NEW YORK, January, 1883.

Hon. GEORGE P. ANDREWS, Counsel to the Corporation:

SIR—On May 8th, 1882, your predecessor filed with the Finance Department a certificate to the effect that, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 334, section 12, Laws of 1867, he had that day appointed myself to receive the books and papers relating to all pending business of the Attorney for the Collection of Personal Taxes, and to take charge of all the uncompleted business of that office, and of all such cases as might thereafter arise and be referred to me by the Receiver of Taxes. On January 12th, 1883, I turned over to Mr. Charles S. Beardsley, the recently appointed Attorney for the Collection of the Arrears of Personal Taxes, the books and papers received by me under the said certificate.

My functions in connection with that business being thus terminated, I beg leave to present to you my report of the work done during that period.

At the time I was placed in charge of this business it was understood between your predecessor and myself that, although he held me responsible personally for its proper administration, the work of transacting it might be shared with the other Assistants, who are immediately associated with me in the attorney work of this office; and these gentlemen have, equally with myself, given such time as could be spared from the regular work of this Department to the discharge of these new and additional duties.

In the performance of this work the administration of the affairs of the Bureau was thoroughly re-organized. There was prepared a complete set of new forms, under the Act of 1843, which have so far stood the test of adverse criticism in court. Upon application to the Judges holding special terms, a particular day in each week was set apart for the hearing of these proceedings. Many questions arising as to the law and practice in these cases have also been settled by decisions of the Courts, and these decisions reported in the *Daily Register* and elsewhere, thus insuring in the future a more uniform and systematic disposition of the business connected with the Bureau.

There had been transmitted to me from the Receiver of Taxes lists containing the names (exclusive of bank shareholders) of 1722 delinquents of 1881. These will be found fully accounted for in this report and the accompanying schedules. I also received from the Commissioners of Accounts (who, at the time of my appointment, had the custody of the papers of the late Attorney) the papers in many proceedings brought to enforce the collection of taxes of earlier years.

The first tax collected by me was received May 24, 1882; the last, January 12, 1883.

The total collections, including interest, amount to:

Arrears of years prior to 1881.....	\$17,549 11
Arrears of 1881.....	18,977 36

Total return to the Receiver of Taxes..... \$36,526 47

The details of these collections are set forth in Schedule "A," hereto annexed:

Besides the collections for 1881, the other delinquents of that year returned to me by the Receiver of Taxes are thus accounted for.

In 556 cases proceedings under the Act of 1843 were begun, and affidavits being presented on behalf of the delinquents, the Court dismissed the proceedings—either because satisfactory proof of inability to pay was produced, or because the tax was laid without jurisdiction (by reason of non-residence, etc., etc.). These cases are enumerated in Schedule "B."

The pressure of the regular business of this Department being such as to make it desirable to avoid, as much as possible, the loss of time consequent upon beginning useless proceedings, no orders to show cause were obtained against the persons enumerated in Schedule "C." The reasons for this non-action were communicated to the Receiver of Taxes from time to time, and were these: In some instances the parties appeared in 1882 before the Tax Commissioners, and the examinations then had as to their financial condition revealed such an utter inability to pay the tax that there seemed no doubt the only result of commencing proceedings would be the obtaining of orders dismissing such proceedings. In other instances the postal officials, the person employed by the Tax Commissioners to serve notices of assessment, and the Marshal had all returned the delinquents as "not found;" it seemed, therefore, useless to make a further attempt to find them. In other instances the tax was laid on an "estate," or a "firm," instead of on the executors or partners, and in other instances, where laid on a foreign firm; no assets or partners could be found here. It was my intention, had the business remained in my hands, to revise the list of those "not found," and in all cases where I might discover that the delinquents could be served here, and possessed means, to commence proceedings to collect.

Schedule "D" contains a list of delinquents against whom proceedings were begun, but who could not be found by the persons employed to serve the orders to show cause.

