Two-story nonfireproof building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm; occupancy, 7; above 1st floor, none regularly, 1 occasionally; exits, two perfect fire escapes on the west side, with fireproof openings 31 inches by 6 feet 8 inches; exits remote; an imperfect horizontal exit on each floor. Fire escapes were accepted as exits from this building on variation of Dec. 20, 1916; variation requires opening in fire wall to conform to 79-49; fire doors provided on one side of opening, and sills not fireproofed; variation also called for trapdoors at each floor of elevator shaft; these have been provided, but on 1st floor do not close properly. Two-story fireproof building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; open lot; sprinkler; combustibles carried; imperfect fire alarm system installed; occupancy, 25; above 1st floor, 13. There are two fireproof enclosed stairways from 1st to 2d floors; main entrance in centre of building; doors through fire wall at east and west ends of 1st floor, leading to factory proper; no factory employees in building; sliding fireproof doors with fusible links on factory sides, swinging nonfireproof doors on office side of horizontal exits; exits remote; no safe egress from roof.

Recommendation: Waive the order for exits conforming to Section 79-a while building is used for office purposes only.

Ide & Co. 3—Fusible link for fireproof windows on course of fire escape. 4—Fireproof doors on each side of horizontal exits all floors. 5—Remove piping obstructing hinged fire door at horizontal exit. 6—Fireproof sills and frames of fire wall openings. Three-story nonfireproof building; no sprinkler; combustibles; fire alarm signal system; occupancy, 65; above 1st floor, 64; above 2d floor, 52; exits, one interior stairway with self-closing doors opening outwardly; one fire escape at east end of perfect, except that openings are not self-closing; doors to balconies are fireproof, 32 by 72 inches; exits remote; no egress from roof; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d and 3d floors leading to adjoining building, which is vacant.

Recommendation: If present fire doors to horizontal exit be made self-closing and fireproof sills and frames provided, waive order for doors on other side while factory at north remains vacant. Orders 3, 5 and 6 to be complied with.

12. Premises affected, Utica, Liberty and Washington streets; appellant, C. H. Poole. 1—Enclose stairways fire-resisting. 2—Additional exit. 3—Prohibit occupancy. Orders Oct. 20, 1917. Five-story nonfireproof building; open lot; sprinkler with two sources of water supply; occupancy, 133; above 1st floor, 79; above 2d floor, 59; occupancy at time of inspection was 153 above 1st floor, 85 above 2d floor; exits, one interior stairway from 1st to 5th floors, partly enclosed with wooden partitions, doors to stairway being directly at top of enclosure and swing inwardly; imperfect fire escape on side with nonfireproof openings; at easterly end of building, on 2d and 3d floors, are horizontal exits leading to adjoining building; at 4th floor is egress to roof of 3-story section by means of swinging door, reached from floor of mill by means of 7 wide steps; at 5th floor a swinging door leads to balcony and stairs extending to roof of 4-story building and thence to roof of 3-story building; access can be had from this roof by means of straight run fire escape, on southerly side of building or access to stairway in 3-story building, which is extended to roof with bulkhead and reached by steps referred to; horizontal exits on 2d and 3d floors lead to adjoining building, with different tenants; buildings not at same floor level; steps provided at each floor.

Recommendation: Acceptance of horizontal exits on condition that stipulations be filed by the owner, and respective tenants agreeing to maintain these horizontal exits in accordance with Section 79-f-9, and doors leading thereto to be kept open at all times when any one is employed on either side of the fire wall; stairway to roof to be available at all times when any one is working in the five-story building. Doors to roof at east end of building to be provided with panic locks only. Doors to interior stairway to be made to swing outwardly. Order for stairway enclosure to be waived.

13. Premises affected, New York City, 6 Bleeker st.; appellant, Samuel Rosenbloom. Provide a water closet for male employees on the 4th floor. (Feb. 2, 1918.) This is a four-story building. There are two men employed at fur trimmings on the 2d floor; the 3d and 4th floors are occupied by Meyer Grossman, manufacturer of caps. Four males were at work on the 4th floor, the maximum number during the year being seven. Four males and one female were at work on the 3d floor. The maximum number employed in the entire building during the year is fourteen males and two females. The only water closets in the building are two on the 2d floor. There is ample space on the 4th floor where a water closet could be installed in accordance with the rules of the Industrial Code, as employees have two flights of stairs to walk to reach said water closet. The halls and stairs and the water closets in hall were found in an unsanitary condition, and necessary orders have been issued.

