Contagious and infectious diseases show a small increase, the number of cases reported of Contagious and infectious diseases show a small increase, the number of cases reported of diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever and small-pox being respectively 122, 42, 21, 51 and 0, against 130, 26, 22, 28 and 0 for the previous week, a total of 236 against 206. The increase of diphtheria was mainly in the Twentieth Ward, and the decrease in the Seventh, Ninth, Sixteenth and Twenty-second Wards. The increase of measles was most marked in the Tenth and Thirteenth Wards, and the decrease in the Twenty-second Ward. The increase of scarlet fever was chiefly in the Nineteenth Ward, and the decrease in the Twelfth and Twenty-second Wards. Thirty of the 51 cases of typhoid fever were above Fortieth street, and 10 were below Fourteenth street. No case of small-pox was reported.
