BOARD OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

The Board of Public Improvements of The City of New York met at the office of the floard, Nis. 21 Park row, as Wednesday, July 14, 1900, at 2 o'clock F. M., pursuant to notice. The roll was called, and the following memors were present and answered to their names: The Comproder (Deputy Comptroller Levey), the Commissioner of Water Supply, the Commissioner of Bohnays (Deputy Commissioner Shannon), the Commissioner of Street Cleaning, the Commissioner of Pallic Buildings, Lighting and Supplies, the Commissioner of Bridges, the President of the Borough of The Brook, the President of the Burough of Brooklyn, the President of the Borough of Unions, and the President of the Borough of Richmond, The President, Hon. Mannice F. Holahan, president, The President of the meetings of June 27 and July 3, 1900, were approved as printed.

REDUCTION OF ASSESSMENT FOR OFFNING EDGECOMER ROAD.

In connection with the resolution adopted in this matter on July 3 (see Minutes, p. 1968), the reliewing resolution was manimusally adopted:

V. It is impracticable to pay rental for ground for a tower site, and our official who visited the station, reports that a desirable location would be on ground belonging to the City, at the foot of Franklin

As the storm warnings will be for the general benefit of the public, and especially the water traffic on Long Island Sound, I beg to ask if you will kindly grant this Bureau permission to put up one of these towers, as indicated above, all expenses in this connection to be borne by the Weather Hureau?

The accompanying illustration shows the kind of tower it is proposed to eyect. This has a total height of 75 feet to top of flag-staff, which is surmounted by a wind-vane. The electric lanterns shown will be fitted with high-power meandescent lamps for night displays.
