Bureau of Highways.

Contracts amounting to \$535,257.76, chargeable to appropriations, Corporate Stock and the Street Improvement Fund, were entered into by this bureau during the quarter. Contracts chargeable to budget appropriations were for sand, lumber, trap rock and trap rock screenings, used in the care and maintenance of highways. Those chargeable to other funds were for paving and repaving streets.

Twenty-seven assessment lists, in duplicate, for original improvements, were completed, aggregating in value \$188,032.72, and sent to the Board of Assessors. Seven profiles were transmitted to the Board of Assessors. Thirty-four plans for new work were made, of which number 23 were for paving and 11 for repaving. There were also prepared 6 miscellaneous maps and diagrams, 51 sets of specifications, 5 copies of each, and 66 plans filed.

Of reports for original improvements initiated in the Local Board, upon petition of property owners, three hundred and eighty-five were made giving the estimated quantities of materials required, estimated cost, and the assessed valuation of the real estate within the probable area of assessment according to the last preceding tax roll. Of this number 30 were for paving, 11 for regulating, grading and paving combined, 15 for regulating, grading, curbing and sidewalks only, 10 for fencing lots, 7 for cement walks and 312 for sidewalk repairs. During this period 28 surveys were made for the Law Department.

Assigning House Numbers—Assigned, 6,267; inspected, 39; notices served, 42; complaints of duplicates settled, 92; streets served with paving notices, 65; contractors served with "Order to begin work," 65.

Repairs to Defective Pavements—Square yards: Granite, grade 1, T. and G., 3,418; granite, grade 2, T. and G., 4,539; granite, grade 1, cement joints, 2,388; granite, grade 2, cement joints, 483; Belgian block, 987; cobblestones, 253; wood block, 46; asphalt block, 4,058; Medina, 607; iron slag, 156; six-inch concrete foundation, 6,925; sand granite pavement, 4,768; macadam, 37,662; brick block, 82.

Restoring Cuts made by Corporations, Plumbers, etc.—Square yards: Granite, grade 1, T. and G., 3,202; granite, grade 2, T. and G., 3,480; granite on sand, 2,085; Belgian block, 656; cobblestone, 53; Medina, 287; asphalt block, 1,539; six-inch concrete foundation, 13,557; iron slag block, 69; granite block, grade 1, cement joints, 1,520; granite block, grade 2, cement joints, 3,006; wood block, 348; macadam, 2,154; brick block, 44.

Sidewalk Repairs—Bluestone walks, 19,995 square feet; cement walk, 9,860 square feet; bluestone curb, 1,160 linear feet; bridging, 867 square feet; concrete curb foundation, 641 linear feet; cement curb, 990 linear feet; granite curb, 68 linear feet; cement gutter, 55 square feet; brick gutter, 120 square yards; and brick walk, 326 square feet.

Shaping Up and Repairing Dirt and Unimproved Roads—Macadam cleaned, 349,876 square yards; dirt roads repaired (hand), 698,786 square yards; dirt roads repaired (machine), 2,032,155 square yards; ash sidewalks built, 8,379 square yards; miscellaneous gutters paved, 6,778 square yards; paved gutters cleaned, 72,561 square yards; dirt sidewalks built, 722 square yards; cesspools cleaned and repaired, 65; cesspools built, 8; drain pipe laid, 137 linear feet; streets sprinkled with oil, 418,667 square yards; streets sprinkled with water, 1,946 miles.

In addition there was considerable miscellaneous work, consisting of bridge repairs, drainage, miscellaneous trucking, repairing tools and equipment, filling washouts and removing incumbrances.

Municipal Asphalt Plant—The total plant product was: 14,702 boxes of wearing surface mixture, 138,198.80 cubic feet; 6,125 boxes of binder mixtures, 59,718.75 cubic feet.

Chemical Testing Laboratory—Portland cements, 369 samples; asphalt surface mixtures, 842 samples; miscellaneous samples, 813.

Division of Incumbrances—Incumbrances removed by bureau: Boulders, 920; trees, etc., 410; posts, poles, etc., 280; miscellaneous (loads of earth dumped), 1,214; carriage step stones, 16; household furniture, 8 loads; fire debris, etc., 16 hours' labor; abandoned building materials, 20 hours' labor; stop-cocks removed, 84; stands, unclaimed and abandoned, 4; buildings demolished, 1.

