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Service Change for Brooklyn Community Board 6 Residents Living in Cobble Hill, Red Hook, Carroll Gardens, Gowanus and Park Slope

The New York City Department of Sanitation is announcing a service change for residents living in Brooklyn Community Board 6, which includes Cobble Hill, Red Hook, Carroll Gardens, Gowanus and Park Slope.



Starting Monday, July 30, 2018, the Department will collect organic material once per week, on recycling day. The change will allow the Department to become more efficient with both curbside organics and bulk item collection.

Trash collection **will not** change.

Residents needing curbside collection of their large, bulky items can make an appointment at nyc.gov/bulk or by calling 311.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 693 salt/sand spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
