

FIRST DISTRICT, BOROUGH OF RICHMOND.

The Local Board, First District, Borough of Richmond, The City of New York, met at the Borough Office in the First National Bank Building at St. George in said borough, on Tuesday, July 30, 1901, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

The roll was called, and the following members were present and answered to their names: Councilman Bodine, Councilman O'Grady and President Cromwell.

The minutes of the meeting of June 25, 1901, were duly approved.

Fingerboard Road to Broad Street, Second and Fourth Wards-Sewer.

On motion of Councilman O'Grady, it was voted that, on the recommendation of Hon. Henry P. Morrison, Deputy Commissioner and Chief Engineer, the matter of the petition for the construction of a sewerage system in the Second and Fourth Wards, from Fingerboard road to Bread street, be referred to the Topographical Bureau of the Board of Public Improvements for a topographical survey of the watershed referred to in said petition, with the view of ascertaining the size of the outlet, etc., of the proposed sewer.

Bement Avenue, First Ward-Sidewalks, Curbs and Gutters.

Mr. Cornelius G. Kofff, as agent for Mr. Edward Bement, stated that since filing his protest as agent, dated June 24, 1901, against the above improvement, he had communicated with Mr. Bement, and had been requested by him not to make any further objections, but simply to allow the protest above referred to to remain on file.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman O'Grady and adopted;
Resolved, That the Local Board, First District, Borough of Richmond, The City of New York, hereby requests the Deputy Commissioner of Highways to notify the owners of property on

both sides of Bement avenue, from Forest avenue to Richmond terrace, First Ward of the borough, to curb, flag and gutter in front of their respective premises, where not already done.

Affirmative—Councilman Bodine, Councilman O'Grady and President Cromwell.

Map or Plan of Streets, etc., in that part of Second and Fourth Wards bounded by Lower Bay, Sand Lane, Fingerboard Road, Proposed Grassmere Lake Park, Pierce Avenue, Weser Avenue, Steuben Avenue, Danube Avenue, Jasper Street, Richmond Road, Broad Street, Canal Street, Water Street, Upper Bay and the Narrows.

The above map or plan was taken up for consideration, and Messrs. Tablot Root, representing the Vanderbilt interests, David Milliken of Rosebank, James Thompson of Stapleton, George S. Scofield of Clifton and Cornelius G. Kolff, on behalf of W. W. MacFarland, Esq., were heard. Each was in favor of the map as a whole, but made suggestions as to minor changes which he submitted or agreed to submit in writing.

After a general discussion the matter was laid over for further consideration.

Specification for Construction of New Curb.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Bodine and adopted:
Resolved, by the Local Board, First District, Borough of Richmond, The City of New York, that the following recommendations of the Deputy Commissioner and Chief Engineer of Highways for the Borough of Richmond with regard to the specification for new curb in this borough be and the same hereby are approved by this Board:
Quality of New Curb—Curbstones shall be hard, sound, fine-grained and uniform colored bluestone, shall be free from seams and other imperfections, and shall be equal in quality to the best North river bluestone.

bluestone, shall be free from seams and other imperfections, and shall be equal in quality to the best North river bluestone.

Dimensions—They shall be twenty (20) inches in depth, from three and one-half (3½) to eight (8) feet in length, and not less than five (5) inches in thickness, with square ends full average width.

Dressing of Top and Exposed Face—The front shall be dressed smooth and to a fair line to a depth of ten (10) inches, free from irregularities greater than one-eighth (½) of an inch. Top of curb shall be dressed to a surface showing no depression greater than one-eighth (½) of an inch. The ends shall be squarely and evenly joined on the tace for a depth of ten (10) inches on the top for the full thickness of the stone, with no joint greater than one-fourth (¼) of an inch. Setting—Each curbstone shall be set truly to grade and line and on a face batter of one (1) inch in its depth, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer; it shall be firmly bedded on and tamped with clean, dry and gritty earth or coarse sand, and the rear to the top shall be backfilled and tamped with the same material.

Curb Corners—Curved curb for corners shall be cut with true, radial joints, and set accurately to a radius of three (3) feet in three (3) foot lengths, unless otherwise required.

Affirmative—Councilman Bodine, Councilman O'Grady and President Cromwell.

Negative—None.

Morning Star Road, Third Ward—Sewer.