The total number of permits given to the various corporations to make openings in streets amounted to 9,512. Of this number

repairing passenger elevators, 25 violations. Letter notices, 122; making a total of 1,070.

There were 23 complaints received and upon investigation remedied.

Passenger elevators to the number of 2,755 were inspected, of which 25 were found not in compliance with the law.

There were filed 501 applications for new construction, affecting 704 buildings, the estimated cost of which was \$11,325,150. Of these, 30 were for 68 one-family brick of less than \$20,000 each, total \$245,450; one was for one one-family brick to cost \$23,000; twenty-two were for 31 two-family brick dwellings each to cost less than \$20,000, total \$179,200; twenty-eight were for 35 tenements each to cost over \$20,000, total \$1,641,000; seventeen were for 31 tenements each to cost less than \$20,000, total \$363,000; eight were for 8 brick stores, each to cost less than \$15,000, total \$35,400; one was for one brick store to cost \$36,000; four were for four brick stores to cost between \$15,000 and \$30,000, total \$63,000; thirty-three were for 45 two-family brick houses with stores, total cost \$304,000; one was for one office building to cost \$10,000; twenty-six were for 26 factories and workshops, total cost of \$660,300; five were for five churches, total cost \$104,000; one was for one school house, total cost \$145,000; five were for public buildings, total cost \$5,225,000; two were for places of amusement, hotels, lodging houses, etc.; total cost \$350,000; one hundred and sixty-one were for 191 brick stables and garages, total cost \$609,800; seventeen were for 18 miscellaneous brick buildings, such as ash stations, etc., total cost \$96,850; one hundred were for 174 one-family frame buildings, total cost \$548,350; twenty-nine were for 43 two-family frame dwellings, total cost \$193,200; seven were for 11 brick warehouse and loft buildings, total cost \$483,600; and three were for three other frame structures, total cost \$9,000.

The Bureau of Buildings received, cash, during the quarter: For signs, \$165; subpoena fees, \$47; making a total of \$212.

DIVISION OF SUBSTRUCTURES.

Surveys were made in the Williamsburg section of the Borough, covering 4.26 miles of thoroughfares. Surveys and investigations were made and special drawings were prepared and furnished to the Bureau of Sewers to be made part of the contract drawings in advance of sewer construction covering 7.47 miles of thoroughfares and 21.80 miles of substructures.

To complete record maps, 3.77 miles of substructures and .99 miles of topography were plotted. Four record maps were completed in color covering 1.85 miles of street and 11.11 miles of substructures.

To 66 of the finished record maps were added in color 2.86 miles of substructures. Information furnished to corporations, departments and others, 10.37 miles of streets.

Maps filed by corporations and departments, containing valuable subsurface information, numbering 862.

Permits referred to this division for approval, 1982.

Bureau of Public Buildings and Offices.

Supplies, materials and equipment, amounting to \$26,346.95, were purchased on open market orders, all of which was charged to Appropriations.

Five contracts were entered into, at a cost of \$669,669.

There was received, during the period, from the public baths and comfort stations, \$7,560.45, which was credited to the General Fund.

Topographical Bureau.

The work done by this Bureau, during the quarter, was as follows: 780,600 feet of precise and approximate chaining; 42,500 feet of precise line work; 28,513 feet for plans and profiles (original improvements) in 19 streets; 26,862 feet line and grade stakes set (original improvement of streets) for 38 streets; and 7,157 feet of damage surveys for 4 streets.

Nine maps were completed and transmitted to this office affecting changes of established elevations of streets, reduction in width of streets, widening, locating and laying out, closing and discontinuing, et cetera., all requiring action by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

In addition, there was furnished considerable information in the preparation of statements of facts for submission to the Corporation Counsel for determination as to whether same were sufficient to authorize the City to commence public improvements without the need of condemnation proceedings.

Permits for buildings to the number of 801 have been certified to as to the widths of streets and sidewalks, and grades have been furnished for all permits for new buildings.

Applications of corporations to erect poles, to the number of 245, have been certified to concerning the legal status of the streets in which the poles are to be erected.

There were furnished for the use of the Corporation Counsel one map for one street and for the use of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment five maps for 10 streets.

There were also forwarded to the Bureau of Highways ten plans and profiles for regulating and grading streets authorized by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the name of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
