

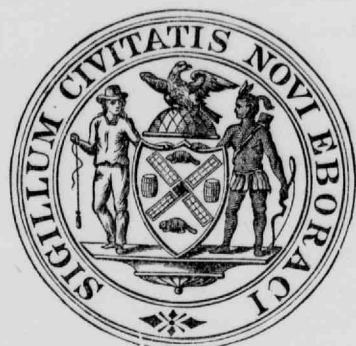

ASSESSMENT COMMISSION.

Hon. EDWARD COOPER, Chairman of Assessment Commission:

SIR—In compliance with the resolution adopted by the Assessment Commission on July 22, 1880, I herewith transmit a statement giving the following information in relation to assessments for local improvements in the City of New York, confirmed prior to June 9, 1880, on which arrears are due, viz:

1. The title of each local improvement.
2. The date of confirmation of assessment.
3. The total amount of the assessment.
4. The amount charged to the City.
5. The amount vacated by the Courts.
6. The amount paid by property-owners.
7. The amount remaining unpaid on April 30, 1880.

The statement shows the total amount of assessments remaining unpaid on April 30, 1880, to be \$8,456,685.51.

COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND.

Abstract of the Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at the meeting held September 14, 1880.

Present—Hon. Edward Cooper, Mayor (Chairman); Hon. Frederick Smyth, Recorder; Hon. John Kelly, Comptroller; and J. Nelson Tappan, Esq., Chamberlain.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Mayor submitted the following communication from the Building Committee of the New York Produce Exchange, which was ordered to be printed in the minutes, viz.:

BUILDING COMMITTEE OF THE NEW YORK PRODUCE EXCHANGE,
NEW YORK, September 4, 1880.

Hon. EDWARD COOPER, Chairman of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City of New York:

SIR—I beg respectfully to notify you that the Building Committee of the New York Produce Exchange accept the proposition of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to sell to the New York Produce Exchange the building known as Primary School No. 15, together with all their right, title, and interest to the alley-way adjoining, for the sum of \$20,000.

Will you kindly cause to be sent to me a copy of the resolution of the Commissioners authorizing the sale, for record on our minutes.

The Mayor submitted the following communication from the President of the Board of Commissioners of the Fire Department, which was ordered to be printed in the minutes, viz.:

HEADQUARTERS FIRE DEPARTMENT CITY OF NEW YORK,
(155 AND 157 MERCER STREET),
NEW YORK, September 10, 1880.

Hon. EDWARD COOPER, Mayor:

SIR—I have the honor, on behalf of the Board of Commissioners of this Department, to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 7th inst., requesting information of the action taken in the matter of the survey of Fulton Market, and to say in reply thereto, that your communication of the 21st inst. was referred to the Inspector of Buildings, with directions to comply and return with report and recommendations. On the 26th inst. your communication of the 25th inst., transmitting copy of the preamble and resolution adopted by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on that day, and referring to the same matter, was received and referred to the Inspector of Buildings, with directions to take the proper action in the matter referred to without delay. Upon consultation with the Attorney to the Fire Department it was found that during the month of May, 1880, proceedings had been commenced by the late Department of Buildings, under sections 36 to 39 of chapter 625, Laws of 1871, as amended; that the notice of survey required by the law was served upon the Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, and upon all persons who were tenants or lessees of the market; that, according to the terms of that notice, the report of survey was placed before the Court of Common Pleas, at 10.30 A. M., June 8, 1880, for trial, and that all the parties upon whom the notices were served were duly called, in open court, at that time, but that no one appearing, the default of all was duly noted, and an order made by Judge Van Hoesen, granting leave to the department to present proofs at any time upon which to apply for a precept. At this juncture the writ of prohibition granted by Judge Potter in the matter of the enforcement of chapter 521 of the Laws of 1880, operated to delay further proceedings until the quashing of that writ.

