

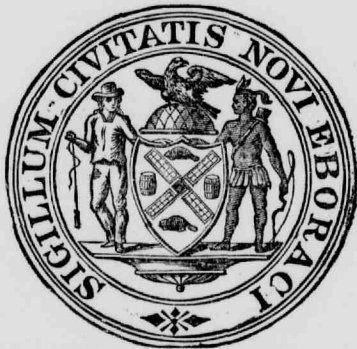

The minutes of the meeting held December 31, 1891, were read and approved.

William P. Frazee and others, representing various commercial interests doing business in the vicinity of West Thirty-fifth street, North river, appeared and protested against assigning any portion of the Pier foot of said street for the uses and purposes of the Health Department, whereupon, On motion of Commissioner Cram, the following resolutions were adopted:

Resolved, That the resolution dated December 10, 1891, assigning the outer two hundred and fifty feet of the Pier foot of West Thirty-fifth street, North river, to the Health Department for the uses and purposes of the offal contractor, together with the permits issued for the erection of sheds, fences, and also for the running of water-pipe, in connection with said privilege, be and the same are hereby rescinded and annulled.

Resolved, That the outer two hundred and fifty feet of Pier, new 60, foot of West Thirtieth street, North river, be and the same is hereby assigned to the Health Department during the pleasure of the Board, for the uses and purposes of the offal contractor, to take effect May 1, 1892, subject to approval by the Health Department.

The following communication was received, read and,

Upon motion, tabled:

From S. D. Coykendall, on behalf of the "Merchants and Tanners' Line"—Requesting that a berth be assigned the said company for their canal-boats, somewhere on the North river below Canal street, and at a rate not to exceed \$150 per month.

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, viz.:

From the Counsel to the Corporation:

1st. In reference to and requesting to be informed whether Ehrenreich Brothers have executed the lease prepared by him for certain land under water between Sixty-second and Sixty-third streets, East river. The action of the President in replying thereto approved.

2d. Approving specifications and form of contract for dredging at West Washington Market Section, under Contract No. 406.

3d. Suggesting that the Department procure copies of all bills introduced in the ensuing session of the Legislature through the same medium as employed by the Law Department. The Secretary directed to notify Mr. Blandy that on the 17th ultimo the Department entered into a satisfactory arrangement for its usual supply of legislative documents.

From the Finance Department:

1st. Transmitting certified copy of the preamble and resolution adopted by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, December 16, 1891, approving the change of lines of Pier, new 52, at the foot of West Twenty-second street.

On motion, the plan was ordered to be placed on file, and the Secretary directed to enter the preambles and resolution in full on the minutes, as follows:

"Whereas, The Board of Docks, at its meeting of November 19, 1891, adopted a resolution advising the change of the location of Pier, new 52, at the foot of West Twenty-second street, North river, from the location therefor as laid down on the plans determined by the Board of Docks on April 13, 1870, and adopted and certified to by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on April 27, 1871, and requesting the consent and approval of this Board to the change; and

"Whereas, The change recommended is: The northerly line extended of Pier, new 52, to be in the continuation westerly of the northerly line of West Twenty-second street; the southerly line of Pier, new 52, to be in the westerly prolongation of the southerly side of West Twenty-second street, and to be parallel to and distant sixty feet southerly from the northerly line of said Pier, new 52, and the side lines of Pier, new 52, to form an angle with the established bulkhead-line of seventy-seven degrees five minutes forty-two seconds on the northerly side of said lines. The length of said Pier, new 52, to be 452.64 feet on the northerly side and 440.95 feet on the southerly side thereof, extending from the bulkhead-line established in 1871 to the pier-head line determined by the Department of Docks, July 3, 1890, and approved by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund July 24, 1890. The width of said Pier, new 52, to be 60 feet instead of 40 feet as on the aforesaid map or plan of 1871, all of which is shown on the plan submitted herewith in duplicate by the Engineer-in-Chief; therefore

"Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby consent to and approve of the change in length, width and location of the new Pier at the foot of West Twenty-second street, North river, to be known as Pier, new 52, from the lines and location therefor as laid down on the plans determined by the Board of Docks, April 13, 1871, and adopted and certified to by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on April 27, 1871, which new location is shown on a map or plan herewith attached, and designated in red lines on said map."

