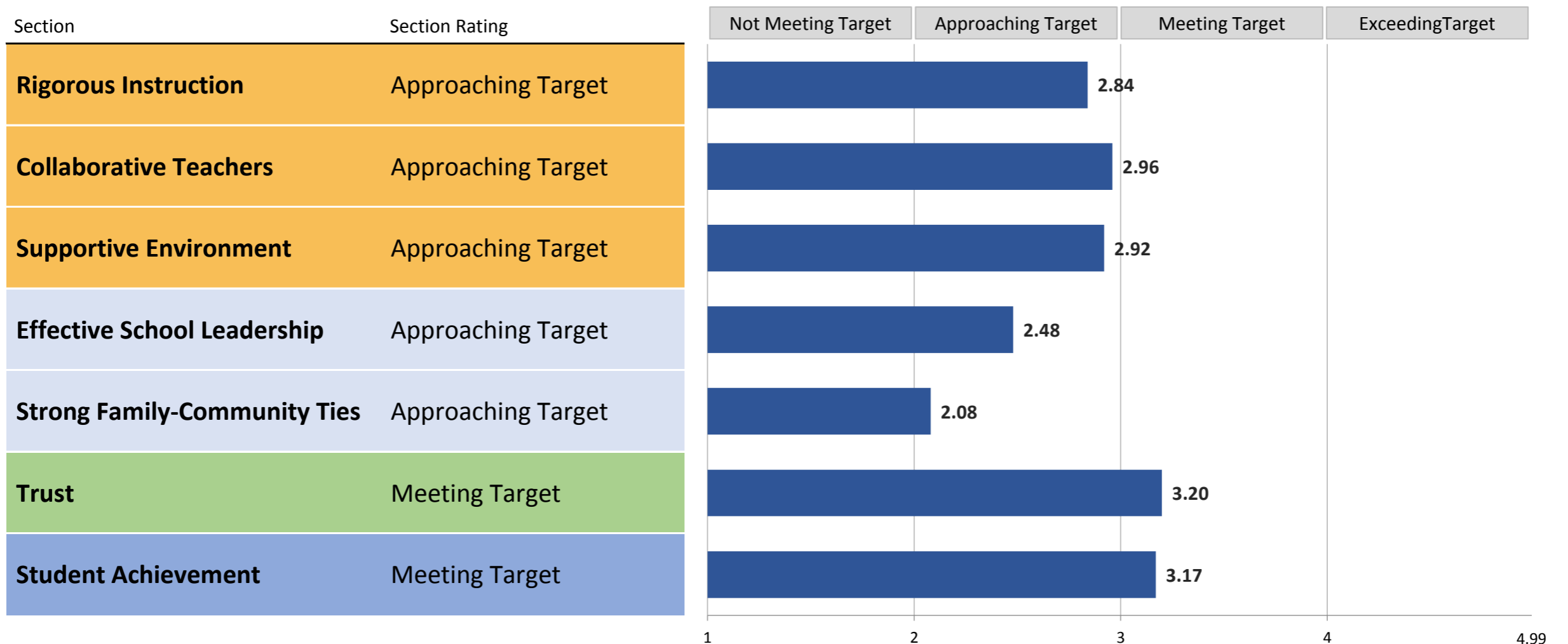

Framework for Great Schools
