The amount deposited by the successful bidder will be retained and credited on account of rent, except that in case the successful bidder does not execute the lease when so directed then such deposit shall be forfeited.

The Elimination Test and the Transcription Test may be copied on the typewriter or in handwriting. In the Facility Test each candidate will be required to read a portion of his notes to the examiner.

Candidates must furnish their own note books, pen, ink and typewriting machine (if desired). The Commission will not at any time or in any way be responsible for machines, nor will any allowance be made where machines are missing, late in arriving, defective or out of order on the day of the examination.
