Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Tuesday, December 1st, 1914.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; Messrs. Robbins, Farley, Stern and O'Keeffe. Excused—Messrs. Paulding and Sachs, Trustees, and Mr. Kingsbury, Commissioner of Public Charities.

The minutes of the meeting of November 18th, 1914, were held as read and approved.

Mr. Robbins was appointed Secretary pro tem.

Bills, amounting to \$13,478.17, were presented for approval, and forwarded to the Comptroller for payment.

Dr. George O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

I am in receipt of a request from Miss Noyes for permission to appoint Miss M. Rottman, as office assistant, from November 26th, salary to be from private sources, length of service to be indefinite. In addition to preparing the specifications for the equipment of Harlem, she will do some teaching and supervising of the wards.

In order to care for the erysipelas patients admitted to the hospital it will be necessary to combine, for the winter, two of the Genito Urinary wards, and after a careful survey of the situation it seems advisable to combine wards 11 and 10, using ward 11 for the erysipelas patients. You will recall that ward 28, the former ward for this class of cases, was taken for the drug habit patients. Your approval is requested.

The budget for 1915 contains an appropriation for six motor ambulances. As experience has demonstrated that it is inadvisable to advertise for these ambulances, it is recommended that request be made of the Committee on Public Letting of the Board of Aldermen to purchase same in the open market.

I am in receipt of a letter from the Commissioner of Public Charities for the waste bread from Bellevue to be given their Department, to be used as food for the pigs on Staten Island.

Requisitions are being submitted for the usual supply of Christmas greens, etc., and in view of the general financial condition of the department I would ask whether it is your wish that this expenditure be made as in former years or curtailed.

The transfer of a case of tuberculosis on November 19th from Harlem Hospital to the Department of Public Charities calls attention to the fact that it has not been the practice at Harlem Hospital to notify friends of patients in advance of their transfer, such notice always being sent on the day of the transfer. However, no transfers are ever made without the patient himself consenting. At Bellevue a notice is always mailed in advance, and in addition thereto the consent of the patient is obtained. A set of rules governing the whole question of transfer for the entire department is being compiled, and I hope to submit them for your approval at the next meeting.

Dr. Moorhead, Assistant Visiting Surgeon at Harlem, asks for permission to remove from the hospital some of the X-ray plates, with a view of selecting certain typical ones from which he may

publish prints in a surgical book now in course of preparation.

I am in receipt of the following communication from Mr. White, Contract Clerk and Auditor:

"It is found upon examining the appropriations for the year 1914, as of November 30th, that at least two (2), No. 2086, wearing apparel, and No. 2087, General Plant Equipment, are over-encumbered, and as no provisions have been made to secure additional funds, I beg leave to recommend that transfer be requested to be made from appropriations having unencumbered balances which can be spared, entitled and as follows: 2081, Office Equipment, \$900.00; 2082, Household Equipment, \$500.00; 2083, Medical and Surgical Equipment, \$1,500.00—\$2,900.00, to the appropriations entitled: 2086, Wearing Apparel, \$900.00; 2087, General Plant Equipment, \$2,000.00—\$2,900.00.

"The Board of Aldermen has authorized but \$76,000 of the \$91,700 Special Revenue Bonds requested for the supplies appropriations; the difference of \$15,700 is accounted for by the deductions from the estimates for the following appropriations: No. 2073, Food Supplies, \$12,500; No. 2074, Forage, \$200; No. 2075, Fuel, \$1,000, and No. 2077, Medical and Surgical Supplies, \$2,000. It will be necessary for this department to secure these funds either by transfer from some other department or another request for Special Revenue Bonds. Of course, the changed conditions of the appropriations at the present time would necessitate a slight modification of these figures."

Your authorization is requested for permission to advertise for the usual quantities of laundry, cleaning and disinfecting supplies, and wearing apparel, for the first six months of 1915.

The daily average census at the various hospitals during the month of November was as follows: Bellevue, 1,199; Gouverneur, 198; Harlem, 183; Fordham, 175.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

Permission was granted to appoint Miss M. Rottman as office assistant in the Training School.

The arrangement of the wards of Bellevue Hospital to provide for the erysipelas patients was referred to the President and General Medical Superintendent.

It was Resolved, To request the Board of Aldermen for permission to purchase in the open market without public letting the six motor ambulances provided for in the appropriation granted in the budget for 1915.

