The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS.

By Alderman Grant—

Petition for water on One Hundred and Twenty-seventh street, from Eighth to St. Nicholas avenue.

Which was referred to the Committee on Public Works.

By Alderman O'Connor—

Petition to prevent heavy vehicles from passing on the north side of Washington Square, between 5 and 7 o'clock P.M., every Friday, during the performance of the Seventh Regiment Band in Washington Square.

Whereupon he offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Police Commissioners be directed to station officers on the corner of Washington Square and Fifth avenue, and on the corner of Washington Square and Macdougall street, on Friday afternoon of each week, when the band shall play in Washington Square, from 5 until 7 o'clock, with necessary instructions to divert from the north side of Washington Square, between Fifth avenue and Macdougall street, the tide of trucks and other vehicles, except pleasure carriages.

The President put the question whether the Board would agree with said resolution. Which was decided in the affirmative.

MESSAGES FROM HIS HONOR THE MAYOR.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, May 28, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted May 16, 1883, permitting Michael Doyle to place and keep a storm-door at the entrance to premises No. 158 Avenue C.

A resolution similar to the above was passed by your Honorable Body on the 10th of April, which, for the reasons then stated, I did not approve. I am now informed that Mr. Doyle has erected this storm-door without any permission whatever, and although he asks permission "to place and keep," he really desires permission to "keep" what he has already "placed" in violation of law. Nor has Mr. Doyle complied with the ordinance (section 34, article IV.) adopted by your Honorable Body for the regulation of such structures, and I am informed that the occupant of the adjoining premises strongly and justly objects to the obstruction. I see no reason for changing the views set forth in my communication of April 24 relative to this structure.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to Michael Doyle to place and keep a storm-door at the entrance to his premises, No. 158 Avenue C, as shown on the annexed diagram, and to be within the stoop-line, the work done at his own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, May 28, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted May 16, 1883, permitting the Young Men's Christian Association to place an illuminated sign in front of the premises No. 2317 Third avenue.

From the letter accompanying the resolution I learn that the desired sign would project ten feet from the second story of the building and be two feet high and sixteen inches wide, whereas section 53, article IV. of the Revised Ordinances provides that "no person shall place, hang or suspend, at any greater distance than twelve inches in front of and from the wall of any house, store or other building, any sign, show-bill or show-board, under the penalty of ten dollars for each offense." The ordinance is a proper one, inasmuch as signs of the character contemplated are undoubtedly a source of danger, and in case of high winds are liable to fall upon the passer-by, and thus render the city liable in heavy damages. In my opinion no such privilege should be granted; therefore I am constrained to withhold my approval of this resolution, notwithstanding the commendable objects of the association asking such permission.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, May 28, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted May 16, 1883, protesting against the location of a hospital for the reception of patients afflicted with contagious or infectious diseases, as proposed by the Health Department, at or near the foot of Seventeenth street, East river, and requesting the Health Department to choose a more isolated site and a less populous district.

It requires no expert knowledge to understand the importance of such a hospital as that which it is proposed to erect at the foot of East Sixteenth street, but as to the proper location and construction of the building it seems prudent to rely upon the Board of Health. I therefore transmit herewith to your Honorable Body a communication from the Board of Health on the subject of this resolution, and also a diagram showing the site of the proposed hospital. It seems to me that no site can be selected where less objection could be justly raised to the location of a structure to be used for such purposes, and at the same time be productive of the greatest good.

For these and the further reasons stated in the communication from the Board of Health, above referred to, I return the resolution without my approval.

Resolved, That this Common Council hereby protests against locating a hospital for the reception of patients afflicted with contagious or infectious diseases, as proposed by the Health Department, at or near the foot of Seventeenth street, East river, and so far as this Common Council has the power, as owner in its corporate capacity of the site for the proposed hospital, hereby forbids the location or erection of said hospital thereon, as it is near the centre of one of the most densely populated districts in this city, where liability to spread contagion among the people is the greatest; and, be it further

Resolved, That if, in the opinion of the Health authorities, such a building is indispensable, then it is hereby earnestly recommended that a more isolated site and less populous district be selected for its location and erection.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, May 28, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted May 16, 1883, permitting B. H. Tuttil to erect a storm-door in front of No. 114 Bleecker street.

This structure, as I am informed, has already been erected in violation of law; it is twelve feet high, twelve feet long, and projects five feet from the building. The applicant has, in no sense, complied with the ordinances of the Common Council, having submitted no plans and having the consent of none of his neighbors. I am informed that they justly complain of the structure, and I therefore think Mr. Tuttil should not only have no permission "to erect" the storm-door in question, which he has already built, but should be required to remove it at once.