2d. Returning at the request of Commissioner Cram, for the further consideration of the Board, the resolutions adopted December 3, 1891, for the change of lines of Pier, new 13, North river.

3d. In reference to and requesting information respecting the claim of Henry W. Sage, Francis E. Grant et al. for damages, etc., and for a determination as to their rights in certain lands under water and along the bulkhead and pier lines at East Ninety-fourth and Ninety-fifth streets and First avenue. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to furnish the information.

4th. Requesting a list of all the real estate in the possession of the Department and the purpose for which it is occupied. The action of the President in replying thereto approved.

From the Department of Public Works—Reporting that the work of dredging at One Hundred and Second street, East river, is liable to endanger the safety of the "Dog Pound," and requesting that steps be immediately taken to prevent the said structure from falling into the river. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to examine and, if necessary, repair.

From Dock Master Woods:

1st. Reporting a hole in the pavement foot of Desbrosses street, North river, which requires immediate repairs. Notify the occupant of said premises to repair.

2d. Reporting that he removed the lighter "Thomas Nelson," which obstructed the slip at Pier, old 29, North river, to the foot of West Forty-fourth street.

3d. Reporting that two fender-chocks on the north side of Pier, new 25, North river, require repairing. Notify the lessee to repair.

4th. Respecting the occupation of certain space on the bulkhead between Piers, old 20 and 21, North river, by the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company. The Secretary requested to direct the Dock Master to notify the said company that they will not be permitted to use any portion of this bulkhead.

From Dock Master Walsh—Reporting a hole in the pavement at the approach to the Pier foot of Seventy-ninth street, North river, which requires immediate repairs. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to examine and, if necessary, repair.

From Dock Master Ryan:

1st. Report for the week ending January 2, 1892.

2d. Recommending that he be directed to have Room No. 4, Pier "A," repaired, painted and put in order. Recommendation adopted.

3d. Submitting the following unanimous resolution for adoption by the Board:

Resolved, That the Engineer-in-Chief be and hereby is directed to proceed with the removal of all structures and material necessary for the execution of the "New Plan" for the improvement of the water-front of 1871, in front of the wall between Pier, new 21, and Pier, new 23, on the North river; and that all the work hereby ordered be performed otherwise than by contract, as provided by section 714 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882; and that it be done by the force of the Department by day's work, except so much of the labor as is now or may hereafter be contracted for, and that all the material and dredging necessary for the above-mentioned work not heretofore contracted for, or which may not hereafter be contracted for, be purchased by the Treasurer otherwise than by contract.

President Post offered as an amendment to the above resolution, that the said work shall not be commenced until the bulkhead opposite to which the wall is to be built comes into the legal possession of the City.

Which was lost by the following vote:

Affirmative—President Post.

Negative—Commissioner Cram.

Phelan.

The original resolution, which required a unanimous vote, was declared lost, President Post voting in the negative.

4th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 11614, as to the advisability of repairing the Pier foot of East Thirty-third street, East river, or the propriety of building a new pier thereat.

On motion of Commissioner Cram, the Engineer-in-Chief was directed to prepare plans, specifications and form of contract for the construction of a new pier.

5th. Reports on Secretary's Orders Nos. 11633, 11606 and 11610, submitting specifications and form of contract for dredging at the Piers foot of West Eighteenth, Twenty-first and Forty-eighth streets, North river.

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the specifications and form of contract, as prepared and submitted by the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, for dredging in the half slips adjoining the Piers foot of West Eighteenth, Twenty-first and Forty-eighth streets, North river, be and they hereby are approved, subject to the approval of the Counsel to the Corporation as to form, and the Secretary be and hereby is directed to have a sufficient number of blank forms of proposals printed, and proper advertisements inviting estimates for doing the said dredging inserted in the various newspapers designated by law.

6th. Partial report on Secretary's Order No. 11590, as to the dredging required at the various dumping-boards of the Department of Street Cleaning. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to make requisition for said dredging.

