



At a special meeting of the Commissioners of Public Charities and Correction held at this office, the following preamble and resolutions were unanimously adopted:
Whereas, This Board having just learned with sincere regret of the sudden demise of Dr. Austin Flint, Sr., who for nearly thirty years has been closely connected with this Department; therefore be it

Resolved, That we acknowledge his long, faithful, untiring and eminent services in Bellevue Hospital as well as the other hospitals in this Department, and in his death we are called upon to mourn the loss of one of the greatest physicians in this City, and a teacher of the highest standing.

Resolved, That in the death of Dr. Flint we have to deplore the loss of one who was justly distinguished as a skillful physician and whose aid and advice were always sought and heartily given in the promotion of charitable objects in Bellevue Hospital and for the suffering inmates of that Institution. Losing him as we do, in the midst of his usefulness, we are called upon to mourn the loss of a conscientious physician, who, at all times, day and night, was ever ready to visit and attend to the sick poor.

Resolved, That we tender to his family and relations our heartfelt sympathy in this their sad hour of bereavement with which an all-wise Providence has seen fit to afflict them.

Resolved, That as a slight token of the respect with which his memory is held by this Board, a tablet be placed in the Medical Board Room of Bellevue Hospital, also that the flags of the institutions in this department be placed at half-mast until after the day of the funeral, and that the entrance to Bellevue Hospital be draped in mourning for thirty days.

Resolved, That this Board attend the funeral in a body.

Resolved, That these resolutions be entered upon the minutes of this Board and that a copy, properly authenticated, be sent to the family of the deceased.

DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At a meeting of the Board of Docks held March 17, 1886.

Present—The full Board.

The minutes of the special meeting held March 10, 1886, were read and approved.

The following communications were received, read, and

On motion, laid on the table to await action as stated, to wit:

From Simon Stevens, attorney Morgan's Louisiana-Texas Railroad and Steamship Company—Requesting a renewal of the lease of bulkhead on either side of Pier, old 36, North river.

From Simon Stevens, attorney Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company—Requesting the Board to grant the said Company a lease of ninety-four feet of the bulkhead on either side of Pier, new No. 41, North river, with permission to erect thereon a corrugated-iron shed, for the protection of merchandise received and discharged thereat.

On motion, the President was authorized to request the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation as to the power and authority of the Board to lease to any Steamship Company any portion of the bulkhead adjoining the piers between Canal and West Eleventh streets North river, with permission to erect and construct thereon sheds for the protection of merchandise received and discharged thereat by such Steamship Companies.

From F. W. J. Hurst, Manager National Line Steamships—Requesting permission to berth one of their vessels at Piers, new 43, or new 46, North river. The Secretary directed to request Mr. Hurst to call on the President on Saturday, March 20th instant, between 11 and 12 o'clock A. M.

From William Kelly—Requesting permission to erect a platform at the foot of West Ninety-sixth street, North river, for the purpose of receiving dock stones. Referred to the Dock Superintendent to examine and report.

From A. T. Decker & Co.—Reporting that dredging is needed in slip at south side of Pier foot of Bethune street, North river. The action of Commissioner Matthews in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report was approved.

From Thomas E. Crimmins—Requesting permission to erect a temporary structure at bulkhead foot of Forty-first street, East river. Referred to the Dock Superintendent to examine and report.

From Engineer-in-Chief—Report on Secretary's Order No. 5065, in reference to the application of A. Raymond & Co., for permission to build a bulkhead between One Hundred and Fifty-third and One Hundred and Fifty-fourth streets, Harlem river.

The following communications were received, read, and,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, action being taken where necessary, as stated, to wit:

From Counsel to the Corporation—Reporting that he had been served with an injunction restraining the City and the Dock Department from removing or otherwise interfering with the engine-house, shute, etc., erected on Pier 3, North river, by the New York Steam Company, and requesting such information or papers respecting the matter that may be in possession of the Department. The President to furnish the desired information.

From Comptroller of the City—Requesting a diagram of the ferry premises foot of Courtland street, North river, occupied by the Associates of the Jersey Company, and also requesting an estimate of the yearly rent which should be charged in connection with the ferry franchise. The Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to make diagram, and the President authorized to furnish the information desired.