The proceedings begun by the late Superintendent of Buildings having been found to be based upon the proper preliminary actions required by the sections of law above referred to, and which were lacking in the case of the subsequent surveys made under the directions of this Department, the Department, by its attorney, went before Judge Van Brunt, in the Court of Common Pleas, on the 31st ult., under the permission given by Judge Van Hoesen, took such testimony as was deemed to be sufficient and submitted the papers for such order as the court may see proper to make, in which condition the matter remains at this date.

GENTLEMEN—The Comptroller, to whom was referred, July 29, 1880, a communication from George Bliss, Esq., attorney, relative to the premises No. 2. Fourth avenue, formerly occupied by the Department of Buildings, respectfully

REPORTS:

That said premises were leased by the city for a period of five years, from May 1, 1874, at a yearly rental of \$3,500, for the use of the Department of Buildings, and that since said lease expired, on May 1, 1879, that Department has continued to occupy and use said premises without a renewal of said lease or the payment of rent therefor; that by a communication from the Fire Department, dated August 23, 1880, herewith presented, it appears that said premises will be required for the use of said Department, now transferred to the Fire Department, until October 1, 1880; that the attorney aforesaid demands the payment of the rent due on said premises and requests that a renewal lease may be entered into by the authority of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, as provided by chapter 461 of the Laws of 1880.

I submit a resolution authorizing the Counsel to the Corporation to prepare such a lease, and the Comptroller to execute it when prepared, leaving a blank space for the amount of rent, to be filled up as may be determined by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

That, on the 10th day of June, 1874, a lease was entered into by the then Comptroller, with John Schappert, under a resolution of the Common Council, approved June 4, 1874, of the premises now occupied by said Court, in the building on the northeast corner of Second avenue and First street, for the term of five years from May 1, 1874, at a yearly rent of \$2,500; that the said premises have been occupied by said Court since the said lease expired, May 1, 1879, without renewal thereof, and that no rent has been paid for the use and occupation thereof since that date; that the said premises are now owned by David L. The reason assigned for making said petition is, that the deed from the corporation for said land was not signed by the then Mayor of the city, as required by law.

The Comptroller submitted the following report in relation to lease of premises for Sixth Police Court and Tenth District Civil Court, viz.:

GENTLEMEN—On the 8th day of May, 1875, a lease was entered into by the city with John B. Haskin for the three-story brick building, corner of Kingsbridge and College avenues, in the Twenty-fourth Ward, to be used by the Sixth Police Court and the Tenth District Civil Court of New York, for the term of five years from the first day of May, 1875, at the yearly rent of \$1,500.

The said premises have continued to be occupied by said Courts since the expiration of said lease on May 1, 1880, without renewal thereof, and no rent has been paid for said premises since that date.

It has been proposed that some other location nearer the centre of population in the district of the Civil Court would be more convenient, and inquiry has been made to find a suitable building, but upon consideration of all the circumstances it appears to be advisable that a lease of said premises shall be entered into for one year from May 1, 1880, at the same yearly rental, which is considered fair and reasonable.

I therefore submit a resolution, requesting the Counsel to the Corporation to prepare such lease and authorize the Comptroller to enter into the same, when so prepared and approved by him, in behalf of the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York.

On motion, the report was approved and resolution adopted.

The Mayor submitted a communication from Jordan L. Mott, offering to lease to the city the building corner of Third avenue and One Hundred and Thirty-fourth street, for the use of civil and police courts, in the Twenty-third Ward; also one from John B. Simpson, offering to lease the building known as "Mortisania Savings Bank," for the same purpose,—which were placed on file; whereupon the following resolution, submitted by the Mayor, was, on motion, adopted, viz.:

Resolved, That the Comptroller is hereby requested to examine and report in respect to the several premises, leased to the city, the leases of which terminate on or before the first day of May next, which of them, in his opinion, should be again leased by the city, and which vacated at the expiration of the present lease, and what premises, if any, it is desirable for the city to lease in place of such as will be vacated.

The Comptroller submitted the following resolution in relation to lease of No. 27 Chambers street; which, on motion, was adopted, viz.:

Resolved, That the lease from Mary A. Schanck, executrix, to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York, of the premises No. 27 Chambers street, for the occupation and use of public offices, prepared by the Counsel to the Corporation, as requested by a resolution adopted August 6, 1880, and approved by him, be and is hereby authorized by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund; and the Comptroller is hereby requested to enter into and execute said lease in behalf of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty, as provided by chapter 461 of the Laws of 1880.

