



NEW YORK, February 10, 1876.

To Hon. WILLIAM H. WICKHAM, Mayor:

SIR—The Board of Assessors herewith submit their report of the work performed in this office during the year ending December 31, 1875.

It will be seen by comparison of the lists made up in this office, during the two years, that the number of pieces of property assessed in 1875 was 25,486 in excess of the total of 1874, while there is an increase of \$1,274,956.06 in the aggregate cost of the work of the past year over that of the preceding one.

By the Laws of 1840, chapter 324, section 7, it is provided that not more than one-half of the assessed valuation shall be charged against the property on the line of improvement.

In compliance with this law, the Board of Assessors have been obliged to charge \$246,327.17 upon the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City, or more than 5 per cent. of the whole cost of the work.

Owing to the change of grade in a number of the streets north of Fifty-ninth street, considerable damage has been done to buildings thereon, claims for which have been filed in this office.

A recent decision of the Court of Appeals has imposed the duty on the Board of Assessors of awarding damages on all property injured by the closing of the Bloomingdale road, under the Act of April 24, 1865, directing the laying out and constructing the Boulevard.

The Board have, in compliance with this decision, taken action on several of these cases, and a number are now on file awaiting examination.

A schedule showing the work done in the office accompanies this report, marked "A;" also a second schedule, marked "B," containing a statement of all the assessment lists now in this office, showing the amount of each, and those advertised up to this date, February 10, 1876.