The request of the Commissioner of Public Charities for the waste bread from Bellevue was approved, provided that department comes for it.

It was Resolved, in view of the financial situation of the City in general and the Department in particular, to curtail the expenditure for the supply of Christmas greens; the amount this year not to exceed \$400 instead of \$500, the sum allowed heretofore.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to instruct the General Medical Superintendent to formulate, in addition to the rules covering transfers,

also those relating to the administration of the department.

It was moved, seconded and carried, to deny the request of Dr. Moorhead to remove X-ray plates from Harlem Hospital, but to permit him or his Assistant to make a study of these plates at the hospital.

It was moved, seconded and carried, to request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to transfer the funds within the appropriations set forth in the report of the General Medical Superintendent.

It was Resolved, Before asking for a further issue of Special Revenue Bonds, to ascertain if the other City departments have unencumbered balances in their appropriations available for transfer to the funds of this department, in order to meet the anticipated deficit, and it was further Resolved, To request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to transfer such funds.

It was moved, seconded and carried to authorize the advertisement for the usual quantities of laundry, cleaning and disinfecting supplies, and wearing apparel for the first six months of 1915.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

A list of bids opened on November 23rd by Mr. Paulding for the lighting fixtures of pavilions L and M was presented, as follows: Wahle-Phillips Company, \$3,999.95; Mitchell Vance Company, \$4,680.20; Isaac Wolsky, \$5,394.50; Edward Shroeder Lamp Works, \$5,960.00; and for the painting of pavilions L and M as follows: Interboro Decorating Co., \$3,564.00; Bernhard Brindzet Co., \$4,075.00; Neptune B. Smyth, Inc., \$4,193.00; M. C. Redlich, \$4,195.00; Bentz Cont. Company, \$4,200.00; Weinstein Brothers, \$4,275.00; Andrea Ogruhene, \$4,295.00; Schatz & Canton, \$4,495.00; William Kreisberg, \$4,500.00; Robert J. Mackay, \$4,740.00; Philip Lille, \$5,048.00; Willett & Company, \$5,665.00.

A letter, dated November 27th, relating to these bids was presented from McKim, Mead & White. On the recommendation of the architects and the Building Committee, it was

Resolved, To award the contract for the installation of the lighting fixtures of pavilions L and M to the lowest bidder, Wahle-Phillips Company, conditional upon their compliance with that section of the specifications requiring the approval of a sample of the fixtures by the Engineer of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity and the architects.

On the recommendation of the Building Committee, who had made inquiries relating to the responsibility of the lowest bidder, it was moved, seconded and carried, to award the contract for the painting of pavilions L and M to the lowest bidder, the Interboro Decorating Company.

The Conference Committee of the First Division of Bellevue Hospital recommended the appointment of Dr. Edmund R. P. Janvrin to the place of Physician to Out-Patients and Adjunct Assistant Visiting Physician. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved and Dr. Janvrin appointed accordingly.

The Conference Committee of the Fourth Division of Bellevue recommended the appointment of Dr. D. Clifford Martin and Dr. W. F. Crutchley as Assistant Physicians to Out-Patients. On motion, duly

seconded and carried, this report was approved and the appointments made accordingly.

The Conference Committee of Harlem Hospital recommended the appointment of Dr. Harry Eisberg to the House Staff to complete the unexpired term of Dr. Frederick Eastman, from September 5th, 1914, to August 1st, 1915, and the promotion of Dr. E. A. Jennings, who was appointed on October 20th, to the place of Second Junior Physician. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved.

Mr. Stern, to whom had been referred the request of the Fourth Division of Bellevue Hospital to be relieved of the care of the children's clinic in the outpatient department, on account of the difficulty in obtaining men for this place, reported that he received an application from Dr. Jerome Zuckerman for this service. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this application was referred to the Executive Committee for recommendation.

The Finance Committee, to whom had been referred the delay in payment of bills of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals, reported that on November 27th Mr. Sachs wrote to the Comptroller calling attention to this condition. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved.

Mr. Robbins of the Committee of the Month of November for Gouverneur, Mr. Stern for Harlem and Mr. Farley for Fordham stated that they had each visited the institutions during the month of November.

