Having reviewed the Producer Price Index as well as the other factors enumerated in NYCRR Title 17, Chapter 1, § 5-02(g), BIC proposes an increase to the current maximum rate allowed to be charged by the trade waste haulers of 3.3%. This increase would result in maximum rates of:

- \$18.87 per cubic yard
- \$12.38 per 100 pounds
