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### BOARD OF ARMORY COMMISSIONERS.

MAYOR'S OFFICE—CITY HALL,  
NEW YORK, October 10, 1894.

A meeting of the Armory Board was held this day, at 12 o'clock M., at the office of the Mayor.

Present—The President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

In the absence of the Mayor, and on the motion of the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald took the chair.

The reading of the minutes of the meeting of September 20 was dispensed with.

Mr. E. G. Marsh, representing the Comptroller, appeared, and in response to the advertisement of date September 25, 1894, the following bids were received for furnishing the material and work in the erection of an armory building on the northerly side of Fourteenth street, one hundred and seventy-five feet two and one-quarter inches west of Sixth avenue and running through to Fifteenth street, in the City of New York, for the accommodation of the Ninth Regiment, N. G. S. N. Y., viz.:

A meeting of the Armory Board was held this day, at 11 o'clock A. M., at the office of the Mayor.

Present—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

The minutes of the meetings held September 20 and October 10 were read and approved.

The following communications were received:

From the Comptroller, transmitting the following:

At a meeting of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund held October 3, 1894, the following preamble and resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, At a meeting of the Board of Armory Commissioners held September 20, 1894, the following resolutions were adopted:

"Resolved, That the plans for the enlargement and furnishing of rifle range in the Armory of the Seventh Regiment be approved, and that Charles W. Clinton be employed as architect, at a compensation of five per cent. on the cost of the work to supervise the carrying out of the same, and that the sum of nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$9,500) be and is hereby deemed necessary and appropriated for the same, and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be respectfully requested to concur in the same."

"Resolved, That the plans for the additional gallery in the Twelfth Regiment Armory Building be approved, and that James E. Ware be employed as architect, at a compensation of five per cent. on the cost of the work to supervise the carrying out of the same, and that the sum of eleven thousand five hundred dollars (\$11,500) be and is hereby deemed necessary and appropriated for the same, and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be respectfully requested to concur in the same."

Resolved, That pursuant to the provisions of section 3 of chapter 91 of the Laws of 1884 the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund concur in the said resolutions of the Armory Board; and

Resolved, That pursuant to the provisions of chapter 299 of the Laws of 1883, and amendments thereto, the Comptroller be and hereby is authorized and directed to issue from time to time, as may be required, redeemable in not less than ten nor more than twenty years from the date of issue thereof, and at such rate of interest as he may determine, not exceeding three per cent. per annum, "Consolidated Stock of the City of New York," which also shall be denominated "Armory Bonds," to the amount of twenty-one thousand dollars (\$21,000), the proceeds of which stock or bonds shall be applied to the purposes specified in the aforesaid resolutions of the Armory Board.

From the Architect of the Armory for Troop "A":

NEW YORK, October 8, 1894.

The Board of Armory Commissioners of the City of New York:

GENTLEMEN—In the progress of the work upon the armory for Troop "A" to this date the terms and conditions of the contract have been complied with by the contractor.

The walls of the building are completed to the floor of the top story; the floor girders are all in place and the mechanics are putting up the iron roof trusses over riding ring.

The President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments presented an application and affidavit from John F. Johnson for a payment to him of \$7,225, with the architect's certificate that the work has been performed in accordance with the contract and specifications, on account of his contract for the erection of an armory building on Madison avenue, between Ninety-fourth and Ninety-fifth streets, and offered the following:

Resolved, That the Comptroller be authorized to pay to John F. Johnson the sum of seven thousand two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$7,225) as per accompanying voucher, on account of his contract for the erection of an armory building on Madison avenue, between Ninety-fourth and Ninety-fifth streets.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

The President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments reported that of the bids received on October 10, 1894, for the erection of an armory for the Ninth Regiment, that of James D. Murphy, of No. 119 East Ninety-first street, for \$297,800 was the lowest; Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald offered the following:

Resolved, That the proposal of James D. Murphy, 119 East Ninety-first street, received on the 10th inst., for erecting an armory for the Ninth Regiment, N. G. S. N. Y., on the north side of Fourteenth street, west of Sixth avenue, amounting to two hundred and ninety-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$297,800), be accepted as being the lowest bid for said work, and that the

same be submitted to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for their concurrence and to the Comptroller for his approval of the surties thereon, and when so approved the Chairman be authorized to execute the contract on behalf of this Board.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

Colonel Seward offered the following:

Whereas, On March 1, 1894, the Sinking Fund Commissioners approved of a plan for an armory for the Ninth Regiment, N. G. S. N. Y., and authorized the issue of bonds to the amount of \$285,000 for the erection of the same; and

