"Candidates should possess an intimate knowledge of the functions of the various departments of the city, state and national governments, familiarity with city localities, a knowledge of the classification and the rules of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, and a knowledge of investigating methods."

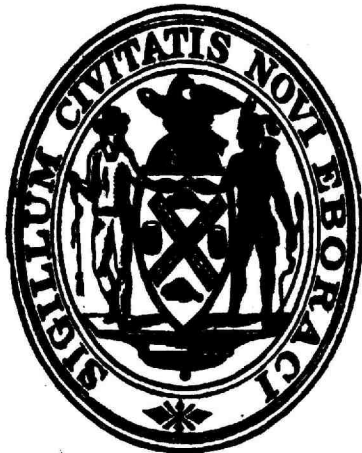
