Proceedings of the Board of Revision of Assessments at a Meeting Held in Room 737, Municipal Building, at 10.30 o'clock A. M. on Tuesday, July 23, 1918.

Present—Louis H. Hahlo, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Charles D. Olendorf, Assistant and Acting Corporation Counsel; and Jacob A. Cantor, President, Department of Taxes and Assessments.

The minutes of the meetings held June 26 and 28, 1918, were approved as printed in the City Record July 10, 1918.

#### Borough of Manhattan.

Sewer in Park Avenue, West Side, Between 74th and 75th Streets and 76th and 78th Streets.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the Assessment List No. 5877 for alteration and improvement to sewer in Park avenue, west side, between 74th and 75th streets, and between 76th and 78th streets, together with objections of Ferris & Storck, attorneys for the 76th Street and Park Avenue Company, having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of July 17, 1918.

#### Borough of Manhattan.

155th Street Viaduct—Awards Made Pursuant to Section 873 of the Consolidation Act and Section 951 of the Greater New York Charter.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following certificate of the Board of Assessors:

Before the Board of Assessors of The City of New York.

In the matter of the ascertainment of the damages to property situated in the block bounded by Eighth avenue, West 155th street, Bradhurst avenue and West 154th street, Borough of Manhattan, caused by the grading of and the construction of the viaduct in West 155th street between Macombs Dam Bridge and Edgecombe avenue, and in Eighth avenue—claims filed pursuant to section 873 of the Consolidated Act and section 951 of the Greater New York Charter.

Claims having been filed in the office of the Board of Assessors prior to July 1, 1916, by—

Gertrude Crane et al., with respect to lots 35 to 39 inclusive of block 2047;

Edward J. Knapp and Wesley Wait with respect to lots 25 to 28 inclusive and 40 to 44 inclusive of block 2047;

—for damages alleged to have been caused by the grading of and the erection of a viaduct in West 155th street between Macombs Dam Bridge and Edgecombe avenue and in Eighth avenue, Borough of Manhattan, City of New York.

After hearing and considering the testimony and evidence offered in support of and in opposition to said claim, and after viewing and inspecting the property claimed to have been injured, we hereby award as damages, pursuant to section 873 of the Consolidated Act and section 951 of the Greater New York Charter, to the following named persons, the following amounts with respect to the property embraced within said claims:

Gertrude Crane, as administratrix of the estate of George W. Sauer, deceased, block 2047, lots 35, 36, 37, 38 and 39 .....

Edward J. Knapp, as executor of the last will and testament of Samuel T. Knapp, deceased, block 2047, lots 25, 26, 27 and 28 and

40, 41, 42, 43 and 44 .....

—said sums to be paid by The City of New York to the persons so named.

We have computed interest upon said awards at the rate of six per centum per annum from the time of the completion and acceptance of the grading to the date set in the published notice for the hearing upon objections to said awards, and said amounts of interest are as follows:

Block 2047, lots 35, 36, 37 and 38 .....

Block 2047, lots 25, 26, 27 and 28 and 40, 41, 42, 43 and 44 .....

Gazan, attorney, the testimony taken in the matter, and all papers and exhibits, having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of July 29, 1918.

Mr. John M. Harrington, attorney, was heard in opposition to the awards as being insufficient and inadequate.

## Amendments to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health, held July 23, 1918, the following resolution was duly adopted:

Resolved, That section 91 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended:

"Section 91. Puerperal Septicemia and Suppurative Conjunctions: Duty of Officers of Schools, Dispensaries and Other Institutions, and of Physicians to Report. It shall be the duty of the manager or managers, superintendent, or person in charge of every sanatorium, day nursery convalescent home, home for children, reformatory, training school, boarding school, hospital, dispensary, or other institution for the care or treatment of persons, in the City of New York, to immediately report or cause to be immediately reported in writing, to the Department of Health, the name, age (so far as can be ascertained), and residence of every person received therein or treated thereat, who is affected with puerperal septicemia or suppurative conjunctions, with the name of the disease with which such person is affected, and it shall be the duty of every physician in the said City to immediately make, or cause to be immediately made, a similar written report to the said Department relative to every person found by such physician to be so affected, stating in each instance, the name of the disease with which said person is affected. Every such manager, physician and officer shall also report in writing the name and address of the physician or midwife in attendance at the time of the onset of the disease, which information it is hereby made the duty of every institution herein specified to obtain and record among its records."

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the date of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials or labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

"No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a resale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made."

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids, and be it further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

**GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS ON WORK TO BE DONE FOR, OR SUPPLIES TO BE FURNISHED TO THE CITY OF NEW YORK.**

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be, or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of such bid, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks or trust companies of The City of New York, or a check of such bank or trust company signed by a duly authorized officer thereof, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or other certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

All bids for supplies must be submitted in duplicate.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid.

For particulars as to the quantity or quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter as surety or otherwise upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, may be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done or the supplies are to be furnished. Plans and drawings of construction work may be seen there.
