## BOROUGH OF QUEENS.

Report for the Quarter Ending September 30, 1911, of the President of the Borough of Queens.

Long Island City, November 9, 1911.

WALTER H. BUNN, Esq., Commissioner of Public Works:

Sir—In accordance with your instructions, I have the honor to submit the following report of the work done under my charge during the months of July, August and September, 1911:

The Topographical Bureau is charged with the following duties:

To make topographical surveys, computations, maps or plans, and profiles and reports in connection with the following work, viz:

The preparation of a design of a street system in those parts of the Borough of Queens, where a design is not yet adopted, and making surveys and maps showing changes in adopted street systems and grades.

The actual demarcation on the ground by monuments of the lines of the adopted avenues, streets, etc., and the resetting of monuments where necessary.

The making of surveys, searches, maps, technical descriptions and profiles for the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in the matter of acquiring title by The City to avenues, streets, etc.

Filing maps and records of all matter pertaining to the work under the jurisdiction of the Topographical Bureau.

Making reports of the physical condition and the legal status of streets upon petitions for legal opening and for improvement.

Making examinations, maps and reports upon miscellaneous matters, referred to the Engineer-in-Charge.

Work Done By the Field Force.

Obtaining location of street lines for tentative map purposes in the various portions of the Borough.

Establishing additional bench marks.

Making additional ties between triangulation towers and traverse monuments in the vicinity of same.

Obtaining miscellaneous additional topographic survey data.

Accurately referencing and resetting and placing covers on monuments, as required, and upon some of the alterations noted below.

Alterations or additions engaged upon (either wholly or in part completed), as follows:

Walnut court and vicinity, Richmond Hill; Bessemer st.; Broadway, from Lawrence to Prince sts., Flushing; Sanford ave., west of Lawrence st.; Hillside ave. curve, Richmond Hill; Juniper ave., from Eliot to Metropolitan aves., Middle Village; Grout ave., Woodside; Schroeder estate, Woodside; Proctor st. and vicinity, Glendale; Glendale (general alteration); Maspeth (sections 17 and 18); Flushing ave.; Martin st. and Zeidler ave.; Meadow and Creek sts., and Nott ave.; Forest ave., from Gates to Catalpa aves., levels for grade revision; Hughes st. and Anthon ave., levels for grade revision; special survey of Lawrence st., south of Broadway,

Flushing; Fulton st. and Canal st., Jamaica, special survey. Final traversing as follows:

Monumenting surveys on Hunters Point ave. and Orton st., Long Island City, Railroad st., and upon the westerly section and southerly section of the Aqueduct map.

Inspection and repairs to monument covers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Wards. In the First Ward, 48 boxes repaired or replaced; in the Second Ward, 66 boxes repaired or replaced; in the Third Ward, 10 boxes repaired or replaced; in the Fourth Ward, 1 box set. This inspection was not completed, but still under way September 30. The inspection thus far shows that very few lids were broken—the chief cause of the failure of the boxes repaired or replaced being the rusting away of the hinge rod, and in some cases, the holes in the side of the box becoming enlarged by the rust action.

The type of box used in this Borough was similar to one used in The Bronx. The Borough of Brooklyn later adopted our design as better than the one formerly used by them. Owing to the failures experienced in this Borough, a new design for a cover was made by us, according to which a model has been made.

The following triangulation stations were tied in:

Hopedale, Golf, Forest Park, Normal School.

Additional street locations and levels by transit level, supplementing the topographical survey of the Borough were taken in South Jamaica, South Holliswood, The Rockaways, and between Bayside and Willets Point.

Complete surveys, in the matter of legally opening the following streets—which surveys were begun during the last quarter: Parcel st., from Gay st. to Corona ave.; Milton st., from Flushing ave. to Grand st.; Fresh Pond road, from Myrtle ave. to 200 degrees southerly of Anna place; Newtown road, from Jackson ave. to 13th ave.; Chicago st., from Corona ave. to Queens boulevard.