The President called attention to the matter of formulating rules for the entire department and the desirability for preparing a plan for assigning the administrative work to the various superintendents. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the suggestion of the President was approved and the General Medical Superintendent was instructed to comply with these recommendations.

COMMUNICATIONS.

A letter was presented from the Mayor, dated November 27th, relating to the creation of a central purchasing bureau, and requesting co-operation. The President reported that on November 30th he wrote to the Mayor, stating that this department was willing to co-operate in this work. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the action of the President was approved.

A letter, dated December 1st, 1914, was presented from Strauss Brothers, protesting against the establishment, by the City, of a central purchasing bureau for the purchase of supplies, and setting forth that the proposed plan would eliminate competition by reducing the number of bidders. This was ordered placed on file.

A letter, dated November 16th, 1914, was presented from the Department of Public Charities, setting forth the conditions on which that department will take over the new morgue. It was moved, seconded and carried, to refer this letter to the Building Committee.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital for November 28th were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the withdrawal of Dr. H. Knauss from appointment to the house staff was accepted; action was deferred on the request whether it was permissible for the physicians and surgeons of Harlem Hos-

pital to accept a fee from patients at the hospital provided, for under the Workmen's Compensation Law; the proposed reorganization of the medical service was considered, but action thereon was deferred until the next meeting, except on that section relating to the place of Visiting Laryngologist and Otolologist, which was considered in connection with a letter from Dr. Lester M. Hubby, dated November 28th. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, to change Dr. Hubby's title of "Visiting Laryngologist and Otolologist" to "Otolaryngologist to the Hospital," the service to include the Out-Patient Department, the incumbent of this position to have entire charge of all diseases of the throat, nose and ear, at the hospital and the Out-Patient service, but without seat in the Medical Board.

A letter, dated November 23rd, was presented from Jackson Brothers offering to sell the property, now occupied by a stable, at 622 and 624 Water Street, opposite Gouverneur Hospital, for the sum of \$75,000. It was moved, seconded and carried, to refer this to the Building Committee.

A communication, dated November 23rd, was presented from McKim, Mead and White, stating that the contractors completed pavilions I and K, except for a few minor items. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this matter was referred to the Building Committee for final inspection and recommendation.

A letter was presented from H. F. J. Porter, dated November 24th, requesting that provision be made in the corporate stock budget for the installation of the fire prevention work in the old buildings of Bellevue Hospital. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this communication was referred to the Finance Committee.

Two letters, dated November 20th and 25th, were presented from the J. L. Mott Iron Works, requesting the approval of the assignment by P. F. Kenny Company of all money due or to grow due under their contract with Bellevue and Allied Hospitals for the plumbing and gas fitting work of the new ward wing to Harlem Hospital. On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was

Resolved, To approve this assignment, without guarantee as to the amount and expressly subject to any claims, set off, or equity which the City of New York now has, or may hereafter have, against the moneys or any part thereof covered by said assignment.

A letter, dated November 18th, was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting certified copies of resolutions, adopted by that Board on November 13, 1914, (1) transferring \$10,000 from account G. F. M. 24 to C. B. H. 10-B for new laundry machinery at Bellevue Hospital, (2) revising salary schedules 2060, 2063 and 2064, (3) approving plans and modified specifications for alterations to Harlem Hospital, cost not to exceed \$40,500, (4) approving plans and modified specifications for alterations to the power house and ambulance station, Harlem Hospital, not to exceed \$68,000. On motion, duly seconded and carried, these resolutions were ordered placed on file, and it was

Resolved, To authorize an advertisement for bids for alterations to the main building at Harlem Hospital, and it was further

Resolved, To authorize an advertisement for bids for alterations to the power house and ambulance station of Harlem Hospital.

A communication, dated November 27th, was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting a certified copy of a resolution adopted by that Board on November 20th relating to the price to be charged for lithographed maps of the City of New York. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this was ordered placed on file.

A resolution was presented from the Board of Aldermen, adopted November 10th, 1914, approving the issue of special revenue bonds in the amount of \$76,000 to meet the deficit in the appropriations of this department. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this was ordered placed on file.

NEW BUSINESS.

