of costs, charges and expenses incurred by reason of the above entitled proceeding will be presented to one of the Justices of the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Second Department, at a Special Term therefor, for the hearing of motions, to be held at the County Court House, in the Borough of Brooklyn, in The City of New York, on the 10th day of October, 1918, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, or as soon thereafter as Counsel can be heard thereon, for taxation in accordance with the Certificate of the Corporation Counsel, and that the said buildings, apertures, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, apertures or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in

every respect in a thorough and workmanlike

manner, and must be completed within thirty

days from the date of possession, and the suc-

cessful bidder will provide and furnish all

materials or labor and machinery necessary

thereto, and will place proper and sufficient

guards and fences and warning signs by day

and night for the prevention of accidents,

and will indemnify and save harmless The

City of New York, its officers, agents and ser-

vants, and each of them, against any and all

suits and actions, claims and demands of

every name and description brought against

it, them or any of them, and against and from

all damage and costs to which it, they or any

of them be put by reason of injury to the

person or property of another, resulting from

negligence or carelessness in the performance

of the work, or in guarding the same, or from

any improper or defective materials or machi-

nery, implements or appliances used in the re-

moval of said buildings.

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
