

DEAR SIR—By resolution, passed September 18, 1894, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorized and directed the Comptroller to make a further issue of the City bonds known as "Additional Water Stock of the City of New York," as provided by chapter 189, Laws of 1893, for the sanitary protection of the sources of the City's water supply, to the amount of \$300,000. Said amount is now very nearly exhausted in payments for work done, services rendered, materials furnished, acquisitions of land, etc., and awards of damages for the purposes of the act. There are now six separate Boards of Commissioners of Appraisal in existence in making appraisals and awards in different sections of the Croton water-shed and of the Bronx river water-shed, and three of these Boards of Commissioners have made awards amounting to about \$400,000, which are awaiting confirmation by the Supreme Court, and will have to be paid as soon as confirmed.
I, therefore, respectfully ask that the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorize and direct the Comptroller to make a further issue of said bonds to the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).

SIR—I have received your letter of the 8th instant in the matter of opening, widening and extension of College place and Greenwich street, from Chambers to Dey street, stating that in said improvement the sum of \$778,772.36 has been assessed against the Mayor, Alderman and Commonalty, and inquiring what character of bonds should be issued for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of the awards, whether Revenue Bonds under authority of chapter 222 of the Laws of 1888 is an amendment to chapter 173 of the Laws of 1885, under which the fund known as "The Fund for Street and Park Openings" has been established.
The statute prescribes that the said fund shall be composed of the act to the credit of the

I. The cash balance then remaining at the date of the passage of the act to the credit of the fund known as "Assessment Fund."

2. All moneys thereafter collected by the City on account of assessments made and confirmed or thereafter to be made and confirmed for opening any street, road, avenue, boulevard, public square or place, park or parkway, or for acquiring title to land required for any bridge, tunnel or approach thereto.

square of place, park of parkway, or for acquiring fide to fail required for any bridge, tunnel of approach thereto. 3. Such sums as may be raised by taxation to provide in whole or in part for the expense of any of the aforesaid objects and purposes. The statute then directs that all awards for damages made by Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in reports thereafter confirmed, shall be paid from the said fund. The original act provides in section 4 that whenever the damages awarded in any report should exceed the balance to the credit of said fund, after deducting outstanding claims payable from said balance, that such damages, costs and expenses should not become cue and payable until the year following the year in which the report was confirmed. The amendment by chapter 222 of the Laws of 1888, to which your letter calls my attention, provides that in case of such deficiency in the fund, revenue bonds should be issued to such amounts as should be necessary to pay such damages, etc.; and this provision for borrowing moneys upon revenue bonds is merely a substitute for the former provision by which payments of awards in excess of the fund was postponed until the following year. The scheme of the statute creating the fund for street and park openings is that all assessments laid shall be paid, and the fund thereby made sufficient in amount to pay all the awards for damages, costs and expenses which the statute charges thereon, and the device of issuing Revenue Bonds is merely a supplementary provision to meet the consequences of delay in collecting the assessments.

It is inconsistent with the scheme and plan of the act that assessments against the City should

It is inconsistent with the scheme and plan of the act that assessments against the City should be paid therefrom or by Revenue Bonds issued for the purpose above indicated. Section 130 of the Consolidation Act provides the method of paying assessments imposed upon the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty in street opening proceedings. It provides : "It shall be the duty of and lawful for the Comptroller, when thereto authorized by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to create and issue such additional amounts of a public fund or stock, to be denominated 'City Improvement Stock,' as shall be necessary to provide the funds to enable said Comptroller to pay any and all assessments and expenses imposed or that may hereafter be imposed upon the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty, by reason of the laying out, opening and regulating and grading or improving any and all streets, roads, avenues, public parks, squares or places, and out of the proceeds of said public fund or stock to pay such assess-ments and expenses." I am therefore of the opinion that the assessment against the City in the proceeding in question should be paid into the fund for street and park openings from the proceeds of City Improvement Stock. The fund for "Street and Park Openings" will thus be rendered ample to pay the awards in the proceeding named.

Deponent further says that said affidavit at the end of page 2 sets forth the following, viz. : "That on September 20, 1893, after the matter had been brought to the attention of the proper authorities, the sum of three hundred eighty-seven (387) dollars was allowed to deponent for the loss sustained by him as above for the three preceding weeks." Deponent further says that since the filing as aforesaid of his affidavit dated December 17, 1894, he has re-examined his accounts and he finds that the three hundred eighty-seven (387) dollars allowed him by the City was for three weeks, just prior to August 23, 1894, and not for three weeks preceding September 20, 1894, that said sum of three hundred eighty-seven (387) dollars was paid to him on September 20, 1894, and it was in that way the erroneous statement was made. An examination of the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment held September 8, 1803, will verify claimant's statement.

DEAR SIR-On December 19, 1894, Mr. Augustus Sbarboro filed in your office an affidavit in which was set forth a full statement of the circumstances out of which his claim arose, and in which also was a statement of his losses.

We have discovered after a re-examination of his bills and an examination of the minutes of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, that an error was made in the statement of Mr. Sbar-boro's losses, and Mr. Sbarboro files the accompanying supplemental affidavit to correct the error. GENTLEMEN—We write you with regard to the claim of Charles G. Burgoyne for printing done under the following circumstances: Under chapter 532 of the Laws of 1893, Mayor Gilroy appointed E. Ellery Anderson and others commissioners to make a report therein called for. Said commissioners engaged Mr. Bur-goyne at the agreed upon price of \$130.80 to print their report. He did print it for them, and they duly audited the bill, and the same was certified to the Comptroller about March of 1894. Since that time Mr. Burgoyne's representative has demanded payment a number of times, but has been informed that payment could not be made because the price charged was not according to the schedule prices for city printing. We respectfully submit that this work was not city printing, either in the sense contemplated by the statute or the rules of the Department of City Record ; and, further, that by the very terms of the statute the expenses of the commission. As we understand it, this did not leave it in the discretion of your Board to audit the bills, but made it your duty to pay them, provided they did not exceed the total mentioned in the statute. We are further informed by the Commissioners that their total expenses did not exceed the amount provided by the statute, and that they know of no reason why this bill should not be paid. While we have made demand on a number of occasions, and while the claim has been filed in the office of the Comptroller for much more than thirty days required by the statute, we desire, as a matter of courtesy, to make this demand from you in writing, and will ask you to give the matter your immediate attention.

your immediate attention. In case you do not pass favorably on this, say within twenty days, we shall understand that you propose to contest payment, and shall resort to mandamus or such other legal means as we may deem advisable.

If there is a reason which appears to you to be sufficient for the non-payment of this claim, outside of the one referred to herein, we would be obliged to you for a statement of it, as we wish to comply with all proper requirements in the matter, and wish, if possible, to satisfy you that it is your duty to pay this claim without resorting to legal means. 
