NYCEM Staff has been receiving inquiries regarding one of the notable updates to the <u>NYC CERT SOPs</u> that was highlighted in the last week's newsletter, specifically: *To remain Active, volunteers must complete and report a minimum of 25 approved volunteer service hours annually.*

Why 25 hours?

This new standard was introduced in response to numerous volunteer requests for clearer guidelines on activity status. We understand that volunteer commitments vary across boroughs, divisions, and individuals. The 25-hour annual minimum is a reasonable benchmark, aligning with common volunteer practices and providing a clear framework for maintaining active status.

You can meet the 25-hour minimum by making sure to submit your volunteer hours for: Time spent on training, drills, deployments, community outreach, and other CERT-related activities. By meeting this simple requirement, you'll ensure your continued participation in the program and help maintain the readiness of NYC CERT membership.

We've created the following chart to illustrate how a volunteer might satisfy the minimum requirements.

Activity	Hours per activity	Total Activities	Total Hours
Monthly Division Meeting	1 hour (at least)	12	12 hours
Preparedness Event	4 hours (at least)	2	8 hours
Planned Deployment	4 hours (per shift)	1	4 hours
Training Session	2 hours (at least)	1	2 hours

Halloween Safety

Everyone loves a good scare on Halloween, but not when it comes to the safety of those little trick-or-treaters. Fortunately, there are lots of easy things parents and kids can do to stay safe on the spookiest of holidays.

- Carry glow sticks or flashlights, use reflective tape or stickers on costumes and bags, and wear light colors to help kids see and be seen by drivers.
- Join kids under age 12 for trick-ortreating.
- Slow down and be alert! Kids are excited on Halloween and may dart into the street. Turn on headlights early in the day to spot kids from further away.
- Remind kids to cross the street at corners or crosswalks.
- When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls. Choose face paint over masks when possible. Masks can limit children's vision.

Cybersecurity Awareness Training for CERT Volunteers Now Available

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not available. Volunteers who participate in CERT training have a better understanding of potential threats to the community, along with actionable steps they can take to mitigate risk and improve outcomes.

To provide additional support to CERT volunteers and the important role they play in their communities, FEMA partnered with the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Agency (CISA) to provide a list of cybersecurity awareness training courses CERT volunteers can take to improve their ability to prepare for and respond to cybersecurity threats. The courses are self-paced and publicly available at no cost from the Federal Virtual Training Environment and the National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium (NCPC). Course topics range from cyber essentials and fundamentals of cyber risk management to cyber ethics and mobile device security. 
Recent Activity





Bronx Division 1

THINGS TO KNOW



How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External</u> Request Form.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT
 Division, volunteer leadership (Ready
 New York Liaison, if a preparedness
 event) should submit this <u>Event</u>
 <u>Request form</u>.

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT
Event Calendar with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

What is the NYC CERT Uniform?

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy. Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:

- Green NYC CERT polo shirt (mandatory)
- Khaki pants (mandatory)
- NYC CERT reflective vest (always most visible outer layer)
- NYC CERT credential on lanyard, visible at all times (mandatory)
- Optional items: NYC CERT baseball hat, windbreaker, green helmet (for emergency responses), green CERT response bag (for emergency responses), NYC CERT branded sweaters/jackets (produced with NYCEM approval)


