and kettles. This order relates to exposed gears on the tops of deodorizers in refinery buildings. There are 18 deodorizers, 12 of which are about 5 feet in diameter and 20 feet high, 4 are 8 feet in diameter and 24 feet high. These deodorizers are placed on end and the gears are on the top; there are no platforms around the deodorizers and no way to get to the gears except by the use of a ladder; no stationary ladders on deodorizers; these gears operate apparatus inside of deodorizers and are driven by belts from a line shaft located above.

Recommendation: Inasmuch as the gears on the tops of deodorizers in the refinery building are located 20 and 24 feet respectively from the floor and platform, order to be waived in so far as it refers to these gears over deodorizers.

2. Premises affected: Buffalo 1765 Main st.; appellant, Elmer E. Harris & Co. 1—Provide inside suitable and convenient sanitary water-closet for the use of employees. 1-story frame building, somewhat dilapidated, used as an auto repair shop; there are two tenants, one man and proprietor in shop.

Recommendation: Accept installation of chemical (or anti-freeze type) closet of an approved make, provided the walls of the partition be made frostproof by lathing and plastering and that an oil or gas heater be installed and a temperature of not less than 50 degrees maintained from Nov. 1 to April 1.

3. Premises affected: New York City, 417 Lafayette st.; appellant, P. J. McKeon. 1—Provide at least two additional waterclosets for use of females employed on 5th floor, same to be properly screened, lighted and ventilated. 2—Provide at least two additional waterclosets for use of females employed on 4th floor, same to be properly screened, lighted and ventilated.

3—Provide at least two additional wash basins, equipped with proper water service, for females on 5th floor. 4—Provide at least two additional wash basins equipped with proper water service for use of females, 4th floor. The Buchan Mfg. Co. are engaged in the manufacture of cloth powder bags for the U. S. Government. They occupy the 4th and 5th and a small part of the 7th floors. Mr. Hugh Buchan, Vice President and Manager, informed the Supervising Inspector that their present contract will require about four months to finish, with prospect of an additional contract on or before completion of present contract. On 4th floor 42 females, and 10 males were employed (no Government inspectors on this floor). Two waterclosets provided for the men and one for the women on this floor: one 36-inch wash sink with two faucets provided for men, and one wash basin for women. The 5th floor has 75 females and 9 males employed, in addition to 13 women inspectors of the U. S. Government. Two waterclosets provided for the women on this floor and one for the men. One 36-inch wash sink with two faucets for women and one wash sink for men. Mr. Buchan stated that he would reduce the number of women on the 4th floor to not more than 35 on or before Sept. 5, 1918.

Recommendation: Inasmuch as it will take four months to complete the contract and that further contracts will probably be negotiated, order No. 1 for additional waterclosets on 5th floor must be complied with, present facilities on 4th floor to be accepted if waterclosets now used by men be set aside for women and the watercloset used by women set aside for men. said closets when so designated to be accepted while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged. Order No. 3 to be complied with. Order No. 4, while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, except the assignment to the women of the present 36-inch wash basin and the assignment to the men of sink used by women.

4. Premises affected: Cranberry Lake, Railroad st.; appellant, Emporium Forestry Co. 6—Provide 2 fireproof enclosed stairways from planing mill and 2 from sawing mill department. 7—Prohibit occupancy. 8—Construct all stairways of incombustible material 44 inches wide, etc. (June, 1917.) 4—Additional exit from all floors of 3-story section. 5—Prohibit occupancy. 6—Enclose stairway fireproof. 7—Replace wooden stairway with stairs of incombustible material 44 inches wide. (April 9, 1918.) 2 and 3-story building, erected since Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm system. Occupancy, 28; above the 1st floor, 20; above 2d floor, 3. 3-story portion is small addition used as filing room and has but one exit, viz., a stairway. Stairway on side continues to runway, which, with filing room, constitutes 3d floor. Remainder of building 2 stories high with stairway at each end, stairway to planing mill being reached by door from saw mill. Along one end of building are provided docks, running 250 feet in length, and from 2d floor there are ten openings to these docks; at northerly end is runway leading to ground and on side of building is a runway used as conveyor to another small building.

Recommendation: Accept as exits, while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, the present stairways and access to docks on condition that appellant provide a runway at northerly end of three-story section and erect a substantial wooden stairway properly handrailed leading to stairs from 1st to 2d floors.

5. Premises affected: Honeoye Falls, N. Y., Lehigh st.; appellant, Frank P. Jobs. 1—Suitable and convenient wash sink for females. Twelve females on 2d floor sorting beans; iron sink provided; no running water; running water in cellar only.

Recommendation: Accept present sink on 2d floor if running water be provided thereat.

6. Premises affected: Syracuse, North Clinton and West Willow sts.; appellant, Woodhall, Goodale & Bull. Fire alarm signal system. 6-story nonfireproof building of brick construction, erected prior to Oct. 1, 1913; no combustibles; sprinkler with one source of water supply. Occupancy of building, 164; above the 1st floor, 128; exits, two interior stairways enclosed

with wooden partitions, an imperfect fire escape and a horizontal exit on each floor; exits remote; fire alarm signal system installed conforms to Class "B"; building emptied on fire drill in 1 minute 40 seconds.

Recommendation: While conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, accept present Class "B" system.