Complete surveys in the matter of legally opening: Medina place, from Berry ave. to Corona ave.; Poyer st., from Maurice ave. to Barnwell st.; Rust st., from Clinton ave. to Flushing ave.; Borden ave., from Greenpoint ave. to Laurel Hill boulevard; Gould ave., from Greenpoint ave. to Madden st., and from Locust st. to Addison place; Parsons ave., from Queens ave. to Rose st.; Clark ave., from Rust st. to Borden ave.; Alden ave., from L. I. R. R. to Pansy st.; Elmhurst st., from Broadway to Roosevelt ave.; Britton ave., from Broadway to Roosevelt ave.; Cooper st., from borough line to Cypress ave. (amendment).

Surveys in the matter of legally opening the following streets were begun during the quarter, but not finished: The Rockaway turnpike, from Conduit to City line; Kimball ave., from Liberty ave. to Liberty ave.; Winthrop ave., from East River to boulevard, and from Chauncy st. to Old Bowery Bay road.

In the case of the following streets, in the above lists, profile surveys were made, in addition to the surveys for draft damage maps: Parcel st., Fresh Pond road, Newtown road, Chicago st., Medina place, Poyer st., Rust st., Borden ave., Gould ave., Parsons ave., Clark ave., Alden ave., Elmhurst ave., Britton ave.

The following is a summary of work done by the Field Force:

Number of buildings located, 313; number of angles turned, 2,258; number of feet of accurate chaining, 642,749; number of feet of tapping, 602,277; miles of accurate level run, 2¾; number of bench marks established, 141; linear feet centre line of street leveled, 37,880; number of rod readings, 4,518; number of monuments set, 8; number of monuments reset, 18; number of monuments referenced, 24; number of streets inspected for preparation of reports, 87.

Work Done by Office Force.

Making all the necessary computations for laying out the above work and plotting the same, balancing final traverses, computing block distances, making the necessary computations for the compilation of rule maps, benefit maps, draft damage maps, alteration maps, etc.; plotting traverses from co-ordinates, plotting street layouts from location surveys, plotting street levels and interpolating contours and reducing field notes; compilation of street layouts from surveys and filed maps on 80-foot sheets and reducing same; transferring by pantograph of 200-foot sheets, inking and tracing same; tracing property maps and making prints of same for office and field work; copying of filed maps of Jamaica, and indexing and filing same at our office; miscellaneous drafting and tracing in connection with the general study for new layouts; indexing maps and field books; miscellaneous work on old records, searching, filing and indexing.

The following Alteration Maps have been prepared, and one print of each forwarded to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for approval: Map eliminating Seattle st., between Atlantic and Chichester avenues; map laying out Napier ave., across the Atlantic Avenue Division of the Long Island Railroad; map altering the width of Myrtle ave., from Putnam ave. to Constantia place, and from Woodhaven ave. to Jamaica ave.; map establishing the lines and grades of Sanford street, from Vernon ave. to the U. S. Pier and bulkhead line of the East River; map altering the grades of Forest ave., from Gates ave. to Catalpa ave.; map altering the lines and grades of Addison place, from Laurel Hill boulevard to Gould ave.; map establishing the lines and grades of Zuni st., from Riverside ave. to Flushing River; map altering the width of Lurting st., from 51st st. to Peartree ave.; map eliminating Walker and Hopkinson ave., between Ridgewood ave. and Fulton st.

Four copies of the following alteration maps were prepared and forwarded to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for filing purposes: Map altering the grades of 8th ave., from Jamaica to Flushing aves.; map altering the lines of Juniper ave., from Helen place to Metropolitan ave.; map showing the elimination of grade crossings of the L. I. R. R., between Woodside ave. and Union turnpike.

Four copies of section 3 of final maps were prepared and transmitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for filing purposes.

Final section 10, 39 and 40 were completed, and one print of each transmitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for approval, as well as portions of final map sections as follows: Maps establishing the lines and grades of Remington st., from Chichester to Liberty aves.; Rockaway boulevard, from Brooklyn Borough line to the Conduit; Roosevelt ave., from Woodside ave. to 20th st., and from 51st st. to Water-edge ave.

Final map section No. 14 was corrected and a print sent to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for readoption; final section No. 21 has been completed; final section No. 9 has been almost completed; final section No. 18 has been almost completed for readoption; final section map 4, 6, 8 and 318 are in various stages of completion.

