4. Eighty-third street sewer, between Boulevard and West End avenue.
5. Fifty-ninth street sewer, between Eighth avenue and end of present sewer east of Eighth avenue.
6. One Hundred and Forty-first street regulating and grading, curbing and flagging, from Tenth avenue to Diagonal avenue.

The foregoing assessment lists being in proper form, and no objections having been filed, on motion, they were severally confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the following assessment lists received from the Board of Assessors under date of February 3, 1886, viz.:

1. Eleventh avenue sewer, east side, between One Hundred and Fifty-seventh and One Hundred and Fifty-ninth streets, with branch in One Hundred and Fifty-ninth street, between Tenth and Eleventh avenues.
2. One Hundred and Forty-fifth street sewer, between North Third and College avenues.
3. One Hundred and Forty-fourth street sewer, between North Third and College avenues.

The foregoing assessment lists being in proper form and no objections having been filed, on motion, they were severally confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the following assessment lists received from the Board of Assessors under date of February 18, 1886, viz.:

1. Sewers in One Hundred and Twelfth, One Hundred and Thirteenth and One Hundred and Fourteenth streets, between Eighth avenue and new avenue west of Eighth avenue, and additional receiving basins and culverts, between New avenue and Morningside Park.
2. Sewers in One Hundred and Twentieth and One Hundred and Twenty-first streets, between Seventh avenue and Avenue St. Nicholas.
3. Sewer in Ninth avenue, west side, between Eighty-sixth and Ninety-second streets.
4. Sewer in One Hundred and Forty-fifth street, north side, between Avenue St. Nicholas and Tenth avenue, and in Tenth avenue, east side, between One Hundred and Forty-fifth and One Hundred and Forty-sixth streets.

The foregoing assessment lists being in proper form and no objections having been filed, on motion, they were severally confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the assessment list for sewer in One Hundred and Forty-fourth street, between College avenue and One Hundred and Forty-third street, received from the Board of Assessors under date of February 25, 1886.

The said list being in proper form and no objections having been filed, on motion, the same was confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the following assessment lists received from the Board of Assessors under date of March 4, 1886, viz.:

1. Sewer in New avenue, (between Eighth and Ninth avenues) between One Hundred and Fourth streets.
2. Sewer in Eighty-ninth street, between Eighth and Ninth avenues.
3. Sewer in Fourth avenue, east side, between Fifty-seventh and Fifty-eighth streets.
4. Sewer in One Hundred and Fourth street, between Tenth avenue and Boulevard.

The foregoing assessment lists being in proper form and no objections having been filed, on motion, they were severally confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the assessment list for sewers in West street, between Spring street and West Eleventh street, with connections to present sewers, and alterations and improvements to existing sewers and their appurtenances in Sewerage District No. 20, with objections of Estates of E. H. Pray and J. Dean, filed by Thomas B. Smith, attorney, the same having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of January 21, 1886; also the objection, of Geo. W. Weeks, Trustee, filed with the Board of Revision, etc., on February 9, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Weeks in opposition, and Mr. Gilon, Chairman of the Board of Assessors, in explanation, no others appearing, on motion, the several objections were overruled and the assessment list was confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The Comptroller presented the assessment list for sewers in Beekman place, between Forty-ninth and Fifty-first streets, received from the Board of Assessors under date of February 18, 1886, together with objections of the Germania Life Insurance Co. and others, filed with the Board of Revision, etc., on March 3, 1886, by T. H. Baldwin, attorney.

After hearing Mr. Baldwin, on motion, the said assessment list was referred back to the Board of Assessors for further consideration, with reference to the objections filed to the apportionment of the assessment upon the block between Fifty-fifth and Fifty-sixth streets.