Whereas, The lowest bid received for said work

Amounts to.....	\$297,800 00
Architect's fees, four per cent.....	11,912 00

Total.....\$309,712 00

—the increased cost being mainly in consequence of chapter 277, Laws of 1894, requiring all stone to be dressed within the State or municipality.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be and they are hereby requested to authorize the additional issue of bonds to the extent of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000), to be added to the amount already authorized, making the total sum required to be three hundred and twelve thousand dollars (\$312,000) for doing said work.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

The President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments presented the following report and resolution:

To the Armory Board:

On September 20 you referred to me a communication from Commander Miller of the First Naval Battalion, stating that about a year ago the issue of \$16,000 bonds was authorized to fit the ship "New Hampshire" as an armory for that organization, and inasmuch as there is a balance of the amount as at that time authorized still remaining unexpended, he transmits a requisition for additional work, etc., to be done.

Upon examination, I find

That bonds were authorized to be issued for.....	\$16,000 00
That bonds were issued amounting to.....	13,200 00

That the balance of these bonds yet unissued amount to.....	\$2,800 00
That the balance unexpended of bonds issued is.....	33 35

Leaving available for this work.....\$2,833 35

I have had made an examination of the work and materials required, and find that it can be done for \$2,689, and the balance used toward the payment of salary of Inspector.

I recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That labor and materials required on the ship "New Hampshire," the armory for the First Naval Battalion, State of New York, and called for in the requisition of Commander Miller, be and is hereby approved and ordered furnished to the extent of the balance of the appropriation heretofore authorized and now available, to wit: two thousand eight hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-five cents. That the Secretary be authorized to have contract and specifications prepared and printed and insert advertisements in the CITY RECORD inviting proposals for the same.

The report was accepted and the resolution adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

The President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments presented the following report, which was adopted, and a copy of the same ordered transmitted to the Commissioner of Public Works.

To the Armory Board:

The requisition received from the Commandant of the 2d Battery, and referred to me for examination and report, calls for work to be done on the Armory, and supplies to be furnished for the use of the Battery, all of such a character, that they should, in my judgment, properly come through the Commissioner of Public Works; and in order to avoid confusion in these matters in the future, I recommend that the requisition of Captain Wilson be referred to the Commissioner of Public Works, that he may include the amount necessary in his estimate for appropriations for 1895.

Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald reported to the Board that the Headquarters and Signal Corps had removed to their new armory at Thirty-fourth street and Park avenue, and that Troop "A" had been ordered to quarters in the Eighth Regiment Armory on Park avenue, Ninety-fourth and Ninety-fifth streets, pending the completion of their armory in the same block, and that the quarters formerly occupied under lease by Troop "A" would be no longer required.

The Commissioner of Public Works offered the following:

Resolved, That Lewis M. Sweet be and he is hereby appointed from the eligible civil service list as Stenographer and Typewriter at a salary of twelve hundred dollars per annum and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be requested to approve of the same, and authorize the issue of bonds to the extent of five thousand dollars to be devoted to the payment of salaries of employees and contingencies of the Armory Board.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald and Colonel William Seward.

The following communication was received and ordered entered at length upon the minutes:

GENTLEMEN—In justice to your Honorable Secretary, E. P. Barker, I would most respectfully state that I retract the assertion or statement made by me, at a previous meeting of your Board, inadvertently and without any deliberation at that occasion, that your Secretary favored a certain manufacturer as to the locks to be used at Seventy-first Regiment Armory, which was erroneous on my part and which I most sincerely regret.

SIR—In reply to your favor of the 21st instant, relating to the locks furnished for the lockers of the Seventy-first Regiment Armory, and asking that I should reduce to writing the facts relating to this matter, and appear before the Armory Board at its next meeting, I have to say that the facts are as follows:

The contractor for the armory lockers ignored the specification for locks in his contract, which called for a "double cylinder lock," and representing, as I do, the makers of such locks, I wrote you informing you that the contractor was not conforming to the specification. I received a letter from you asking me to call at your office, which I did, and at your request explained wherein the locks that were being applied differed from those specified. You thereupon asked me to meet the inspector, Mr. Guy, which I did, and also explained the difficulty to him.

Prior to the application of the locks I never had any communication with you, either verbal or written, direct or indirect, on this or any other matter. I look upon the insinuation of the contractor as a gross outrage upon you as well as upon me, and I will gladly appear before the Armory Board at its next meeting to reaffirm the facts stated herein.

An affidavit was received from Mr. Keating detailing all the facts covering all the relations by correspondence or otherwise that he has ever had with Mr. Barker in any respect whatsoever and swearing that the reported statement and insinuation of Mr. Grissler to be false. Ordered on file.