Monument sheets Nos. 8, 32, 35, 42, 45, 54, 55, 106, 118 and 140 were corrected and completed.

Plans of Sewerage Districts 27A, 40E and 33A were checked.

The original tracings of the Aqueduct Map were modified to conform with the map approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment—for lithographing.

The profiles of the streets running north of Jackson ave., between Junction ave. and 49th st., were plotted.

Three progress maps were prepared for the Budget Exhibit.

Four atlases were corrected and kept up to date.

One copy of the Corona Map was prepared for photo-lithographing, and the proofs inspected.



One photo-lithograph of final section No. 1 was prepared for the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

For Final Sections Nos. 62, 63 and 21, the grades were carefully revised, and where necessary, vertical curves were figured and inserted.

A study was completed for a tentative map of street system and grades of College Point, Whitestone and northern Flushing.

The preparation of reports upon petitions to legally open and improve various streets, avenues and roads, as well as reports containing histories of old improvements; examining deeds, ceding streets to the City; repairing and mounting old filed maps for refiling.

The following is a summary of the work done by the office force: Making blue-prints of various layouts, alteration maps, profiles, damage maps, etc., 335; tracing, indexing and filing copies of filed maps traced at the County Clerk's office, Jamaica (area 164 acres), 4; reports on legal openings and legal status of streets, 184; miscellaneous reports, 47; examination of deeds of cession, 93; physical inspections made, 87; area of monument traverse adjusted (acres), 177; area of block dimensions computed (acres), 814; linear feet of monument traverses adjusted, 77,600; linear feet of street locations computed, 43,400; linear feet of traverses adjusted, 95,000; linear feet of bulkhead line computed, 23,600; established lines of Remington st., 4th Ward (feet), 11,500; compared final sheets Nos. 21, 63 and 67; also maps of Myrtle ave., Rockaway boulevard and Card pl.; checked four eighty-foot monument sheets; prepared working sheets for portions of College Point and Whitestone; street layouts compiled from filed maps and location surveys on 80-foot and 200-foot sheets and 200-foot tracings (acres), 679; 80-foot sheets; on these sheets the topography from the plane table sheets was transferred (acres), 1,850; number of rule maps completed or well under way, 30; linear feet of centre line of same, 142,532; number of draft damage maps made or well under way, 48; linear feet involved in same, 186,191; number of profiles made or well under way, 24; linear feet involved in same, 93,187; number of final damage maps (proceedings) made or well under way, 28; linear feet involved in same, 100,534; number of benefit maps (proceedings) made or well under way, 19; area in acres involved in same, 2,373.

The office work included preparation of payrolls and all work in connection with financial and clerical matters of the Bureau.

In conjunction with a representative of the Public Service Commission, a search was conducted for data relating to the establishment of various railroad crossings in the Borough of Queens.

This division has in previous years, and up to the present time, conducted an investigation of old town and village records, and has found much information in these records of great value to the taxpayers in the way of proving title and dedication to old streets, avenues and roads. It is at present engaged in a search of the records of Long Island City.

It is important to a property holder bordering upon an old street to ascertain its status. If the public has title or easement, he is enabled to escape expensive street opening proceedings, and we have been able to show, unquestionably, that many streets of the Borough have been on the ground as public highways, and have been improved as such by the municipal authorities, prior to consolidation.

The records of the Town Clerks of Newtown, Flushing and Jamaica have all been searched, and everything to do with the acquirement of the roads, or their improvement, has been ascertained as far as they were noted in these records. The same is true in regard to the villages of Rockaway Beach and Arverne-by-the-Sea, which had to be searched for special reports; but in the cases of the villages of Far Rockaway, Jamaica, Richmond Hill, Flushing, College Point and Whitestone (which are more voluminous, and very important), very little has been done, and questions in regard to the improvement of highways, or their legal status, are constantly arising. It would greatly facilitate the improvement of old streets in these old villages if this information were at hand. Within the past three months many reports have been made for submission to the Corporation Counsel, and facts contained therein have gone far towards establishing dedication, and thus relieving property owners from a street opening assessment. One instance is that of 51st st. (Central ave.), between Shell road and Corona ave. This proceeding would have cost the property owner abutting thereon a large amount of money, which they have been saved by initiative of this Bureau.

