

PUBLIC NOTICE.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN, NO. 8 CITY HALL, New York, May 26, 1890.

A resolution, of which the following is a copy, was adopted by the Common Council, May 13, 1890, and was this day received from his Honor the Mayor, without his approval or objections thereto ; therefore, as provided in section 75 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, the same became adopted :

"Whereas, By authority of law, all the public offices of the city close at 12 o'clock M. every Saturday, and as Decoration Day, which occurs this year on Friday, is a legal holiday, it is believed that closing the public offices on the next day, Saturday, the 31st instant, thereby affording the employees of the city three consecutive holidays, viz.: Friday, Saturday and Sunday, May 30, 31, and June 1, will be no detriment to the public service or cause the public any inconvenience ; be it therefore

"Resolved, That all the public offices of the City of New York, not by law required to be kept open, shall be closed on Saturday, the 31st instant." F. J. TWOMEY, Clerk Common Council.

Sanitary Bureau.

There were 15,644 inspections made by the Sanitary Inspectors and the Sanitary Police for two weeks ending May 17.

There were 1,090 complaints returned by the Sanitary Inspectors and the Sanitary Police. There were 727 complaints received from citizens, and referred to the Sanitary Inspectors and Sanitary Police for investigation and report.

The 705 deaths represent a death-rate of 22.81 against 23.95 for the previous week, and 24.70

for the corresponding week of 1889. The decrease of 34 deaths was mainly due to a decrease of 10 in the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, of 11 from phthisis, and of 29 from pneumonia, partially offset by an increase of 9 deaths from diphtheria and of 11 from measles.

Diphtheria was especially prevalent in the Twelfth and Nineteenth Wards, and measles in the Sixth, Twelfth and Nineteenth Wards.

The 739 deaths represent a death-rate of 23.92, against 24.00 for the previous week, and 25.98 for the corresponding week of 1889.

The number of deaths were only 2 less than the number in the previous week. There was a decrease, however, of 6 in the deaths from diphtheria, of 4 from scarlet fever, of 8 from heart diseases and of 24 from diseases of the digestive organs, with an increase of 12 in the deaths from cancer, of II from pneumonia, and of 6 from violence.

Diphtheria appears to be most prevalent in the Twelfth, Seventeenth, Eighteenth and Nineteenth Wards, and measles in the Seventeenth and Nineteenth Wards,