A resolution was passed by your Honorable Body on the 8th instant, permitting a watering-trough to be erected on the corner of Third street and Lewis street, only two short blocks from the proposed location of this one. The necessity for two watering-troughs in such close proximity is not pressing, while the necessity for economy in the use of water is extremely so. I therefore think the desired permission should not be granted.

By the provisions of section 291, article XXX. of the Revised Ordinances, the applicants for an awning must have the consent of the occupants of the adjoining premises. In this case the occupant of premises No. 87 Bowery refuses his consent, although he desires an exactly similar privilege, and, therefore, the permission which Abrams & Levy desire cannot be justly granted. In my opinion, the provisions of the ordinance referred to should be insisted upon in all such cases.

It seems to me that the general ordinance to which I have referred is a very proper one, and that compliance with its provisions should be insisted upon, in order that no injustice or damage shall be done to one neighbor through the action of another in such matters.

I am informed that one of the signs referred to in this resolution is a triangular pyramid eight feet in height and located on the sidewalk; the others hang from an awning frame. These are, in

my opinion, objectionable, because they both obstruct the sidewalk and are a source of danger in case of high winds. The occupants of adjoining premises also strongly object to them; therefore permission to retain them should not, in my judgment, be granted.

I am informed that these poles are to be used as masts for cranes and are to have beams about forty feet long attached some twelve feet above the sidewalk. The purpose is to transfer large blocks of stone by swinging them from trucks in the street over the sidewalk into the yards in front of which these poles are to be placed. It seems to me that this method of handling such material is extremely dangerous to passers-by, and I therefore think the permission sought should not be granted.

When the grade is lawfully fixed, this or a similar resolution will be in order.

The Committee on Public Works, to whom were referred the two resolutions hereto annexed—one instructing your Committee "to examine and report to this Board its powers and duties in regard to granting permission to erect bay-windows, storm-doors, and other obstructions on the public highways and to report to this Board such general ordinance in relation to the subject as said Committee may deem advisable," and the other a resolution to repeal "Section 34 of article IV. of chapter 6 of Revised Ordinances of 1880" (regulating the erection of bay-windows, etc.), respectively

REPORT :

That, in referring the last resolution, the Board instructed your Committee to report at the next meeting, and in accordance with such direction the following is respectfully submitted :

An examination of the laws, ordinances and decisions in the higher courts of this State and City has convinced your Committee that it is not, legally, in the power of the Common Council (and it is very questionable if the power exists anywhere) to authorize or permit any encroachment into or upon any street, avenue, or other public highway, within the corporate limits of this city. These thoroughfares are held for the uses of the general public, are owned by the people in common, and no one person can legally be granted permanently, the exclusive use or occupation of any of them, or any part of any of them. This was held to be the law by the Court of Appeals, the highest court in this State, and is conclusive on this subject.

Your Committee are aware that many of our citizens, owners of property, believe they are entitled to certain privileges in the street beyond the line fixed for the erection of buildings; that there are area-lines and stoop-lines to which they have exclusive ownership; and that the purchase of the land carries with it the ownership in the public streets, to the lines above designated. This is a grave error, and a delusion that may yet subject many of such owners to much expense, should the people of the city ever claim what belongs to them.

It is true, at an early date in the history of this city, the Corporation designated stoop and area-lines, and permitted, under very strict regulations as to the manner of using these privileges, the occupation of one-tenth the width of the street, but in no case over seven feet, on which to erect stoops, and one-fifteenth, but in no case more than five feet, for area purposes. The stoops were required to be constructed with open backs, or sides, or railings, not wider than necessary for a convenient passage-way into the building, and in no case to exceed five feet in height; the areas were to be enclosed with a railing, with gates to open inwardly; and any violation of any of these requirements subjected the offender to a penalty of \$250. These ordinances are in full force and effect at the present day. And, what is a reprehensible fact, and anything but a complimentary commentary on the efficiency of the administration of the affairs of our local government, these ordinances are openly and flagrantly violated, daily and hourly, with the utmost impunity.

Bay-windows were restricted to the extent of one foot beyond the wall of the building by ordinance of the Common Council, and none but owners of stores availed themselves of the privilege, and although this ordinance has fallen into disuse and become obsolete, it has never been repealed, but is yet in full force and effect.