In our last application for a schedule of employees, it was stated that a number of additional men were required to prosecute this work. The application was denied, and, in consequence, the work referred to is almost at a standstill.

Whereas, This Board has made inquiry as to the money value of the franchise or right applied for and proposed to be granted to The New York Magnaphone and Music Company and the adequacy of the amount of compensation to be paid therefor; now, therefore, it is

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment hereby grants to The New York Magnaphone and Music Company the franchise or right fully set out and described in the following form of proposed contract for the grant thereof, embodying all the terms and conditions, including the provisions as to rates and charges upon and subject to the terms and conditions in said proposed form of contract contained, and that the Mayor of The City of New York be and he hereby is authorized to execute and deliver such contract in the name and on behalf of The City of New York, as follows, to wit:

#### Proposed Form of Contract.

This contract, made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1911, by and between The City of New York (hereinafter called the City), party of the first part, by the Mayor of said City, acting for and in the name of said City, under and in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City (hereinafter called the Board), and The New York Magnaphone and Music Company (hereinafter called the Company), party of the second part, witnesseth:

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. The City hereby grants to the Company, subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, the right or privilege to lay, construct, maintain and operate suitable wires or other electrical conductors in the conduits under the streets and avenues within the territory comprised in the Borough of Manhattan and that part of the Borough of The Bronx west of the Bronx River; such wires to connect only the premises of subscribers with the central stations of the Company and to be used for the purpose of maintaining a system whereby music and information in relation to matters of general interest may be distributed electrically from the central stations of the Company to two or more subscribers simultaneously and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Section 2. The grant of this privilege is subject to the following conditions, which shall be complied with by the Company:

First—The rights and privileges herein granted shall not be construed to in any way give the Company the right or privilege to engage in a business permitting communication between subscribers and this contract is entered into on the mutual and express understanding and agreement by and between the parties hereto that the Company will not in any way engage in a business which will permit communication between subscribers or claim the right so to do under this contract and the right and privilege herein and hereby granted and conferred; it being understood that this is not a grant to do a telephone business within the general accepted meaning of the term.

Second—The said right to lay, construct, maintain and operate wires or other electrical conductors in conduits for the purpose aforesaid shall be held and enjoyed by the Company for the term of twenty-five (25) years from the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor, without any privilege of renewal thereof.

Third—The Company shall pay to the City for the privilege hereby granted the following sums of money:

(a) The sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in cash within three (3) months after the date on which this contract is signed by the Mayor, and before anything is done in exercise of the privilege hereby granted.

(b) During the first term of five (5) years an annual sum which shall in no case be less than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), and which shall be equal to three (3) per cent. of its gross annual receipts, if such percentage shall exceed the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).

During the second term of five (5) years an annual sum which shall in no case be less than three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500), and which shall be equal to three (3) per cent. of its gross annual receipts, if such percentage shall exceed the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500).

During the third term of five (5) years an annual sum, which shall in no case be less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and which shall be equal to three (3) per cent. of its gross annual receipts,

if such percentage shall exceed the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

During the fourth term of five (5) years an annual sum, which shall in no case be less than seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500), and which shall be equal to four (4) per cent. of its gross annual receipts, if such percentage shall exceed the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500).

During the remaining term of five (5) years an annual sum, which shall in no case be less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), and which shall be equal to five (5) per cent. of its gross annual receipts if such percentage shall exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

The gross annual receipts mentioned above shall be the gross receipts of the Company from all sources within the Borough of Manhattan and the portion of The Borough of The Bronx lying westerly of the Bronx River.

The annual charges shall commence from the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor.

All annual charges as above shall be paid into the treasury of the City on November 1 of each year and shall be for the amount due to September 30 next preceding. Any and all payments to be made by the terms of this contract to The City by the Company shall not be considered in any manner in the nature of a tax, but such payments shall be made in addition to any and all taxes of whatever kind or description, now or hereafter required to be paid by any ordinance of The City, or resolution of the Board, or any law of the State of New York.

