#### Did you know?

- A few inches of flood water can cause ten of thousands of dollars worth of flood damage.
- Even if you live two miles from the coast, you could be at risk of flooding.
- There's a one in four chance that your home will be flooded during your 30-year mortgage.

# COVID-19 IS STILL HERE

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

**All people 5 years of age or older are eligible for a vaccine in NYC. Get vaccinated today!**

- **Where to get vaccinated:** [nyc.gov/vaccinefinder](https://nyc.gov/vaccinefinder) OR by calling **877-VAX-4NYC**
  - In home vaccinations are available for ALL New Yorkers 12 and older. As of June 1, in-home vaccinations will be available to people who are 65+ or unable to leave their home. Go to [nyc.gov/homevaccine](https://nyc.gov/homevaccine) to sign up or call 877-VAX-4NYC
- If you test **positive for COVID-19** or were recently exposed:
  - **Stay Home**
  - **Talk to your health care provider and ask about treatment**
  - **Get Tested**
  - **Let close contacts know**
  - **Seek help in an emergency**
- **Treatment for COVID-19.** If you test positive for COVID-19, getting treated right away can lessen your symptoms and help you recover sooner.