Recommendation: Abeyance of order while conditions and occupancy remain as at present.

14. Premises affected, New York City, 47-49 Division st.; appellant, Samuel Rosenbloom. 5—Provide an additional water closet for male employees of Mass, Sander & Hazon, 6th floor. (March 5, 1918.) Seven-story tenant factory

building. Mass, Sander & Hazon occupy the 6th floor of 47 Division st. They employ 27 men and 7 women. There is one water closet for each sex. There are horizontal exits between 47 and 49 Division st. Goldstein & Feldman occupy the 6th floor of 49 Division st. There is one water closet in workroom for females. A dressing room is built around this closet. The males' water closet is located in hall of 49 Division st. This firm employs 17 men and 7 females. Mr. Goldstein stated he would not permit the men from the other shop to use his water closets.

Recommendation: Accept on condition that water closet in hall of 49 Division st. is always available.

15. Premises affected, Perry; appellant, Perry Knitting Company. (January 25, 1918.) 11—Provide dressing room, etc. Ninety-two females employed in the building. Work done is manufacturing yarn from raw cotton. Building is connected with office building by bridge from 2d floor, in which is located a large and elaborate dining room and is accessible to all employees in common. There is no suitable dressing or private room for females in this building. This building is on opposite side of office building from Buildings No. 4 and No. 5.

Recommendation: Accept present dressing room.

And it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in complying with the strict letter of the law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the buildings noted herein, and that in granting the variations set forth the spirit of the law will be adhered to and public safety secured; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants herein has been advised that he will be given opportunity to appear and be heard at this time and place, if he so desired, and such of the appellants who appeared having been heard by the Commission, therefore.

Be it resolved by the State Industrial Commission that the variations cited above be granted to the appellant in each case for the premises stated, during the time that conditions remain as of the date hereof.

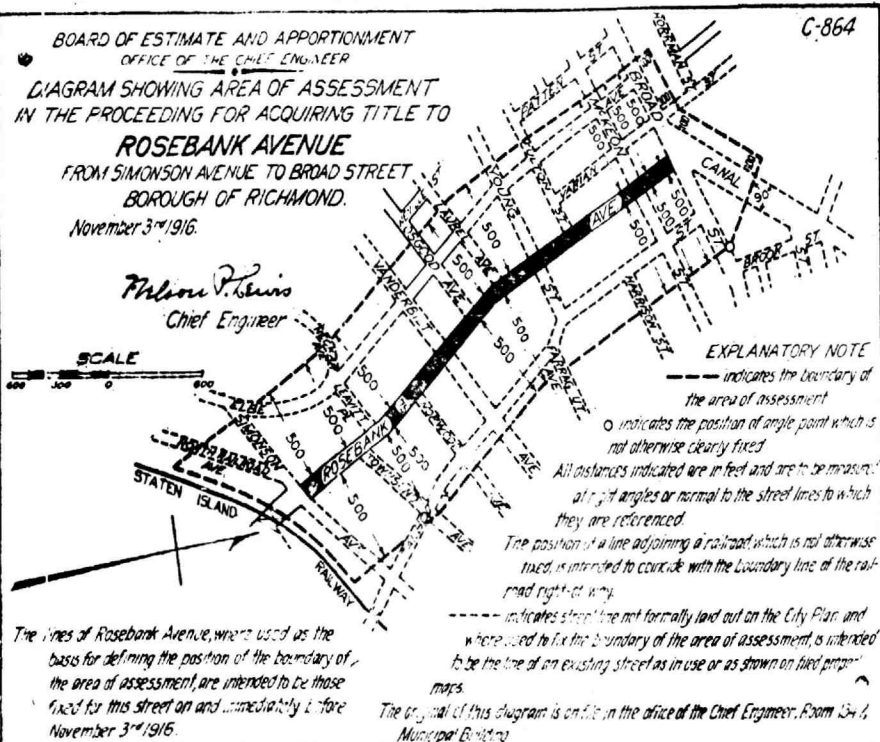

NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause to be occupied, or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant, free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations, and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from the demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level.