Fourth—The annual charges or payments shall continue throughout the whole term of this contract, notwithstanding any clause in any statute or in the charter of any rights or franchises at a different rate, and no assignment, lease or sublease of the rights or privileges hereby granted, or of any part thereof, shall be valid or effectual for any purpose unless the said assignment, lease or sublease shall contain a covenant on the part of the assignee or lessee that the same is subject to all the conditions of this contract; and that the assignee or lessee assumes and will be bound by all of said conditions, and especially said conditions as to payments, anything in any statute or in the charter of such assignee or lessee to the contrary notwithstanding, and that the said assignee or lessee waives any more favorable conditions created by such statute or in the charter, and that it will not claim by reason thereof or otherwise exemption from liability to perform each and all of the conditions of this contract.

Fifth—The right and privileges hereby granted shall not be assigned, either in whole or in part, or leased or sublet in any manner, nor shall the title thereto, or right, interest or property therein, pass to or vest in any other person or corporation whatsoever, either by the act of the Company, or by operation of law, whether under the provisions of the statute relating to the consolidation or merger of corporations or otherwise, without the consent of the City, acting by the Board, evidenced by an instrument under seal, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding, and the granting, giving or waiving of any one or more of such consents shall not render unnecessary any subsequent consent or consents.

Sixth—Upon the termination of this original contract, or upon the termination of the rights hereby granted for any cause, or upon the dissolution of the Company before such termination, the wires, electrical conductors and other property of the Company constructed pursuant to this contract within the streets and avenues shall become the property of the City without cost, and the same may be used or disposed of by the City for any purpose whatsoever, or the same may be leased to any company or individual.

If, however, at the termination of this contract, as above, the Board shall so order by resolution, the Company shall, upon thirty (30) days' notice from the Board, remove any and all of its wires, electrical conductors and other property, or any portion thereof, constructed pursuant to this contract, and the said streets and avenues shall be restored to their original condition at the sole cost and expense of the Company.

Seventh—Said wires, electrical conductors and other property shall be constructed, maintained and operated subject to the supervision and control of all the authorities of the City who have jurisdiction in such matters, as provided by the Charter of the City.

No construction shall be commenced by the Company until written permits therefor have been obtained from the proper City officials.

In any permits so issued such officials may also impose such conditions, as a condition of the granting of the same, as are necessary for the purpose of protecting any structures, in the streets and avenues, over which such officials have jurisdiction, and the Company shall comply with such conditions.

Eighth—All wires or other electrical conductors of the Company laid pursuant to this contract shall be placed in ducts, conduits or subways (referred to in this paragraph as subways). Such subways shall be leased from the company or companies having control thereof under the provisions of law, or from the City should it succeed to the rights of such company or companies. If the City shall construct or acquire subways for electrical conductors within the Borough of Manhattan or the portion of the Borough of The Bronx west of the Bronx River, the Company hereby agrees to lay its wires and electrical conductors in such subways, and the City agrees to lease to the Company during the term of this contract such space as may be required for the business herein authorized.

Ninth—The Company shall, upon request from any individual or corporation occupying or owning premises in the territory in which the Company is operating, not in arrears to it for service already rendered, extend its wires to such premises and furnish its service to such individual or corporation, provided that such premises are not more than one-half (½) mile from any other premises in which the Company has its apparatus installed at the time such request is made.

Tenth—The Company shall file with the Board on the first day of November in each year a map or plan upon which shall be plainly indicated the number of wires which are used by the Company on the 30th day of September next preceding, and the streets and avenues in which the same are located, and also those which were put in during the preceding year.

Eleventh—The Company shall commence the operation of its system of distribution of music and matters of general interest, as herein authorized, within six (6) months from the date on which this contract is signed by the Mayor, and shall have in operation the apparatus for the delivery of such service at one thousand (1,000) points upon subscriber's premises within five (5) years from the date on which this contract is signed by the Mayor, otherwise this grant shall cease and determine.

Twelfth—The Board may, by resolution, direct the Company to install its apparatus and net-

sary appurtenances thereto in any or all of the free wards of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals, and in the assembly halls of any or all of the public schools within the portion of the City for which a franchise is hereby granted. Upon notice by the Board to the Company that any such resolution has been adopted the Company shall install such apparatus and the necessary appurtenances thereto, free of charge, and shall furnish service, as directed, at one-half the regular rates charged by the Company for similar service, provided that the Company shall not be required to extend its wires for the purpose of connecting with such hospitals or schools a distance greater in any case than one-half (½) mile.

