On August 15, the Mayor's Fund partnered with the NYC Department of Small Business Services to host a panel discussion and tour in Red Hook, Brooklyn, highlighting partnerships and ongoing Hurricane Sandy recovery efforts in this dynamic neighborhood. The evening began at Liberty Warehouse on Pier 41 where guests engaged with panelists from Good Shepherd Services, the Southwest Brooklyn Industrial Development Corporation, and the Red Hook Initiative, who shared their on-the-

ground experiences supporting the community in the aftermath of the hurricane and continuing restoration efforts today. The group then enjoyed a tour of the Red Hook Winery and Flickinger Glassworks to hear each business owner's recovery story first-hand.

Housing Donors Collaborative Provides Grant Funding to Aid Long-Term Storm Recovery

The Mayor's Fund partnered with the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development to establish the NYC Housing and Neighborhood Recovery Donors Collaborative, a consortium of 16 foundations and financial institutions that came together to support the recovery and future of neighborhoods affected by Hurricane Sandy. Collectively, participating members are providing more than \$2.6 million in private funding with an additional \$637,500 granted by the Mayor's Fund to create a total of over \$3.2 million in grants focusing on rebuilding in heavily impacted communities as well as City planning efforts. Thank you to all the Collaborative members for their commitment to strengthening the resiliency of families and neighborhoods affected by the storm.

Spaceworks Opens Affordable Workspace for Artists in Long Island

On August 20, Mayor Bloomberg cut the ribbon on the first pilot site for Spaceworks, created to develop longterm, affordable rehearsal and visual art studios citywide. The new facility in Long Island City is the first of five sites currently in development that will create approximately 30,000 square feet of affordable workspace for New York City artists over the next two years. All artists living in New York City are eligible to apply for studio space, and

performing artists can apply for a Spaceworks Card to reserve hourly rentals at the new Spaceworks Performing Arts Facility. Funding for the development of Spaceworks facilities was provided through a public-private partnership incubated with the Mayor's Fund, now managed by the independent Spaceworks organization.

Save the Date: MillionTreesNYC Fall Planting October 19, 2013



Saturday, October 19 marks the next seasonal volunteer planting event with MillionTreesNYC! Trees will be planted in Rockaway Community Park, bringing New York closer to the goal of planting one million new trees by 2017. With more than 757,000 trees planted to date, we have 243,000 to go. Registration for the planting will begin in mid-September.

This past spring, MillionTreesNYC held one of its largest and most successful planting events to date. During the weekend of April 27, 20,000 trees were planted at eight parkland sites citywide. Spring 2013 also marked a partnership with the New York Knicks in which one tree was planted at Van Cortlandt Park for each three-point shot made during any Knicks 2013 home game. Over 1,000 trees were planted thanks to the Knicks.

COMMUNITAMERICANING This summer, the Mayor's Fund continued to work with the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs (MOIA) to support a variety of immigrant-focused initiatives that help provide common access points into the City's civic, economic, and political spheres. In April, mayors and senior representatives from over twenty U.S. cities met at the Cities for Immigrant Integration Conference to promote the

integration of immigrants through innovative policies and programming. The Blueprints for Immigrant Integration were released at the gathering, highlighting successful practices across a variety of program and policy areas, including language access, police and community engagement, economic development and entrepreneurship, civic engagement, and citizenship.

The Mayor's Fund is also continuing to work closely with MOIA on Hurricane Sandy recovery services, including outreach to limited-English proficient households in affected areas as well as free legal services for immigrant families.


Did you Know?
