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Service Change for Queens Community Board 10 Residents Living in Ozone Park, South Ozone Park and Howard Beach

The New York City Department of Sanitation is announcing a service change for residents living in Queens Community Board 10, which includes Ozone Park, South Ozone Park and Howard Beach.



Starting Monday, July 2, 2018, the Department will collect organic material once per week, on recycling day. The change will allow the Department to become more efficient with curbside bulk item collection.

Trash collection will not change.

Residents needing curbside collection of their large, bulky items can make an appointment at nyc.gov/bulk or by calling 311.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 693 salt/sand spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