Thirteenth—It is agreed that the Board shall have absolute power to regulate all charges or rates for services rendered by the Company to subscribers pursuant to this contract, provided that such rates shall be reasonable and fair, but the Company shall not at any time within the term of this contract charge more than twenty dollars (\$20) per month for an unlimited music service.

Fourteenth—The Company shall not require nor receive from its subscribers any deposit or advance payment in excess of the cost to it of apparatus leased or furnished to the subscriber on his premises, and of what is reasonably necessary to insure payment of current bills, and on such amounts so paid the Company shall pay interest at the statutory rate whenever such money is held for more than one month. Unpaid bills shall never be charged against property unless due from the owner thereof, and no person not himself in arrears shall be denied service because any previous occupant of the same premises is in arrears to the Company for service.

Fifteenth—The wires of the Company shall be employed for no other purpose than those explicitly set forth herein, and the Company binds itself not to lay, use, lease or operate wires for illegal purposes.

Sixteenth—The Company shall assume all liability to persons or property by reason of the construction or operation authorized by this contract, and it is a condition of this contract that the City shall assume no liability whatsoever to either persons or property on account of the same, and the Company hereby agrees to repay to the City any damage which the City shall be compelled to pay by reason of any acts or default of the Company.

Seventeenth—It is a condition of this contract that the Company shall bear the entire expense of all work undertaken by reason of this grant.

Eighteenth—If the Company shall fail to give efficient public service at reasonable rates or at the rates herein fixed, or at the rates which may be hereafter fixed by the Board, or fail to maintain its structures and equipment as herein provided in good condition throughout the whole term of this contract, the Board may give notice to the Company specifying any default on the part of the Company, and requiring the Company to remedy the same within a reasonable time; and upon failure of the Company to remedy such default within a reasonable time, the Company shall, for each day thereafter during which the default or defect remains, pay to the City the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) as fixed or liquidated damages, or the Board, in case such structures or equipment which may affect the surface of the streets shall not be put in good condition within a reasonable time after notice by the Board as aforesaid shall have the right to make all needed repairs at the expense of the Company, in which case the Company shall pay to the City the amount of the cost of such repairs, with legal interest thereon, all of which sums may be deducted from the fund hereinafter provided for.

Nineteenth—If, for a period of any three (3) consecutive months after the commencement of the operation of the system proposed by the Company, as herein provided, such system shall not be operated, or if the same shall not be operated for a period of any six (6) months out of any consecutive twelve (12) months after the commencement of operation, the Board may declare the right and franchise and this contract terminated without further proceedings in law or in equity.

Twentieth—The Company shall submit to the Board a report not later than November 1 of each year for the year ending September 30 next preceding, and at any other time, upon request of the Board, which shall state:

1. The amount of stock issued, for cash, for property.
2. The amount paid in as by last report.
3. The total amount of capital stock paid in.
4. The funded debt by last report.
5. The total amount of funded debt.
6. The floating debt as by last report.
7. The total amount of floating debt.
8. The total amount of funded and floating debt.
9. The average rate per annum of interest on funded debt.
10. Statement of dividends paid during the year.
11. The total amount expended for same.
12. The names of the directors elected at the last meeting of the corporation held for such purpose.
13. Location, value and amount paid for real estate owned by the Company as by last report.
14. Location, value and amount paid for real estate now owned by the Company.
15. Number of subscribers served by the Company.
16. Total receipts of Company for each class of business.
17. Amounts paid by the Company for damage to persons or property on account of construction and operation.
18. Total expenses for operation, including salaries.

—and such other information in regard to the business of the Company as may be required by the Board.

Twenty-first—The Company shall at all times keep accurate books of account of the gross receipts from all sources within the limits of the City, and shall, on or before November 1 of each year, make a verified report to the Comptroller of the City of the business done by the Company for the year ending September 30 next preceding, in such form as he may prescribe. Such report shall contain a statement of such gross receipts from the operation of the system hereby authorized from all subscribers served by the Company, together with such other information as the Comptroller may require. The Comptroller shall have access to all books of the Company for the purpose of ascertaining the correctness of its report, and may examine its officers under oath.