The Comptroller submitted the following resolution for refunding erroneous payments of Croton Water Rents, which, on motion, was adopted, viz.:

Resolved, That a warrant for five thousand dollars (\$5,000), payable from "Sinking Fund, for the Payment of Interest on the City Debt," be drawn in favor of the Chamberlain, for deposit in the city treasury to credit of "Croton Water Rent—Refunding Account," for refunding duplicate, erroneous, and over payments of Croton water rent.

The Recorder called up the resolution for payment of bill of William Kennelly, amounting to (as corrected) the sum of \$1,320, laid over at the last meeting; which, on motion, was adopted, as follows, viz.:

Resolved, That the bill of William Kennelly for auctioneers' fees, for attending and adjourning sales of property, by direction of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and by the Comptroller, and for services rendered in appraising Fulton Market property, and the premises occupied as a Court-house for the Second District Court, be approved, and the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay the same.

The Commission created by chapter 550 of the Laws of 1880, to revise, vacate, or modify assessments for legal improvements in the City of New York, met pursuant to adjournment.

CHAPTER 195.
AN ACT in relation to the payment of assessments for local improvements in the City of New York.

Passed May 7, 1880; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. At any time before the first day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty, any person liable therefor may pay, to the officer authorized to receive the same, the amount of any assessment for any local improvement in the City of New York, heretofore confirmed and now unpaid, with interest thereon at the rate of seven per centum per annum from the date of confirmation to the date of payment, and after said first day of September, and before the first day of December, eighteen hundred and eighty, any such assessment may be paid as aforesaid, with interest at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the date of confirmation to the date of payment.

Sec. 2. Where any installment or installments of any assessments have been paid under the provisions of chapter one hundred and three of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, or of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, or of chapter two hundred and fifty-five of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, the amount of such assessment or assessments remaining unpaid may be paid within the same periods prescribed in the first section of this act and upon the same terms and conditions therein prescribed.

Sec. 3. Upon such payment in full, as hereinbefore provided, such assessment or assessments shall cease to be a lien upon the property, and shall be deemed fully paid, satisfied and discharged; and there shall be no further interest or penalty by reason of such assessment or assessments not having been paid within the time heretofore required by law, or by reason of any statute heretofore requiring the payment of any penalty or interest over the rate hereinbefore provided for upon any unpaid assessment.

Sec. 4. No provision of this act hereinbefore contained shall be construed as applicable to or affecting any assessment for the collection of which assessment the property has been sold.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT in relation to arrears of taxes in the City of New York, and to provide for the reissuing of revenue bonds in anticipation of such taxes.

Passed April 15, 1880; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. At any time after the passage of this act, and before the first day of October, eighteen hundred and eighty, any person may pay to the Comptroller of the City of New York the amount of any tax upon real property belonging to such person, heretofore laid or imposed and now remaining unpaid, together with interest thereon at the rate of seven per centum per annum, to be calculated from the time that such tax was imposed to the time of such payment, provided, also, that the time when such payment may be made on the amount of any such tax laid or imposed in the years eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, and eighteen hundred and seventy-nine shall extend to the first day of April, eighteen hundred and eighty-one. The comptroller shall make and deliver to the person making any such payment a receipt therefor, and shall forthwith cancel the record of any such tax on the books of the finance department; and upon such payment being made such tax shall cease to be a lien upon the property and shall be deemed fully paid, satisfied and discharged, and there shall be no right to any further interest or penalty by reason of such tax not having been paid within the time heretofore required by law, or by reason of any statute passed requiring the payment heretofore of any penalty or interest over even per centum per annum upon any unpaid tax.

Sec. 2. Any revenue bond heretofore issued in anticipation of the taxes in the first section specified which may fall due and become payable before said taxes are collected, may be reissued by the comptroller of said city, in whole or in part, for such period as he may determine, not exceeding one year.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