And it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in complying with the strict provisions of law and of the code on the premises noted herein, and that in granting the variations recommended in each case the spirit of the law will be adhered to and public safety secured;

It further appearing that each of the appellants has been advised that he would be given an opportunity to appear at this time and place and be heard by the Commission, and such of the appellants who appeared having been given a hearing, therefore be it

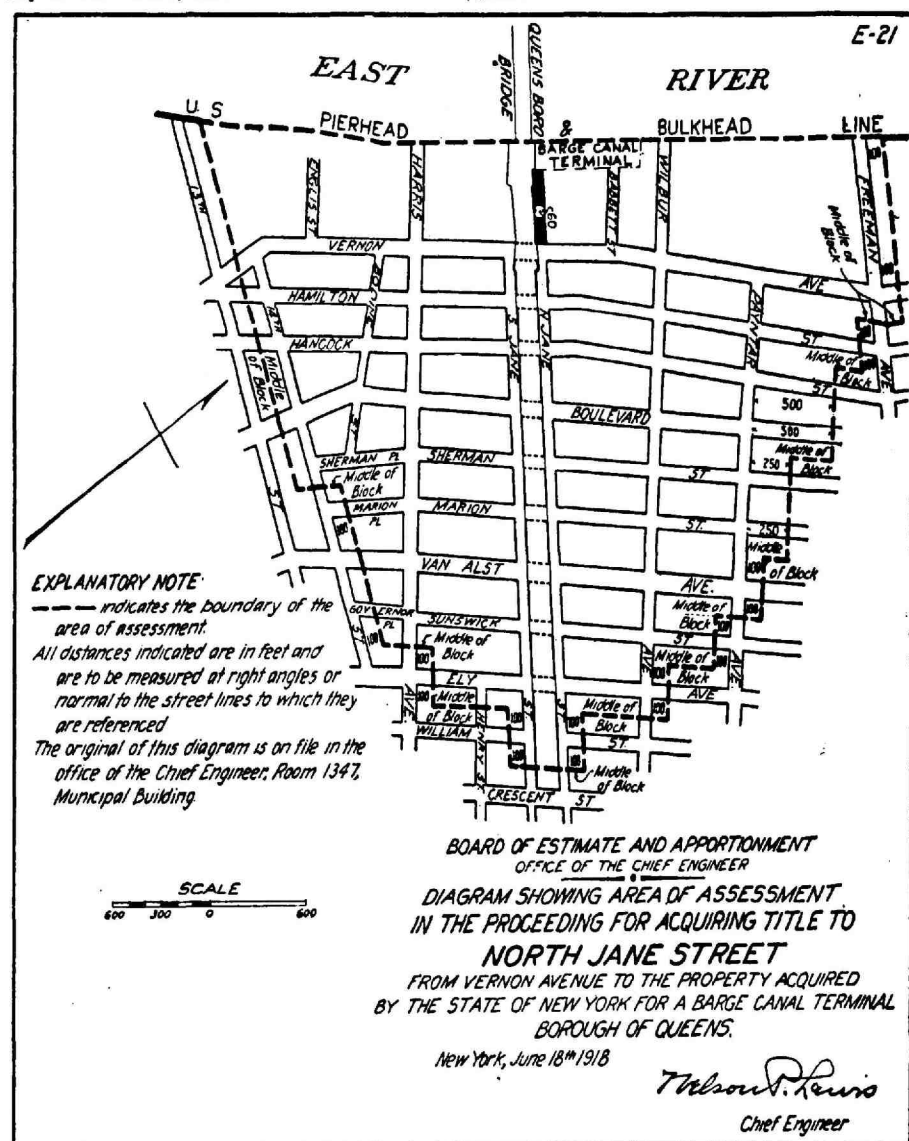

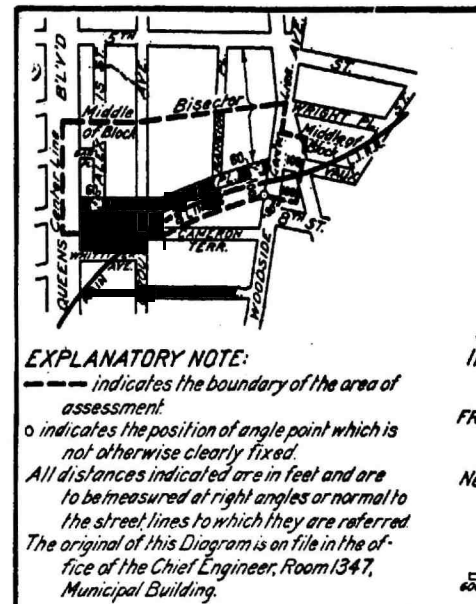

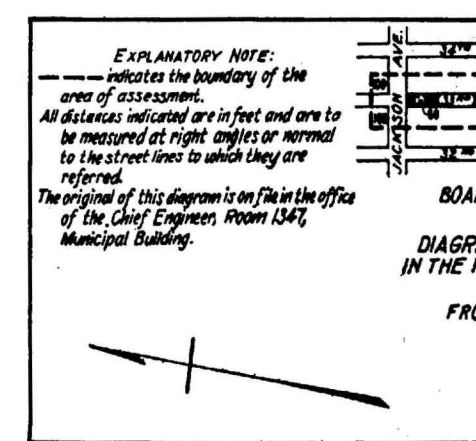
