RESOLVED That the Art Commission, having considered a proposal for the relocation of the Abraham De Peyster Statue (1896) by George Edwin Bissell from Hanover Square to City Hall Park, including the relocation of the Debs Myers plaque (1974), Broadway and Park Place, Manhattan, submitted by the Department of Parks & Recreation, represented by exhibits 1947-CL & CM of record in this matter, hereby tables the same, with the understanding that the Parks Department will submit (1) a list of the alternate locations considered for the sculpture; (2) better photographs of the proposed site and photo-renderings, showing the sculpture in its proposed context, to illustrate the appropriateness of the site, and that it will not result in visual clutter; and (3) photographs of the base as well as a transcription of the text on the base to determine whether the historic information is comprehensive or whether it would be appropriate to include a historic plaque. The Commission also expressed concern about locating the sculpture within the dripline of a tree, and noted that, if the proposed site is approved, an arborist must be present at all times during hand excavation and installation of the sculpture.