The assessment list for sewer in the Boulevard, between One Hundred and Fifty-fifth and One Hundred and Fifty-seventh streets, and in One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street, between the Boulevard and Tenth avenue, and objections filed, ordered to be transmitted to the Board of Assessors at meeting of December 11, 1885, with request that notice be given to the Commissioner of Public Works that the form of certificate annexed to the list is not in conformity to the statute, were presented by the Comptroller having been returned by the Board of Assessors under date of January 22, 1886, with copy of a communication from the Commissioner of Public Works relative thereto.

After consideration, it was, on motion, ordered that the said assessment list be referred back to the Board of Assessors, and that the Commissioner of Public Works be requested to confer with the Counsel to the Corporation, relative to the requirements of the law in regard to the certificate to be given for this assessment list.

The assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curb and gutter stones and flagging in Sixty-second street, from Tenth to Eleventh avenue, and objections of Wm. T. Blodgett and others, filed by Develin & Miller, attorneys, and of John J. Milhau, filed by John C. Shaw, attorney, ordered to be returned to the Board of Assessors at meeting of November 12, 1885, for information "as to the amount of the bond of the first contractor for the work, and whether any steps have been taken by the Department of Public Works to collect the same," were presented by the Comptroller, having been returned by the Board of Assessors under date of January 13, 1886, together with communications of the Department of Public Works, dated November 25, 1885, and the Law Department, dated January 5, 1886, in relation thereto.

After consideration, on motion, the several objections received were overruled and the assessment list was confirmed, all the members of the Board voting in the affirmative.

The assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curb and flagging in Ninth avenue from Eighty-first to One Hundred and Tenth street, and objections of Elliot Zborowski and others, filed by Shipman & Acker, attorneys, ordered to be referred back to the Board of Assessors at meeting of January 8, 1886, for a "re-examination with reference to Surveyor's fees, on any former work of regulating, etc., the said avenue," were presented by the Comptroller, having been returned by the Board of Assessors under date of February 3, 1886, together with copy of communications of the Commissioner of Public Works under dates of January 19 and February 1, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Shipman, on motion, the assessment list was laid over.

The Comptroller presented the assessment list for sewer in One Hundred and Forty-fourth street, between Eighth avenue and first new avenue west of Eighth avenue, and in said new avenue, between One Hundred and Forty-second and One Hundred and Forty-fifth streets, and objections of Martin & Leask and estate of Norman Peck and others, filed by T. H. Baldwin, attorney, having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of January 19 and February 1, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Baldwin in opposition to the assessment and Mr. Gilon in explanation, on motion, the assessment list and objections were ordered to be returned to the Board of Assessors for re-examination as to the apportionment of the assessment.

The assessment list for sewer in West End avenue, formerly Eleventh avenue, between Ninety-sixth and One Hundred and Fifth streets, and objections of Daniel Schoonmaker, filed by Shipman & Acker, attorneys, and of Lorenzo Power, together with copy of a communication of the Commissioner of Public Works in regard to the charge of Engineers' fees, were presented by the Comptroller, having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of March 1, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Shipman in opposition, it was, on motion, ordered that the said assessment list and objections be returned to the Board of Assessors for a re-examination of the apportionment of the assessment with reference to the objections filed thereto.

The assessment lists for regulating, grading, setting curb and gutter stones and flagging Lexington avenue, from One Hundred and Second street to Harlem river, and for regulating and paving with granite-block pavement Lexington avenue, from One Hundred and Fourth to One Hundred and Thirty-first street, and objections filed thereto, ordered to be returned to the Board of Assessors at meeting of November 20, 1885, for re-examination, were presented by the Comptroller, having been returned by the Board of Assessors without alteration, under date of February 6, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Baldwin, attorney, in opposition, and Mr. Gilon in explanation, it was, on motion, ordered that the said assessment lists and objections be returned to the Board of Assessors with request to levy the assessments according to the benefit received by each particular parcel of property affected by the said improvements.

The assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curb and gutter stones and flagging on Madison avenue, from Ninety-ninth to One Hundred and Fifth street, and objections filed thereto, ordered to be returned to the Board of Assessors at meeting of November 20, 1885, for re-examination, were presented by the Comptroller, having been returned by the Board of Assessors without alteration, under date of February 6, 1886.

