Mr. Wolf claims that the extra time required to finish the work was rendered necessary by delays caused by the contraction of a lower in Jackson avenue, between One Hundred and Sixty-fifth and One Hundred and Sixty-eighth streets, and in One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street crossing said avenue.
