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DSNY Issues 'Winter Operations Advisory' for Wednesday, December 8, 2021 at 6 a.m.

Due to the possibility of snow in Wednesday's forecast, the New York City Department of Sanitation has issued a Winter Operations Advisory for Wednesday, December 8, 2021 starting at 6 a.m. Snow showers are expected in the early morning, though no roadway accumulations are expected. The Department's salt spreaders are filled and ready for use should conditions require.

Open Restaurants may continue to offer outdoor and roadway dining throughout this event. Restaurants with roadway seating should be aware that DSNY equipment may spread salt on the roadway during this event.

Residents should continue to follow their normal collection schedule for trash, compost and recycling, though delays may occur while the Department is in snow operations mode.

Alternate Side Parking Regulations are already suspended on Wednesday, December 8 due to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Parking meters are in effect.

The Department is coordinating with other City agencies on snow clearing protocol in accordance with each agency's written snow plan. All relevant city agencies have been notified and the Department will continue to monitor forecasts as the snow event approaches.

The New York City Emergency Management Department advises New Yorkers to exercise caution while traveling as the mix of rain and snow could create dangerous road conditions. New Yorkers are advised to avoid driving and use mass transit where possible. Allow for extra travel time as forecast conditions change.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000

rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
