Hon. JOHN F. HYLAN, Mayor, and Chairman of the Commissioners of the Sinking
Fund:

Dear Sir—I beg to recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund
approve of and consent to the execution by the Commissioner of Docks of the
following lease:

Lessee: Compagnie Generale Transatlantique (French Line).
Description of Property: Pier 84 at the foot of West 44th Street, together with
the bulkhead extending 120 feet southerly therefrom and the sheds thereon.

Time: Three years from June 1, 1918.

Rental: \$52,000 per annum.

Remaining Terms and Conditions: The remaining terms and conditions of the
lease shall be similar to those contained in leases of wharf property now used by
this department.

The pier at the foot of West 44th Street and the adjoining bulkhead was occu-
pied by the French Line under a lease which expired March 1, 1918.

In December, 1917, this property, together with other waterfront property to
the north thereof, was leased to the United States Government for a term com-
mencing March 1, 1918. Since March 1, 1918, the French Line has occupied the

Hon. JOHN F. Hylan, Mayor, Chairman, Sinking Fund Commission:

Sir—On January 15, 1918, I requested authority to renew the lease of the premises Nos. 42-44 Hamilton Street, Borough of Manhattan, which is occupied by this Department as a stable, blacksmith shop, etc., for a period of three years, commencing April 1, 1918, at an annual rental of \$7,000, payable quarterly, which was the amount of rental under the previous lease, which expired on that date.

On February 18, 1918, I requested that this lease be renewed for a period of five years, commencing April 1, 1918, as the owners were willing to consent to such an arrangement.

On March 28, 1918, the Sinking Fund Commission adopted a resolution authorizing a renewal of this lease for a period of one year from April 1, 1918, and, so far as I have been able to ascertain, without the consent of the owners of the property.

I am now in receipt of a notice for the owners that they are unwilling to accept a lease from the City for a shorter period than three years from April 1, 1918.

This department has been occupying these premises since 1893, for the reason that there are no other stable premises available in the downtown eastern portion of the Borough of Manhattan, suitable to our needs. In fact, the present premises are so small that the department is obliged to store its vehicles in the street in front of the premises for the want of sufficient space.

Request is, therefore, made for the amendment of the resolution adopted on March 28, 1918, by changing the term of the lease from one year to three years.

Provision for a renewal of this lease was made in the 1918 Budget.

These premises have been occupied for this purpose under a lease made as follows:

May 15, 1915, May 15, 1918, \$950 a year, May 5, 1915.

There is no City owned property in the vicinity that is available for this purpose.

The nearest City owned property is at 503 West 145th Street, occupied as a Public Library.

There is no property now under lease to the City that is not in use or that could be made available for the purposes of this lease.

The rent for the renewed lease, compared with other rents in the vicinity, is as follows:

The rent asked for the premises occupied by the City at 481 West 145th Street is \$950 a year. The rent asked for similar premises adjoining, at 483 West 145th Street, is \$1,000 a year.

There is no privately owned property that could be rented or used in lieu of the above premises to the advantage of the City.

The existing lease, expiring May 15, 1918, contained a renewal clause, giving the City the right to renew after May 15, 1918, for a period of three years at the same rental of \$950 a year.

The Department of Health insisted that, if possible, the renewal should be for one year from May 15, 1918, and that certain inside repairs be made by the lessor. Gentlemen—The Board of Estimate and Apportionment on April 26, 1918, approved the plan changing the lines and grades of E. 161st Street, from Jerome Avenue to Sherman Avenue.

The lines of E. 161st Street thus established will necessitate the transfer of land now under the jurisdiction of the Park Department to the President of the Borough of The Bronx, and also the transfer of land formerly acquired for E. 161st Street and its approach to the Grand Boulevard and Concourse, from the President of the Borough of The Bronx to the Park Department.

I am accordingly transmitting herewith for your approval a copy of map entitled:

"Map showing land now under the jurisdiction of the Park Department required for East 161st Street, and land formerly acquired for East 161st Street and for approach to Grand Boulevard and Concourse, now under the jurisdiction of the Borough President, required for Park purposes, in the Borough of The Bronx, City of New York, dated, New York, April 12, 1918."

This map shows the land to be transferred by the Department of Parks to the Sinking Fund Commission, Parcels "A" and "B," which parcels are to be retransferred to the President of the Borough of The Bronx for street purposes.

