Chief Lojan has served as a District Superintendent for two Manhattan garages, managing and supervising the garage, including organizing snow removal operations in high traffic areas and coordinating special event clean-ups such as parades and celebrations. Chief Lojan has also worked as a member of the Department's Field Investigation & Audit Team, and was promoted to Deputy Chief, serving in the Cleaning Operations Office and in the Operations Management Division. Most recently, he was the Queens West Borough Chief where he was responsible for overseeing the daily cleaning, collection and snow removal operations for all districts in Western Queens.