From Senate, State of New York—Extending for twenty days, from March 11, 1886, the time to answer resolution adopted by the Senate, February 25, 1886.

From Erastus Wiman—In reference to calling on the President in relation to the privileges granted to the Staten Island Rapid Transit Railroad Company. Secretary to request Mr. Wiman to call on the President on Saturday, March 20, 1886.

From Matthew Thompson—Requesting that the time for the completion of the work of furnishing labor and materials for steam heating for building on Pier A, North river, under Contract No. 227 C, be extended from January 4, 1886, to March 13, 1886. Extension of time granted to March 20, 1886.

From Canda & Kane—Requesting permission to dredge in front of the bulkhead between Fifty-fourth and Fifty-fifth streets, North river. Permission granted, to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief.

From New York Hardwood Lumber Co.—Offering to furnish white oak timber to the department.

From Equitable Gas-light Company—Requesting permission to withdraw application for permission to locate a dumping-board on the bulkhead foot of Forty-first street, East river. Application granted.

From Henderson Brothers, agents Anchor Line—Requesting permission to remove small office from Piers, new 41 to new 43, North river. The action of Commissioner Matthews in granting the desired permission was approved.

From John S. Schultze, executor of the estate of James Brown—Requesting permission to dredge in front of the bulkhead between Fifty-first and Fifty-second streets, North river. The action of Commissioner Matthews in issuing a permit therefor, the said dredging to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief, was approved.

From Hartford and New York Transportation Company—Requesting permission to replace piles on the south side of Pier 24, East river. The action of Commissioner Matthews in issuing a permit, the work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief, was approved.

From The York Steam Company—Requesting permission to erect and maintain a small building for hoisting engine, a coal shute, and two derricks on Pier 3, North river. The President stated that upon investigation he had ascertained that the said engine was not erected in accordance with law.

On motion of Commissioner Matthews the permit heretofore granted by him on March 11, 1886, to the New York Steam Company was reconsidered, and the said permit was revoked.

From F. G. Osborn, Master Pennsylvania Railroad Lighterage Department—Requesting the Board to inform him what is the proper rate of wharfage to charge for barges in the service of said Company. The Dock Superintendent to examine and report.

From Jeremiah T. Smith—Requesting permission to build a dumping-board on the bulkhead adjoining the property of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company between Piers 2 and 3, North river. Application denied.

From Frank E. Wise—In reference to and requesting the Board to remit the penalty imposed upon him for violation of Rule 4 of the Rules and Regulations, as the extreme cold weather prevented him from removing the brick obstructing the said pier.

On motion of Commissioner Matthews the penalty was remitted.

From Hoboken Land and Improvement Company—Requesting permission to rebuild the clump of piles, etc., at ferry premises foot of Barclay street, North River, and within existing lines. Permission granted, to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department.

A communication from Chas. P. Daly, executor and attorney of the Lyddy estate, in reference to and complaining of the derricks located on the bulkhead between Piers 26 and 28, East River, was, together with the communication received from the Dock Superintendent in respect to the said subject, referred to the President and Treasurer for examination and report.

From Stephen H. Mills—Requesting permission to replace piles at Pier 23, East River. Permission granted, to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department.

From John J. Shelley—Tendering his resignation as an employee in the Department. Resignation accepted.

From Engineer-in-Chief:

1st. Reporting assignment of employees to special duty.

2d. Reporting the amount of work done during the week ending March 13, 1886.

3d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5138, that he had examined the application of Gus Voegel for permission to run a cast-iron pipe from premises, No. 205 West street, through bulkhead, between Piers, old 34 and 35, North river, for drainage purposes, and finds that there is a sewer in Harrison street about fifty feet north of the said premises easily available for drainage purposes.

On motion, the report was received and the President authorized to advise Mr. Voegel that his application has been denied.

4th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5123, enclosing report of cement tested for Messrs. Behrend & Trieste. The President authorized to send them copy of said test.

5th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5113, that he had superintended the repairing of Piers 4 and 5, North river.

6th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5105, that he had made requisition for dredging at the dumping-board at West 12th street, North river, and supervised the work which was done by the Union Dredging Company.

7th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5049, that he had superintended and directed the building of a retaining structure at the bulkhead, between One Hundred and Second and One Hundred and Third streets, Harlem river.