Within the past twenty years, however, many owners of property have acted as if they owned in fee a considerable portion of the public street on which their property fronts. In many of the streets in the upper portion of the city, where property is the most valuable, whole rows of buildings are erected, the stoops of which extend outwardly from the front wall fully fifteen feet, the restrictions as to height and mode of construction being totally disregarded; the areas are excavated outwardly nearly a like distance, while bay-windows project outwardly from four to six feet, with openings varying from ten to twenty feet, from every floor, beginning with the basement and ending with the top, usually the fifth story. In fact, your Committee have had their attention called to instances where owners of property have taken into their buildings, from the public streets, within a small fraction of as much space in square feet as they own of land surface on which their houses are built. Your Committee are at a loss to understand how such owners, if desirous of selling or otherwise disposing of their property, can convey it or give title thereto as the fee of the land upon which such bay-windows are erected, is in the Corporation of the City of New York, and not in the owner of the house, of which such bay-windows form a part. The fact that the Common Council permits, during its pleasure, this use of the public streets by private individuals, does not improve the matter, as it is not in the power of that body legally to make such a disposition of property held in common by the people of the city, and only complicates the title of the owner of the building, as no tenure can be more frail than that held during the pleasure of a legislative body, that it can recall, or that illegally permits the occupation of property it holds only in trust for others, any one of whom, if so disposed, can, at any time, eject the holder of the privilege, as he is simply a trespasser upon the property of the city.

Your Committee are very decidedly of opinion that action should be taken by your Honorable Body to prevent any further permanent encroachments by private individuals upon the public streets. So extensive, and, at times, so aggravating have they become, that unless put a stop to in a summary manner, there is no telling to what extent this evil practice will go. It is well, also, that these owners of private property should be made aware of the risk they incur in thus trespassing upon the property of our citizens, even though the trespass is seemingly sanctioned by the Common Council, during its pleasure. The Common Council certainly cannot legally sanction a violation of the law, or rightfully permit the private use of public property it only holds in trust for the people.

The charter of the city is clear and emphatic on this point. Subdivision 2^d of section 17, article II., chapter 335, Laws of 1873 (Subdivision 3, of section 2, article IV., chapter 410, Laws of 1882), gives the Common Council power "to regulate the use of sidewalks, and PREVENT the extension of building-fronts and house-fronts within the stoop-lines." The Common Council clearly has power only to prevent such extensions, or encroachments, not to authorize or permit them. It is beyond question, therefore, that the Common Council of 1873, in framing and passing an ordinance or resolution recognizing the right of private individuals thus to encroach upon the public streets, and

prescribing the manner of obtaining such permission, exceeded its powers, and, in consequence, the resolution, or ordinance, is a nullity, and any privilege granted thereunder is worthless. The ordinance is contained in the edition of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, being section 34 of article IV., chapter 6, of said revision and was amended by resolution approved March 31, 1882. Both the ordinance and the amendment should be repealed. This is a necessary proceeding, as it will relieve the Common Council from the censure inevitable from continuing to act under an ordinance passed in contravention of law, and as no vested right has accrued to those who have been benefited by its illegal provisions, no injury can accrue to them by its repeal.

Those who have erected bay-windows and other projections to their buildings, and in doing so have encroached upon the public streets, will each have to take the consequences of his own illegal act, which may not be serious in their nature, until some purchaser refuses to take title to such a structure, by reason of the inability of the owner to establish an ownership to the land upon which such encroachments are built, or some injured citizen may compel his neighbor to remove the illegal structure.

The following resolution is therefore respectfully offered for your adoption :

LAWS OF NEW YORK, 1883.

CHAPTER 56.

AN ACT to amend the Code of Civil Procedure.

Passed February 23, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-four hundred and seventy-nine of the Code of Civil Procedure is amended so as to read as follows:

§ 2479. Where a new county has been heretofore, or is hereafter, erected, or territory has been heretofore, or is hereafter, transferred from one county to another, the jurisdiction of the surrogate's court of each of the counties affected thereby, to take the proof of a will, or to grant letters, depends upon the locality, when the petition is presented, of the place where the property of the decedent is situated, or where the event occurred, as the case may be, which determines jurisdiction. If, before the erection of the new county, or the transfer of the territory, letters have been granted, upon the ground that the decedent died or resided within the county, the surrogate's court from which they were issued has exclusive jurisdiction of the estate, and of all matters incidental thereto; and if the place where the decedent died or resided is embraced within another county, certified copies of any papers or proceedings, filed, entered, or recorded in the surrogate's court thereof, must be furnished on the payment of the fees therefor, by the proper officer, to any person interested in the estate; and upon the latter's request and payment of the fees therefor, the proper officer of the court so having jurisdiction must file, enter or record the same, in like manner and with like effect as the originals. Where the letters were granted upon any ground other than the decedent's death or residence within the county, the jurisdiction of the court from which they were issued remains unaffected by any change in the territorial limits of its county.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 57.