After hearing Mr. Baldwin, attorney, in opposition, and Mr. Gilon in explanation, it was, on motion, ordered that the said assessment list and objections be returned to the Board of Assessors, with request to levy the assessment according to the benefit received by each parcel of property affected by the said improvement.

Abstract of Proceedings for the Week ending March 6, 1886.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 3, 1886.—STATED MEETING.—10 A. M.

Present—Commissioners Beekman (President), Crimmins, Powers, and Borden.

The following communications were received:

From the Counsel to the Corporation, opinion respecting the claim of P. A. Bernard, lessee, for making certain repairs and improvements to the building known as Claremont.

On motion the matter of the claim of P. A. Bernard was referred to Commissioner Borden to examine and report as to the legitimacy and amount of the same.

From the Clerk of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting copy of a resolution transferring the sum of \$727 from the appropriation "Police" for the year 1885 to the appropriation "Riverside Park and avenue—for the Maintenance and Improvement of" for the same year. Filed.

From the Comptroller, returning a voucher of E. Vreeland & Van Doorn; also one of Bates & Johnson for work done in fitting up a police sub-station at Claremont, and charged against the appropriation "Police" 1885, and stating that in his judgment said vouchers should be charged to the appropriation for the Maintenance and Improvement of Riverside Park and Avenue.

On motion, said vouchers, amounting in the aggregate to \$727, were re-audited and charged as required by the Comptroller and returned to the Finance Department for payment.

From the President of the Board of Trustees of the New York and Brooklyn Bridge, asking permission to widen the sidewalk on the westerly side of Centre street up to the Hall of Records and along a line extending from that building to the walk turning into the City Hall park north of said building, in connection with the extension of the bridge.

On motion, the President was authorized to grant the permit applied for by said Board of Trustees.

From L. G. Morris, John J. Jefferson and others, petitioning for the improvement of One Hundred and Seventy-sixth street, between Jerome and Morris avenues, by macadamizing or otherwise. Referred to the Executive Committee.

From Luciano Conterno, desiring to furnish music for park concerts during the coming season. Referred to the Executive Committee.

From O. H. Dodworth, desiring to furnish music for park concerts during the coming season. Referred to the Executive Committee.

From Alfred Scott, applying for the privilege of publishing and distributing programmes of park concerts during the coming season. Referred to the Treasurer, with power.

From the Property Clerk, submitting an inventory of the property of the Department. Filed.

From the Engineer of Construction, submitting a plan and specifications for flagging the east side of North Third avenue and St. Ann's avenue, from One Hundred and Sixty-first to One Hundred and Sixty-third streets, with an estimate of the cost (\$200).

On motion, the plan and specifications as submitted by the Engineer of Construction were approved, and the Treasurer was authorized to issue an order for doing the work in conformity therewith.

From the Topographical Engineer, reporting upon the progress of the work under his charge. Filed.

From the Superintendent of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards:

1st. Reporting in relation to the works in progress under his charge. Filed.

2d. Reporting the temporary suspension of men and teams on account of stormy weather. Approved.

From the Superintendent of Parks, submitting the names of parties who will permit the Department to remove manure from their yards, free of charge, provided the responsibility of continuing to perform the work for one year will be assumed by the Department.

On motion, the President was authorized to contract for receiving manure from stables for such length of time and on such terms as he may deem to the interest of the Department.

From the Fifth Avenue Transportation Company, applying for the privilege of conducting the Park carriage service for the term of five years, and agreeing to pay the sum of \$550 per annum for such privilege.

On motion, the Treasurer was authorized to enter into an agreement with the Fifth Avenue Transportation Company for conducting the carriage service in Central, Riverside, and Morningside Parks for a term of five years, at an annual license fee of \$550.

From the President of the Southern Boulevard Railroad Company, applying for a permit to lay car tracks in and along the Southern Boulevard from its junction with Third avenue to the Old Boston road. Filed.