The President reported that on November 26th and also on November 30th he had again requested Dr. Flexner for an outline of the proposed plan of reorganization for the medical service at Bellevue Hospital, which he has had under consideration during the past year.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was Resolved, to hold the next meeting on Tuesday, December 15th, at 3.30 p. m.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was seconded and carried.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Tuesday, December 15th, 1914.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President in the chair; Messrs. Paulding, O'Keeffe,

Stern, Sachs and Farley. Excused, Mr. Robbins, Trustee, and Mr. Kingsbury, Commissioner of Public Charities.

The minutes of the meeting of December 1st, 1914, were held as read and approved.

Bills, amounting to \$79,068.16, were approved and forwarded to the Comptroller for payment.

Dr. George O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

On December 7th, A-3, a medical ward in the new building, was placed under quarantine for five days by reason of two cases of diphtheria having developed. One of these patients had been in the hospital for a month while the second case had been in only three days, the latter having been admitted with a throat condition; a culture was taken, report being negative. A second culture was taken, being positive, and the Board of Health was immediately notified and removed both patients to the Willard Parker Hospital. Dr. Norris, Visiting Physician, saw this patient each day while in the hospital, and states he did not recognize the condition. All the patients were given antitoxin and no other case developed.

The Hospital has been asked to prepare an exhibit for the Panama Pacific Exposition, and while some preliminary work has been done, such as a model of one section of the new hospital and some pictures, suggestions for this exhibit are requested.

I am in receipt of the following communication from Mr. White, Contract Clerk and Auditor:

"I beg leave to advise you that funds have not been provided for in the budget for the year 1915 for salaries of the additional nurses required as a result of the operation of the Boylan Drug Law nor have funds been provided for the payment of invoices in favor of the Minut Hospital for the care of nurses that may become sick with diphtheria or scarlet fever during the year 1915. I therefore recommend that the Board of Estimate and Apportionment be requested to authorize in accordance with subdivision No. 7, section No. 188 of the Greater New York Charter, the issue of Special Revenue Bonds in the amount of \$9,800 for the additional nurses needed to care for the drug cases and \$5,000 for the invoices that may be rendered by the Minut Hospital."

Permission is requested to advertise for the usual quantities of Medical and Surgical Supplies, Refrigerating Supplies, General Plant Supplies, Household Equipment, Wearing Apparel and General Plant Materials required for the first six months of the year 1915.

Presented herewith are rules formulated to govern the transfer of patients to hospitals outside of the department.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

It was Resolved, To request the Executive Committee of the Medical Board to formulate rules for the guidance of the house staff, in order that cultures may be taken from suspicious cases immediately upon admission to the hospital and the prompt isolation of such patients.

It was suggested that the department exhibit, in addition to pictures and the model of one section of the new hospital, charts representing costs of administration, results of treatment, diseases, nationalities of patients and other information showing the activities of the hospital, and if possible models of the interior as well as the exterior of the buildings.

It was Resolved, To request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to authorize, in accordance with subdivision 7 of section 188 of the Greater New York Charter, the issue of special revenue bonds in the amount of \$14,800 recommended in the General Medical Superintendent's report.

The advertisement for the supplies requested in the General Medical Superintendent's report for the first six months of 1915 was authorized.

Action on the rules presented was deferred until the next meeting.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

Mr. O'Keeffe submitted a list of bids received on December 4th for:

1. Alterations to the main building of Harlem Hospital: (a) Construction. (b) Heating and ventilating work. (c) Plumbing and gas fitting.

2. Alterations to the power house and ambulance station, Harlem Hospital: (a) Construction. (b) Heating and ventilating work. (c) Plumbing and gas fitting.

3. Fuel Supplies of Fordham Hospital. Mr. O'Keeffe reported that the bids were opened in the presence of the bidders, a representative from the Comptroller's office and several clerks of the department.

A letter dated December 14th was presented from J. H. Freedlander, the architect, relative to the proposals for the building matter. On motion, duly seconded

and carried, the bids presented on the building matters were referred to the Building Committee for recommendation and report.

The Committee on Supplies recommended the award of the contract for fuel supplies for Fordham Hospital to the lowest bidder. After consideration, on motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved.

The Committee on Supplies reported that the Board of Estimate on December 11th concurred in the action of the Board of Aldermen in the authorization of special revenue bonds amounting to \$76,000, and that in view of funds becoming available, awards could be made to the bidders on Food Supplies, Forage, Fuel, X-ray Plates received on October 14th and November 6th, and recommended that the awards be made to the lowest bidders. The report of the Committee on Supplies was approved and its recommendations adopted.