AN ACT for the preservation of public records, maps, and papers.

Passed February 23, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Whenever by reason of age, exposure, or any casualty, any public records, maps, or papers in the custody of the county clerk, surrogate, register, or other county officer in the county of New York shall become mutilated, obliterated, or rendered unfit for public service, it shall be the duty of the officer having the official custody or control of any such records, maps, or papers to cause copies thereof to be made and certified for the public use, and the officer making such transcripts or copies shall be paid a sum as may be just, but which in no case shall exceed a sum to be certified by a justice of the supreme court for the first judicial district, to be reasonable, for the service rendered. And no payment shall be made for any service rendered under this act until the work shall be examined and approved of as to its manner and form of execution by a justice of the supreme court of the said first district, nor shall any such work be done until a justice of the supreme court of the first judicial district shall, after an examination, certify that such work is necessary for the security and safety of the public records. And such new copies when so made and approved shall for all purposes take the place of the original records.

Sec. 2. The board of estimate and apportionment in the city of New York shall make appropriations to meet the expenses incurred by this act.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 62.

AN ACT to authorize the board of estimate and apportionment of the city of New York to transfer certain unexpended balances to the credit of the board of education, and to provide for payment of teachers' salaries and repairs for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-three.

Passed February 27, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows: Section 1. The board of estimate and apportionment of the city of New York is hereby authorized, within ten days after the passage of this act, to transfer to the board of education such portion of unexpended balances, remaining to its credit from previous years, as may be necessary to meet any deficiency for teachers' salaries and repairs for the present year.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 65.

AN ACT in relation to sales of real estate made and to be made by executors under authority given them by will.

Passed February 27, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Sales of real estate situate in the city and county of New York, or at any other place within the state of New York, made by executors in pursuance of an authority given by any last will, unless otherwise directed in such will, may be public or private and on such terms as in the opinion of the executor shall be most advantageous to those interested therein.

Sec. 2. All such sales made since the first day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty, are

hereby ratified and confirmed and declared to be as valid in every respect as if section one of this act had been in force on and at all times since said first day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty.

Sec. 3. This act shall not prejudice or invalidate any suit or proceeding already commenced and now pending to set aside any private sale made by any executor since said first day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty.

Sec. 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT to amend chapter four hundred and ten of the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled "An act to consolidate into one act and to declare the special and local laws affecting public interests in the city of New York."

Passed February 28, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The people of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section two thousand one hundred and forty-three of chapter four hundred and ten of the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled "An act to consolidate into one act and to declare the special and local laws affecting public interests in the city of New York," is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