The map also shows two parcels "X" and "Y," which were acquired by the widening of East 161st Street and for the approach to the Grand Boulevard and Concourse, from the approach to Macombs Dam Bridge. These parcels are to be transferred to the Sinking Fund Commission by the President of the Borough of The Bronx and retransferred to the Commissioner of Parks, Borough of The Bronx, for park purposes.

The combined area of Parcels "A" and "B" is 14,798.71 square feet, and the combined area of parcels "X" and "Y" is 48,322.10 square feet.

It is to be noted in connection with this matter that the land included in Parcels "X" and "Y" is being used for park purposes at the present time, although such land is not formally under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Parks.

Sinking Fund Commission, Municipal Building, New York City:

Gentlemen—I have been requested by the President of the Borough of The Bronx to join with him in a request to your Honorable Board, which he informs me is contained in a letter to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, under date of May 4th last, for the transfer of certain lands referred to and described in said letter, from the Department of Parks, Borough of The Bronx, to the President of the Borough of The Bronx, and from the President of the Borough of The Bronx to the Department of Parks, Borough of The Bronx, to carry out the proposed improvement of East 161st Street.

In taking up the question, at the instance of the Borough President, for the proposed transfer of land, as indicated on the map and in the technical description transmitted to your Honorable Board by the President of the Borough of The Bronx, and which description I respectfully request to be considered as a part of this letter, the Borough President agreed to modify the plans so that there would be a retaining wall instead of a sloped embankment on the south side of 161st Street roadway, between Doughty Street and Macombs Dam Bridge, the retaining wall to be about 12 feet from the outer border of the quarter mile running track, instead of the sloped embankment, the base of which would come within 3 feet.

The Borough President ratified this agreement in a letter addressed to this department under date of May 7th, copy of which is enclosed.

Under date of May 10th the Borough President informed me that the contract, plans and specifications were not finished, and would not be finished to submit to this department for approval for two or three weeks.

The Borough President said in his letter:

"I hope you will agree with me that we can save three or four weeks' time by making the request for the exchange of lands on the Sinking Fund Commission now, and have that operation completed by the time the contract plans are completed. I can positively assure you that the improvement will be carried out strictly in accordance with the agreement arrived at in your office the other day, and the contract plans must, in accordance with the provisions of the Greater New York Charter, be submitted to you for approval before I can let the work."

While the retaining wall to be substituted for the sloped embankment has been agreed upon, I have no information yet as to the nature of the construction and finish of the wall.

In view, however, of the understanding with the Borough President, as restated herein, that the plans of the 161st Street improvement are to be modified, to protect, as far as possible, the running track at Macombs Dam Park, and, without waiting for the final plans, etc., I hereby join in the request of the Borough President for the transfer of lands, as made in his letter of May 4th, to the Sinking Fund Commission. 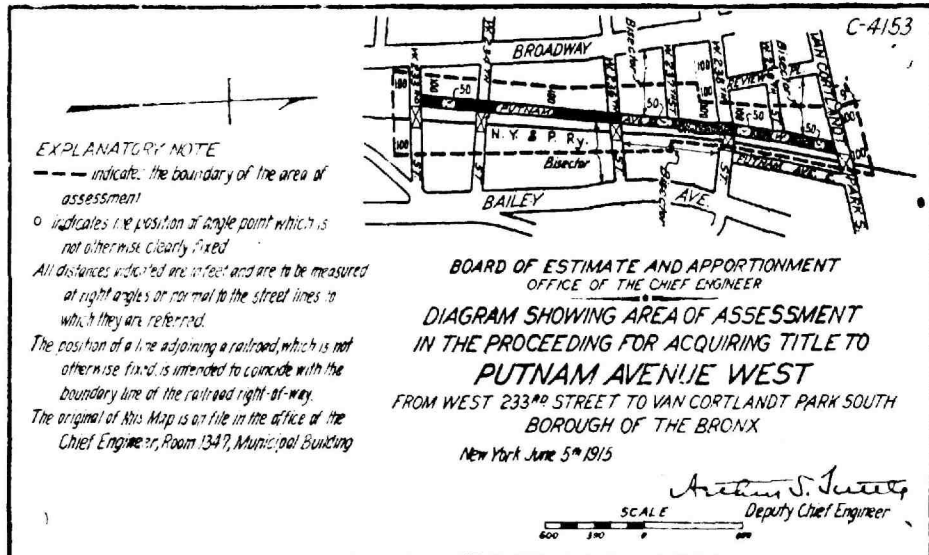