The final payment to Messrs. Grissler & Son on their contract for gun and locks, lockers, etc., for Armory, Thirty-fourth street and Park avenue, which was laid over at the meeting held on September 20, 1894, was taken up. Messrs. Grissler & Son being represented only by their book-keeper, and he being unauthorized to speak for the firm, the further consideration of the subject was laid over.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, and by virtue of the authority therein conferred upon the Board of Police, the division of the several Assembly Districts in the City and County of New York into Election Districts and the boundaries of said Election Districts are hereby fixed by said Board, as follows:

*First Assembly District.*

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Wall street, East river, Old slip, Pearl street, Whitehall street, and Broadway.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Fulton street, East river, Wall street and Broadway.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park row, Spruce street, Gold street, Ferry street, Peck slip, East river, Fulton street, and Broadway.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rector street, Broadway, Whitehall street, East river, Hudson or North river, Battery place, Greenwich street, Bedloe's, Ellis' and Governor's Islands.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Morris street, Greenwich street, Battery place, and Washington street.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rector street, Washington street, Battery place, and Hudson or North river.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rector street, Greenwich street, Morris street, and Washington street.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Carlisle street, Greenwich street, Thames street, Broadway, Rector street, and Hudson or North river.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cedar street, Greenwich street, Carlisle street, and Hudson or North river.

The Eleventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Fulton street, Greenwich street, Cedar street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twelfth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Vesey street, Broadway, Thames street, and Greenwich street.

The Thirteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Murray street, Broadway, Vesey street, Greenwich street, Fulton street, and Hudson or North river.

The Fourteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Duane street, Broadway, Murray street, and Hudson or North river.

The Fifteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within North Moore street, West Broadway, Canal street, Broadway, Duane street, and Hudson street.

The Sixteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Harrison street, Hudson street, Duane street, and Hudson or North river.

The Seventeenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within North Moore street, Hudson street, Harrison street, and Hudson or North river.

The Eighteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Beach street, West Broadway, North Moore street, and Hudson street.

The Nineteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Hubert street, Hudson street, North Moore street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twentieth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Laight street, Canal street, West Broadway, Beach street, and Hudson street.

The Twenty-first Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Laight street, and Hudson street.

The Twenty-second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Vestry street, Hudson street, Hubert street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twenty-third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Watts street, Canal street, Hudson street, Vestry street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twenty-fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spring street, Greenwich street, Canal street, Watts street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twenty-fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spring street, Renwick street, Canal street, and Greenwich street.

The Twenty-sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spring street, Hudson street, Canal street, and Renwick street.

The Thirty-third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spring street, South Fifth avenue, Canal street, and Thompson street.

The Thirty-fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spring street, Broadway, Canal street, and South Fifth avenue.

*Second Assembly District.*

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cherry street, Pike slip, East river, and Catharine street.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Monroe street, Pike street, Cherry street, and Market street.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Madison street, Pike street, Monroe street, and Market street.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Henry street, Pike street, Madison street, and Market street.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within East Broadway, Pike street, Henry street, and Market street.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Division street, Pike street, East Broadway, and Market street.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Division street, Market street, East Broadway, and Catharine street.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within East Broadway, Market street, Henry street, and Catharine street.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within south side of Henry street, from Catharine street to Market street, and the east side of Catharine street, from Henry street to Madison street.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within north side of Madison street, from Catharine street to Market street, and the west side of Market street, from Madison street to Henry street.

The Eleventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within south side of Madison street, from Catharine street to Market street, and the west side of Market street, from Monroe street to Madison street.

The Twelfth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within east side of Catharine street, from Monroe street to Madison street, and the north side of Monroe street, from Catharine street to Market street.

The Thirteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within south side of Monroe street, from Catharine street to Market street; the east side of Catharine street, from Cherry street to Monroe street, and Hamilton street.

The Fourteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within north side of Cherry street, from Catharine street to Market street, and the west side of Market street, from Cherry street to Hamilton street.

The Fifteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Water street, Catharine street, East river, and Roosevelt street.

The Sixteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cherry street, Catharine street, Water street, and Roosevelt street.

The Seventeenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Water street, Roosevelt street, East river, and Peck slip.

The 703 deaths represent a death-rate of 18.58, against 17.59 for the previous week, and 18.54 for the corresponding week of 1893.

The increase of 38 deaths was mainly due to an increase of 6 in the deaths from diphtheria, of 10 from diarrhoeal diseases, of 10 from phthisis, of 8 from cancer, of 6 from Bright's disease, and of 6 from congenital debility, partially offset by a decrease of 9 from bronchitis and of 6 from old age.

The deaths from diphtheria were most numerous in the Twelfth Ward, while the few deaths from measles and scarlet fever were scattered.

#### TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS

**ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT** act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.