From Cyrus and L. B. Clark, asking that Christ. Schmidt be restored to duty as Carpenter on the parks. Filed.

From Frank P. Quick, resigning his position as Parkkeeper, to take effect March 1, 1886. Accepted.

From Cornelius H. Barrett, resigning his position as Parkkeeper. Accepted.
From J. H. Schaefer, resigning his position as Computer on the Engineer Corps of the Department. Accepted.

From John O'Keefe, Parkkeeper, asking leave of absence for sixty days. Granted.

Forms of contracts for furnishing gravel and police uniforms were laid before the Board and referred to the President, with authority to make such changes and modifications as he may deem proper, and to cause the same to be printed, and when printed and approved as to form by the Counsel to the Corporation, the Secretary was authorized to insert an advertisement in the CITY RECORD inviting proposals for furnishing the gravel and uniforms.

The Executive Committee, on all appointments to the grade of Skilled Laborers, Foremen and Assistant Foremen, were authorized to determine the compensation of such employee.

The Committee on Police were authorized, in all cases in which they shall find officers charged with offenses to be guilty of the same, to impose such penalties therefor other than dismissal as in their judgment may seem proper. Such action shall in all cases be reported to the Board at its next meeting.

 1. There shall be appointed by the Board of Public Charities and Correction a General Superintendent of the Insane, who shall have general supervision of the insane coming under the care of the Department.
 2. The institutions subject to his supervision shall be as follows, to wit: The Reception Pavilion for the Insane at Bellevue Hospital; the New York City Lunatic Asylum on Blackwell's Island; the New York City Asylum for the Insane on Ward's Island, and the branches thereof upon Ward's, Randall's, and Hart's Islands, and the Farm on Long Island.
 3. It shall be his duty to visit each of the several institutions above named once in each week, or as often as may be necessary, to advise with the officers in charge thereof, and to inspect the wards, buildings, etc., and the patients confined therein.
 4. He shall attend all the office of the Commissioners once in each week, or more often if required, and shall make to them such reports and recommendations as he may see fit, for their action thereupon.
 5. All reports and communications from the various institutions, other than such as are matters of routine or provided for by orders from the Board, shall be made to it from the heads of the several institutions through the General Superintendent, and, as far as possible, in writing, at the time herein provided.
 6. He shall forthwith establish, so far as may be practicable, schools for the instruction of the attendants upon the insane employed in the various institutions; shall prepare and submit to the Board for approval, rules for their government, and shall have power to call upon the various medical officers of these institutions to take part in the giving of instruction therein.

7. He shall report to the Board such recommendations and plans as may conduce, in his judgment, to the more extended employment of the insane in such useful occupations as may be of benefit to themselves and the Department.
 8. Transfers of patients from any one to another of the institutions named, and the return of patients from the several branches to the main asylum, or from the latter to the Reception Pavilion, shall be made only with his knowledge and approval.
 Resolved, That, under resolutions passed this day, Dr. A. E. Macdonald is appointed General Superintendent of the Insane of this Department.

Every man must attend to his own notice. It is a misdemeanor to give any jury paper to another to answer. It is also punishable by fine or imprisonment to give or receive any present or bribe directly or indirectly in relation to a jury service, or to withhold any paper or make any false statement, and every case will be fully prosecuted.

THE CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE CROTON Aqueduct reports to me to-day that during the past twenty days the water in the city reservoirs has gone down three feet, three inches equal to 92,000,000 gallons showing that the amount of water used was wasted over and above the supply received through the Croton Aqueduct and the Bronx river conduit. The Department has no means to stop this enormous waste, which is caused by consumers keeping faucets open day and night to prevent freezing in the service-pipes, and can only make this most urgent appeal to them to stop it, and notify them that unless it is stopped the pressure of water-mains will be so much reduced that in a few days the water will not rise to the basements and cellars in thousands of buildings.
