The 854 deaths represent a death-rate of 24.48, against 25.73 for the previous week, and 24.20 for the corresponding week of 1891.

The decrease of 43 deaths was mainly due to a decrease of 11 in the deaths from cancer, of 9 from phthisis, and 9 from heart diseases, of 40 from pneumonia, and of 7 from Bright's disease, partly offset by an increase of 15 in the deaths from diphtheria and 12 from bronchitis.

The deaths from diphtheria were most numerous in the Twelfth Ward, and from measles and scarlet fever in the Twenty-second Ward.
