DEAR SIR—When, at your kind suggestion, your predecessor did me the honor to appoint me to be one of the Commissioners of Public Charities and Correction, I accepted the office in deference to your kind estimate of my fitness for it, rather than because I felt myself qualified.

I find, however, that the duties of the place demand more time and attention than I can possibly give to their discharge, and I hereby tender my resignation, with the request that it be given immediate effect by appointment of my successor. Also to prepare a compilation of the laws of the State now in force affecting the City of New York, and a similar compilation of laws relating particularly to the County of New York, with full analysis and indexes; such compilation to be called "the Municipal Code and Ordinances of the City of New York."

Alderman Billings moved to refer to the Law Department.

Resolved, That a temporary bridge be placed immediately over the Fourth avenue, at Eighty-fourth street, by the Harlem Railroad Company immediately, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works, in order to afford a much-needed accommodation to the people of the vicinity, particularly the worshippers in the Church of St. Lawrence, who, to the number of from six to ten thousand, are required to make a detour of two or three blocks, in order to cross the said Fourth avenue to attend public worship in said church on the Sabbath day.