Twenty-second—This grant is upon the express condition that the Company within thirty (30) days after the signing of this contract by the Mayor, and before anything is done in exercise of the rights conferred hereby, shall deposit with the Comptroller of the City the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), either in money or security, to be approved by him, which fund shall be security for the performance by the Company of all the terms and conditions of this contract, especially those which relate to the payment of the annual charges for the privilege hereby granted, the rendering of efficient public service at the rates herein fixed or at the rates which may be hereafter fixed by the Board as herein provided, and in default of the payment of such annual charges, the City shall collect the same with interest from said fund after ten (10) days' notice to the Company. In case of failure by the Company to comply with the terms of this

contract relating to the filing of annual statements, the furnishing of service to applicants as herein provided, or its neglect or refusal to comply with any demand or direction of the Board or other Municipal officer, made pursuant to the terms of this contract or under the authority of any laws or ordinances now or hereafter in force in such cases and in any of these events, the Company shall, except as herein otherwise provided, pay to the City a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50) for each violation, which sum or sums may be deducted from said fund.

The procedure for the imposition and collection of the penalties in this contract shall be as follows:

The Board, on complaint made, shall give notice to the Company, directing its President, or other officer, to appear before the Board on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why the Company should not be penalized in accordance with the foregoing provisions. If the Company fails to make an appearance, or, after a hearing, appears in the judgment of the Board to be in fault, said Board shall forthwith impose the prescribed penalty, or where the amount of the penalty is not prescribed herein, such amount as appears to the Board to be just, and without legal procedure direct the Comptroller to withdraw the amount of such penalty from the security fund deposited with him. In case of any drafts made upon the security fund the Company shall, upon ten (10) days' notice pay to the City a sum sufficient to restore said security fund to the original amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and in default thereof this contract shall be canceled and annulled at the option of the Board, acting in behalf of the City. No action or proceeding or right under the provisions of this contract shall affect any other legal rights, remedies or causes of action belonging to the City.

Twenty-third—In case of any violation or breach or failure to comply with any of the provisions herein contained, or with any orders of the Board acting under the powers herein reserved, the franchise or consent herein granted may be forfeited by a suit brought by the Corporation Counsel, on notice of ten (10) days to the Company, or at the option of the Board by resolution of said Board, which said resolution may contain a provision to the effect that the wires and electrical conductors constructed and in use by virtue of this contract shall thereupon become the property of the City without proceedings at law or in equity. Provided, however, that such action by the Board shall not be taken until the Board shall give notice to the Company to appear before it on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why such resolution declaring the contract forfeited should not be adopted. In case the Company fails to appear, action may be taken by the Board forthwith.

Twenty-fourth—The words "notice" or "direction" wherever used in this contract shall be deemed to mean a written notice or direction. Every such notice or direction to be served upon the Company shall be delivered at such office in the City as shall have been designated by the Company, or if no such office shall have been designated, or if such designation shall have for any reason become inoperative, shall be mailed in the City, postage prepaid, addressed to the Company at the City. Delivery or mailing of such notice or direction as and when above provided shall be equivalent to direct personal notice or direction, and shall be deemed to have been given at the time of delivery or mailing.

Twenty-fifth—If at any time the powers of the Board or any other of the authorities herein mentioned or intended to be mentioned, shall be transferred by law to any other board, authority, officer or officers, then and in such case such other board, authority, officer or officers, shall have all the powers, rights and duties herein reserved to or prescribed for the Board or other authorities, officer or officers.

Section 3. Nothing in this contract shall be construed as in any way limiting the present or future jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission under the Laws of the State of New York.

Section 4. The Company promises, covenants and agrees on its part and behalf to conform to, and abide by and perform all the terms, conditions and requirements in this contract fixed and contained.

Section No. 9—Begins at a point about 50 feet north of the centre line of East 67th street and extends thence under Lexington Avenue to a point about 70 feet south of the centre line of East 79th street; with a station at East 68th and East 69th streets and a station at East 77th street.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the contractor.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and it is further

Resolved, That, while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioner of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

## NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department, and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a Department, chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