§ 2143. This act shall not affect any offense committed or right of removal accrued prior to the time when it takes effect, and all penalties and forfeitures incurred under any statute superseded or repealed by this act prior to the time when it takes effect may be prosecuted and punished in the same manner and with the same effect as if this act had not been passed. Nor shall this act affect any right accrued or acquired prior to the time when it takes effect, nor create a vacancy in any office or employment. Sections one hundred and eighteen, ten hundred and seventy-four, ten hundred and seventy-six to ten hundred and eighty-five inclusive, ten hundred and eighty-seven, eleven hundred and ten, eleven hundred and eleven, eleven hundred and fourteen, eleven hundred and fifteen, eleven hundred and seventeen, eleven hundred and twenty-three, eleven hundred and twenty-five to eleven hundred and sixty-nine, eleven hundred and eighty-three to twelve hundred and three inclusive, twelve hundred and five, twelve hundred and eight to twelve hundred and forty-eight inclusive, twelve hundred and fifty to twelve hundred and seventy-four inclusive, twelve hundred and seventy-six, twelve hundred and seventy-seven, twelve hundred and eighty-four, twelve hundred and eighty-five, except subdivisions nine, eleven, and twelve, twelve hundred and eighty-six, except subdivisions four and five, twelve hundred and eighty-seven, twelve hundred and eighty-eight, twelve hundred and ninety-six, thirteen hundred and one, thirteen hundred and seven, thirteen hundred and eight, thirteen hundred and eleven to thirteen hundred and fourteen inclusive, thirteen hundred and sixteen to thirteen hundred and forty-six inclusive, thirteen hundred and forty-nine to thirteen hundred and fifty-seven inclusive, thirteen hundred and fifty-eight to thirteen hundred and sixty inclusive, thirteen hundred and seventy-one, thirteen hundred and eighty-three, thirteen hundred and ninety-two to thirteen hundred and ninety-seven inclusive, fourteen hundred and five, fourteen hundred and twenty-one, fourteen hundred and twenty-four, fourteen hundred and thirty-eight, fourteen hundred and sixty-two, fourteen hundred and ninety-four, fourteen hundred and ninety-five to fifteen hundred and two inclusive, fifteen hundred and seven, fifteen hundred and twelve, fifteen hundred and fourteen to fifteen hundred and seventeen inclusive, the last clause of section fifteen hundred and eighteen, sections fifteen hundred and twenty-six to fifteen hundred and twenty-nine inclusive, fifteen hundred and sixty-nine to fifteen hundred and seventy-two inclusive, fifteen hundred and seventy-six to fifteen hundred and eighty-two inclusive, fifteen hundred and ninety-three, sixteen hundred and fifty-two to sixteen hundred and ninety-eight inclusive, seventeen hundred and fifteen, seventeen hundred and sixty-five, seventeen hundred and seventy-nine of this act being intended only to contain the substance of certain sections of the Code of Civil Procedure, or of the Code of Criminal Procedure, or of amendments thereof, shall not be construed as making any new enactment or as repealing, modifying, amending or superseding any provision of either of said codes, or any amendments thereof, but shall be treated and considered as embraced in this act solely in order that it may contain all provisions of existing laws which are of special application in the city of New York. Sections thirteen hundred and seventy-one to thirteen hundred and seventy-six inclusive, fifteen hundred and thirty-nine, sixteen hundred and thirty-seven to sixteen hundred and fifty inclusive, shall in like manner be treated and considered as making no new enactment, but as embraced in this act for the same reason. For the purpose of determining the effect of this act upon other acts except the Penal Code, and the effect of other acts except the Penal Code upon this act, this act is deemed to have been enacted on the first day of January, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two. All acts passed after such date, and the Penal Code, are to have the same effect as if they were passed after this act. This act shall take effect on the first day of April, eighteen hundred and eighty-three. This act may be cited as the New York city consolidation act of eighteen hundred and eighty-two.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 71.

AN ACT to promote building in the cities of this state, and to enable certain corporations to hold real estate therein.

Passed March 1, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Any association or corporation duly organized under the laws of this state for the purpose of acquiring, maintaining and improving real estate for residences, homesteads and apartment houses in any city having over twenty-five thousand inhabitants may hold at any one time real estate in excess of the amount now limited by law, by filing with the clerk of the county where its certificates of incorporation is filed a resolution of its board of trustees, duly attested, fixing the amount desired to be held, together with a consent in writing of its members or stockholders representing two-thirds in amount of its capital stock, and the approval of a justice of the supreme court in said county. And thereupon it shall be lawful for such corporation to hold at any one time the amount of real estate so fixed, assented to and approved, but no such corporation or association shall hold real estate to exceed in value three millions of dollars.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 80.

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter three of the second part of the Revised Statutes.

Passed March 7, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section six of chapter three of the second part of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows:

§ 6. If the party to such conveyance be or reside within the united kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or the dominions thereunto belonging, the same may be acknowledged or proved before the mayor or provost or chief magistrate of any city or town in said kingdom or dominions, or before any consul of the United States appointed to reside at any place in said kingdom or dominions.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 322.

AN ACT to alter the boundaries of the first and second judicial districts in the city of New York.

Passed April 26, 1883; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The first judicial district in the city of New York shall hereafter embrace all that portion of the city of New York known as the eighth, the fifth and the third wards and all that part of the first ward lying west of Broadway and Whitehall streets. The second judicial district shall embrace all that portion of the city of New York known as the fourteenth, sixth, fourth and second wards and all that portion of the first ward lying south and east of Broadway and Whitehall street.

Sec. 2. The jurisdiction of the first and second judicial district courts shall extend over the territory mentioned in the first section of this act respectively. All acts and parts of acts referring to the first and second judicial districts of the city of New York as heretofore constituted shall hereafter be understood as referring to the first and second districts as provided for in the first section of this act.
