

Sta-In reply to the action taken by the Board of Public Improvements, referring to me for report resolution of the Local Board of Public Improvements, Twenty-first District, Borough of The Brons, in the matter of changing the grades of Kingshridge road, from Webster avenue to East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, and of Fordham road, from Kingsbridge road to Valentine avenue, I report as follows:

The establishing of grades on Kingsbridge road was under consideration at several public hear-ings given by the former Department of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards and by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement, before the Final Maps were adopted and the grades were established with a view of giving Kingsbridge road, which is the main thoroughfare between Foothorn and Kingsbridge, grades adopted for a road of such import-

The majority of the property-owners, between Webster avenue and Fordham road, patition now that the elevation at the west curb intersection of Kingsbridge road and Fordham road be now that the elevation at the west curb intersection of Kingsbridge road and Fordham road be ustablished at 100 feet above high water datum, and the Local Board of Public Improvements of the Twenty-first District, at its meeting held April 14, 1898, recommend the same. Assuming this agreement between the proporty-owners and the said Local Board as the basis for the establishing of the grades, I have slightly modified the remaining proposed grades in order to make, as far as possible, continuous grades between street intersections and to avoid, as much as possible, difference of elevation between opposite curbs, and have also shown additional grades for the intersection of Kingsbridge road with Biggs avenue, which latter avenue was laid out under special act of the Legislature, namely chapter 711 of the Laws at 1897.

I transmit herewith two (2) maps, the one showing the lines of Kingsbridge road, the property lines and the grades established on section 17 of the Final Maps and profiles, the other showing, by blue figures, the grades proposed and recommended by the Local Board of the Twenty-first District, and by red tigures the modified grades. This map shows that the intersection of the westerly curb-lines of Kingsbridge road and Fordham road was kept at an elevation of tog feet

I recommend, therefore, that a public hearing be given on this proposed change of grades, in accordance with section 436 of chapter 378 of the Laws of 1897.

Sins—I am in receipt of a communication from your Secretary, under date of April 21, 1898, inclosing a copy of an ordinance passed by you and proposed to be submitted to the Manicipal Assembly and requesting my opinion thereon.

The proposed ordinance reads as follows:

"Be it Ordained by the Municipal Assembly of The City of New York, as follows:

The commissioner of street cleaning shall have power and anthonity to add, as he may deem proper, to the members of the uniformed force of his department, as enumerated in section 536 of the Greater New York Charter, such or so many others of the employees of his department, as are not already enumerated and are not included in the clerical force of the said department."

The Charter (section 536) divides the members of the Street Cleaning Department into two general classes, designated respectively:

Of necessity, the members of that Department must belong to either class. Those who are not included in the clerical force belong to the uniformed force and vice versa.

At any event, there is no authority of law authorizing either your Board or the Municipal Assembly to pass the resolution in question; and if the Commissioner of Street Cleaning will communicate with me, enumerating the particular employees to which he refers, I will advise him to what class they belong. what class they belong.
