








Annual Blessing the of the Rides

On April 10th, Brooklyn Division 5 CERT provided support to the NYPD 60th Precinct with crowd management during the annual blessing of the rides at Deno's Wonder Wheel in Coney Island. The blessing of the rides is a famous family tradition that is followed by the opening of the rides at Deno's Wonder Wheel Amusement Park. The event is held at West 12th Street on the Boardwalk and includes the FDNY color guard and speeches from several politicians, including the Mayor, US Senator, and City Council representatives. It culminates with a blessing from the religious leader of CI Salt and Sea Mission and an official ribbon-cutting by the Vouderis family (owners of the park), and noted guests.