The Finance Committee reported on the responsibility of some of the lowest bidders on the furnishings for pavilions I, K, L and M. Letters dated November 16th and December 14th relating to these bids were presented from the Contract Clerk. After consideration, it was moved, seconded and carried, to make awards to the low bidder on all classes and lines except classes 2 and 3 and lines 525, 526 and 532, which were rejected and ordered re-advertised in such form that bids may be received on separate line items. On further consideration, it was moved, seconded and carried, to award the contract to the lowest bidder on class 101, in accordance with the resolutions of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of December 4th, in approving these specifications.

The Finance Committee reported that in accordance with the resolution of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, adopted on October 30th, 1914, they have reviewed the corporate stock requirements of the department for the year ending October 31st, 1915, and presented a statement showing the amount required. In connection with the Corporate Stock Budget the Building Committee recommended the adoption of the suggestion made by McKim, Mead and White in their communications of November 12th and 24th, that the shell of pavilions F and G be constructed first, estimated cost of which would be \$800,000, and the interior finish be deferred until more funds can be obtained at a future date. After consideration, on motion duly seconded and carried, it was resolved to approve the recommendation of the Finance and Building Committees, and it was further resolved to request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for an issue of corporate stock in the amount of \$1,852,000 in accordance with the following schedules: Very urgent: Furnishings new ward wing Harlem Hospital, \$25,000. Urgent: Construction of pavilions F and G, \$800,000; Additional wing of Training School, \$200,000. Necessary: Additional wing of Fordham Hospital, \$260,000. Desirable: Nurses residence, Gouverneur, \$150,000; Power Plant at Bellevue Hospital, \$200,000; Proper fire protection at Bellevue, \$17,000.

The Chairman of the Building Committee reported that he had made arrangements with the Department of Public Charities in regard to the conditions on which that department will take over the new morgue on January 1st, 1915, and read a letter he had drafted, setting forth the incidental details necessary for a proper understanding between the Department of Public Charities and Bellevue and Allied Hospitals. After discussion, on motion, duly seconded, it was resolved to approve the arrangement made by the Building Committee with the Department of Public Charities.

The Chairman of the Building Committee further reported that he had conferred with the Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Wright, of the Department of Public Charities relative to the removal of the old morgue from in front of pavilions A and B and reported that the Department of Public Charities agreed to remove this structure as soon as feasible, but that it will be necessary for them to use it for some time for their general drug department. On motion, duly seconded, the report of the Committee was approved.

The Chairman of the Building Committee reported that an additional letter was received from McKim, Mead and White, under date of December 3rd, relative to

the extra work done by Pierson and Goodrich on the dumbwaiters in pavilions A and B, and recommended that a copy of this communication be attached to the voucher when transmitted to the Finance Department. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this was approved.

Mr. Paulding reported that on December 10th he had met with Mr. McGinley and Doctor Bland of the office of the Commissioners of Accounts, and Mr. Viertel, one of the editors of the City Record, at their request, to review the three quarterly reports for the first nine months of this year, and that they had suggested, for the purpose of economy, the elimination of the statistical tables in the report because most of this information is contained in the annual reports, and also confining the reading matter to accomplished facts. After discussion, on motion, duly seconded and carried, it was moved to approve these changes in the quarterly reports.

The President reported that he had considered the credentials and personally interviewed the candidates for places at Bellevue Hospital to become vacant on January 1st and recommend their appointment. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved and Dr. George H. Day was appointed Resident Physician and Dr. Frederick C. Freed as Assistant Resident Physician to the School for Midwives; Dr. Royal A. Schaaf was appointed Admitting Physician to Bellevue Hospital and Dr. Patrick M. Howard was appointed to the maternity service, beginning January 1st, 1915.

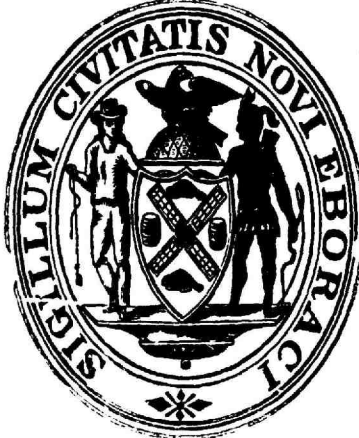

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, Chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately.

The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures. Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