7th. Report on Secretary's Orders Nos. 11061, 11194, 11415, 11495, 11539, 11559, 11553, 11574, 11578 and 11584, that he had fastened spring piles at Pier, old 58, North river, and superintended berthing the fire-boat "Zophar Mills" thereat; returning order to erect derricks on Pier 44, East river; superintended repairing bulkhead, etc., at Pier, old 1, North river; repaired sheathing on deck of Pier at One Hundred and Fifty-second street, North river; superintended repairing bulkhead platform between Little West Twelfth and Thirteenth streets, North river; repairing sheathing on deck of Pier 4, East river; repaired bulkhead foot of One Hundred and Seventh street, Harlem river, and sheathing on deck of Pier foot of Nineteenth street, North river, and superintended driving piles at Pier, old 29, North river.

Commissioner Cram moved that Rule No. 8, as amended December 17, 1891, be further amended so as to read as follows:

Rule 8. No vessel of any kind shall be loaded or discharged by horse power on the North river, between Pier "A" and West Eleventh street, and on the East river, from the Battery to Grand street. No vessel of any kind shall be loaded or discharged elsewhere by horse power, or shall stones or similar cargo be discharged from any vessel upon any other pier, bulkhead or wharf structure, unless proper planking be provided to protect the surface of such pier, bulkhead or wharf structure from injury consequent upon the travel of the horse, or the unloading of stones or similar cargo thereupon, under a penalty of ten dollars a day for each horse so employed, and of twenty-five dollars for each offense of discharging such stones or like cargo, upon such pier, bulkhead or wharf structure, to be recovered from the owner, consignee, master or stevedore, of any such vessel, severally and respectively; and if such penalty be recovered for using horses, or discharging stones or similar cargo upon wharf property belonging to the Corporation, under lease, it shall be paid to the lessee thereof, but if such penalty be recovered for using horses, or discharging stones or similar cargo, upon wharf property not owned by the Corporation, it shall be paid to the owner thereof.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—Commissioner Cram.

Phelan.

President Post not voting.

On motion, the Secretary was directed to cause said rule, as amended, to be published for ten days in the CITY RECORD, and other newspapers designated by law.

On motion of Commissioner Cram, the Engineer-in-Chief was directed to confer with the Com-

missioner of Street Cleaning, respecting the proposed removal of the dumping-board from Pier, old 42, North river, and report to the Board at its next meeting what arrangements he has been able to make.

The Treasurer, to whom was referred on the 31st ultimo, the communication from John R. Dos Passos, attorney for the Hudson Tunnel Railway Company, stated that he had written to the said attorney that his guarantee to pay the arrears of rent due the City by said company on or before February 15, 1892, was satisfactory; but unless the said payment was made by that date their permit will be revoked and their structures removed.

On motion of President Post, the Secretary was directed to accept W. W. Rossiter and the Terminal Warehouse Company as sureties on the lease of Barent H. Lane, of Pier, new 57, North river.

On motion of President Post, the Secretary was directed to accept the New York, Lake Erie and Western Dock and Improvement Company as sole surety on the lease to the New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad Company, of the Pier foot of West Forty-ninth street, North river.

On motion of Commissioner Cram, the following resolution was unanimously adopted by the affirmative votes of President Post and Commissioners Cram and Phelan:

Resolved, That the Engineer-in-Chief be and hereby is directed to build a new twelve-ton derrick for the work of construction under the "New Plan," similar to the twelve-ton derricks already built and owned by the Department, with the necessary engines, pumps and machinery; and that all the work hereby ordered be performed otherwise than by contract, as provided by section 714 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882; and that it be done by day's work by the force of the Department; and that all the materials, tools, etc., necessary for the same not now contracted for, or which may not hereafter be contracted for, be purchased by the Treasurer otherwise than by contract.

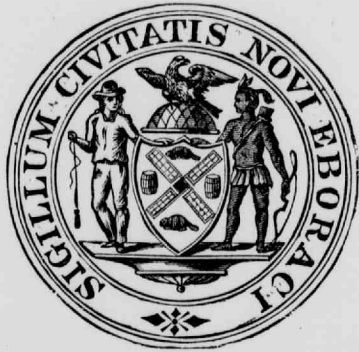