8th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5077, that he had made requisition for dredging at dumping-board foot of West Thirty-seventh street, North river, and supervised the work which was done by Henry DuBois' Sons.

9th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5092, that he had superintended and directed the rebuilding of bulkhead and extension of platform foot of East Fifty-seventh street, East river.

10th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5155, that he had repaired sheathing, Pier Eighteenth street, North river.

11th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 5150, that he had superintended and directed the locating of a hoisting engine, a small building to protect the same, one coal chute and two derricks on Pier 3, North river.

A report from the Engineer-in-Chief on Secretary's Order No. 5148 in reference to and reporting favorably on the application of the New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad Company, for permission to drive a small cluster of piles in front of the bulkhead between Thirtieth and Thirty-first streets, East river, was received, ordered to be placed on file, and the following resolution, offered by the President, was adopted.

Resolved, That permission be and hereby is granted to the New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad Company to drive a cluster of piles at the bulkhead between Thirtieth and Thirty-first streets, East river, "for the purpose of facilitating the berthing and landing of car floats," the said piles to be and remain thereat only during the pleasure of the Board, provided that the said railroad company file an agreement within five days that they will remove the said piles within three days of the issuing of an order from the Board to do so.

From Edward Abeel, Dock Master—Reporting that the chain fastenings of spring-piles on the upper and lower corner of Pier 37, East river, are loose. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to repair was approved.

From Patrick J. Brady, Dock Master—Reporting that the approach to Pier, new 60, North river, is in need of repairs. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and repair, if necessary, was approved.

From Joseph B. Erwin, Dock Master—Reporting several holes in planking of Pier at Fifty-fifth street, North river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and repair was approved.

From Charles P. Blake, Dock Master:

1st. Reporting dangerous hole in bulkhead Sixteenth street, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and repair was approved.

2d. Reporting that the tug-boat "Alice E. Crew," broke fender-pile at the bulkhead, foot of Seventeenth street, East river, on March 8, 1886. The action of the President in notifying owners to repair was approved.

From Joseph F. Sharkey, Dock Master:

1st. Reporting that earth has accumulated on the bulkhead between Seventy-eighth and Seventy-ninth streets, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to put the surface of said bulkhead in order was approved.

2d. Reporting that the string-piece and some of the crib-work has been carried away from bulkhead between Eighty-sixth and Eighty-seventh streets, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to repair was approved.

From George W. Wannmaker, Dock Master—Reporting that he had served a notice on Mr. Chas. E. Emery, manager of the New York Steam Company, to remove or place on wheels engine and house on Pier 3, North river.

The President offered the following preambles and resolution, which were adopted:

Whereas, Charles O. Brown, contractor for erecting a building on Pier A, under Contract No. 225, did substantially complete all the work to be done under said contract on or before the 1st day of February, 1886, the time fixed for its completion; and

Whereas, The said Brown has since that time done some small items of work under said contract, thereby preventing a certificate being given of the absolute and entire completion of all the work to be done under that contract; therefore

Resolved, That the time for the completion of said contract be and hereby is extended to the 22d day of March, 1886.

A communication from the Engineer-in-Chief submitting an amendment to report on Secretary's Order No. 5095, was received, and ordered to be placed on file, and the following resolutions offered by the President were adopted:

Resolved, That the resolution heretofore adopted by the Board on February 17, 1886, giving permission to John D. Crimmins to build a bulkhead on the North river, between Ninety-sixth and Ninety-seventh streets, be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

Resolved, That permission be and hereby is granted to John D. Crimmins to build a suitable bulkhead on the North river, from the northerly side of the Pier at Ninety-sixth street to the middle of Ninety-seventh street, along the established bulkhead line, with a suitable return at Ninety-seventh street to the shore, upon plans and specifications to be submitted to and approved by this Board, the work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department.

On motion, the President was authorized to request the Department of Public Works to extend the sewer erected at Pier foot of West Ninety-sixth street, North river, and make such drainage facilities as may be necessary, from the present terminus to the outer end of the bulkhead constructed thereat.

The Treasurer, Commissioner Matthews, presented his report of receipts for the week ending March 16, 1886, which was received and ordered to be spread in full on the minutes, as follows:
