

The New York City Emergency Management Department released its annual report that highlights the agency's accomplishments from January 2022 through December 2022. The report presents a snapshot of the agency's role in leading the coordination of the City's response to numerous incidents while supporting its mission to help New Yorkers prepare for, respond to, and recover from emergencies.

NYC Emergency Management has led the coordination of the City's response to multiple emergencies. From a five-alarm fire in the Bronx, to an active shooter, assisting Puerto Rico after Hurricane Fiona, to record breaking heat during the summer months, the agency has faced these challenges head-on, while adapting to the challenges of each emergency and implementing lessons learned from prior responses. The Annual Report is aligned with NYC Emergency Management's Strategic Plan for the first time, highlighting the impressive progress the agency has made over the last year towards achieving the goals set forth in the plan.


Participants will be asked to commit to joining up to 9 group sessions of one hour each (1x per month February 2023 - August 2023). Sessions will be held virtually and in person.

As sea level rises around NYC, tidal flooding in coastal neighborhoods is getting more frequent and widespread.

What can we do?

The "Community Flood Watch Project" is a growing network of residents and organizations who report local flooding, share experiences and access resources related to flooding in NYC coastal communities.

Researchers use these reports to visualize how "normal" high tides could look in the future due to sea level rise, and to improve forecasts of flooding and coastal hazards.

Communities can use this shared database of images, reports and maps to communicate their neighborhood's needs and visions to city leaders.