Schedule "E" contains a list of delinquents against whom proceedings were begun and defaults noted, but who have not yet paid up, although notices stating that a warrant of commitment would be applied for have been sent them.

Schedule "F" contains a list of those delinquents returned to me by the Receiver, not included in the foregoing schedules, and whose cases are yet undisposed of, with a brief statement of the present condition of the proceedings against them.

All the unfinished business of the year 1881 has been turned over to Mr. Beardsley, except the cases of F. A. Palmer, Jane Redfield and J. H. Lyddy, the control of which has been assumed by the Counsel to the Corporation, and the cases of the various bank shareholders now in process of adjustment between the Counsel to the Corporation and the representatives of the banks.

Besides thus disposing of the arrears of 1881, efforts were made to dispose of the large mass of unfinished business accumulated from earlier years. In addition to the collections on account of taxes of these years which are included in Schedule "A," several hundred proceedings have been commenced to enforce payment against the delinquents. In 275 of these the Court, upon affidavits of inability to pay, or for other reasons, made orders dismissing the proceedings. These cases are included in Schedule "G." The other proceedings which have been begun to enforce collections of earlier years have been transferred to Mr. Beardsley, and as they are not yet finished, I have not enumerated them on any schedule.

The moneys collected by me from time to time have been deposited (until monthly return day) in the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company, to the credit of Arrears of Personal Taxes. Believing at the time of opening the account that the collections might be large, I arranged with the Company for the payment of interest on daily balances at the rate of two and one-half per cent. The accumulations of this interest aggregated only the sum of \$45.56, which, in accordance with your instructions, I have transmitted to the Comptroller, to be passed to the credit of the General Fund.

Fifty-fifth street paving, between Sixth and Seventh avenues.

Seventy-fifth street paving, between Third and Fourth avenues.

Eighty-third street paving, between Eighth avenue and Boulevard.

Ninety-fourth street paving, between Third and Lexington avenues.

One Hundred and Twelfth street paving, between Third and Fourth avenues.

Seventeenth street regulating, grading, etc., between Eighth and Tenth avenues.

First avenue sewer, between Twenty-first and Twenty-fourth streets.

Fourth avenue sewer, east side, between Thirty-fifth and Thirty-sixth streets.

Fourth avenue sewer, west side, between One Hundred and Eighth and One Hundred and Tenth streets.

Twenty-third street sewer, between Eleventh and Thirteenth avenues.

Eighty-seventh street sewer, between Ninth and Tenth avenues.

Ninety-sixth and Ninety-seventh street sewers, between Third and Lexington avenues.

One Hundred and Nineteenth street sewer, between Sixth avenue and summit east of Sixth avenue.

One Hundred and Twenty-third street sewer, between Fourth and Madison avenues.

One Hundred and Fifty-third street sewer, between Tenth avenue and St. Nicholas avenue.

Montgomery street sewer, between Madison and Monroe streets.

St. Nicholas avenue tree-planting, between One Hundred and Tenth and One Hundred and Fifteenth streets.

Willis avenue crosswalks, between One Hundred and Thirty-eighth and One Hundred and Thirty-ninth streets.

Avenue D flagging, east side, between Thirteenth and Fourteenth streets.

Section 5 of the said act provides that, "If any such assessment shall remain unpaid for the period of sixty days after the date of entry thereof in the said record of titles of assessments, it shall be the duty of the officer authorized to collect and receive the amount of such assessment, to charge, collect, and receive legal interest thereon at the rate of seven per centum per annum, to be calculated from the date of such entry to the date of payment."

The above assessments are payable to the Collector of Assessments and Clerk of Arrears, at the "Bureau for the Collection of Assessments, and of Arrears of Taxes and Assessments, and of Water Rents," from 9 A. M. until 2 P. M., and all payments made thereon, on or before January 12, 1883, will be exempt from interest as above provided, and after that date will be subject to a charge of interest at the rate of seven per centum per annum from the date of entry in the Record of Titles of Assessments in said Bureau.
