POLICE DEPARTMENT.

REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1915.

The authorized strength of the police force at the end of the quarter, in all ranks, was 10,858. There were on the rolls December 31, 1915, in all ranks, a total of 10,664. The following changes occurred in the personnel of the force during the quarter: promoted, 1 Captain, 2 Lieutenants, 20 Patrolmen; retired on application, 2 Captains, 2 Lieutenants, 4 Sergeants and 21 Patrolmen; retired on Surgeons' certificate, 1 Surgeon, 1 Captain, 2 Lieutenants, 3 Sergeants, 8 Patrolmen and 1 Matron; retired, 60 years of age, 2 Captains and 2 Sergeants; died, 3 Lieutenants, 1 Sergeant, 14 Patrolmen and 2 Probationary Patrolmen; dismissed, 16 Patrolmen; 1 Probationary Patrolman; dropped from rolls, 1 Lieutenant and 1 Patrolman; suspended under section 1543 of Charter, 1 Surgeon; resigned, 11 Patrolmen; reinstated, 1 Captain, 6 Patrolmen, 1 Probationary Patrolman; appointed on probation, 51 Patrolmen.  
The personnel of the Department, other than members of the force, numbered 300 on September 30, 1915, and 303 on December 31, 1915.  
During the quarter the Medical Officers (Surgeons) of the Department made an aggregate of 13,225 visits to members of the force absent through sickness, an aggregate of 21,301 days. They made 240 physical examinations of candidates for appointment and 16 of members of the force retired for disability.  
During the quarter a total of 1,022 disciplinary charges were preferred against members of the force and 840 charges were disposed of (including charges pending at the beginning of the quarter). Of these 132 were filed, in 121 cases the charges were dismissed, reprimands were given in 271 cases, and in 293 cases fines were inflicted, while 23 charges resulted in dismissal from the Department.  
The Motorcycle Squad served 4,607 summonses during the quarter.  
The total receipts from licenses during the quarter were \$237.50.  
A total of 989 persons, residents of the city, were reported missing. Inquiries from outside the city were received concerning 409 missing persons, who it was supposed might be in the city. Of those so reported during the current year there were located during this quarter (including those who returned home) 953 residents and 370 non-residents.

The Property Clerk received during the quarter a total of 2,482 lots of lost, stolen or abandoned property and condemned department property. The estimated total value of property delivered by the Department to claimants during the quarter was \$337,294.82.  
There were 446 horses on hand on September 30, and 414 on hand on December 31. The Steam Boiler Squad examined during the quarter 3,333 engineers and 366 firemen, and tested 4,140 steam boilers.

On September 30 there were 22 witnesses in the House of Detention. During the quarter 80 witnesses were admitted and 70 discharged, leaving 32 detained on December 31, 1915.

During the quarter 12 original applications for pension and 2 for relief were granted. Five original applications and 2 increase applications, and one application for relief were denied.

Following is a summary of arrests made and summonses served and the dispositions thereof during the quarter, compared with the corresponding quarter in 1914. These figures include arrests by the uniformed force and the Detective Bureau, and the dispositions given include cases pending on September 30 in each year, which were disposed of during the fourth quarter:

ABSTRACT OF PROCEEDINGS OF PARK BOARD.

For Week Ended Jan. 22, 1916.

2nd meeting, Thursday, January 20th, 2 p. m.

Present—Commissioners Ward (Presi- dent), Whittle, Ingersoll, Weier—4.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was omitted.

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That, in view of the fact that Mr. Herman V. Letkemann, Photo- grapher, formerly under the Depart- ment of Parks, Manhattan and Rich- mond, is now under the Park Board, that the President of the Park Board take such steps as may be necessary to control the time of the Photographer so it may be available for each separate Commis- sioner composing the Board.

All bids received January 6, 1916, for dredging in the North River, between 103rd and 109th Streets, Borough of Man- hattan, were rejected.

Time was extended forty working days on contract with Henry H. Vought, dated June 29th, 1915, for furnishing all labor and materials for erection and comple- tion of an Animal Hospital in the Zoologi- cal Park, Bronx Park.

Contract Awarded—All labor and ma- terials required for the installation of galleries, bookshelves and cases in Rooms 307, 308, 313, 226, for the preservation of valuable manuscripts and prints at the New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations, Manhattan.

For Week Ended February 5, 1916. Stated meeting, Thursday, February 3rd, 3 p. m.

Present—Commissioners Ward (Presi- dent), Whittle, Ingersoll.

The following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That section 12, article 1, chapter 17 of the City Ordinances, being the Park Ordinances, be amended to read as follows:

Section 12. Permits for sales, exhibi- tions, etc. No person shall exhibit, sell, or offer for sale anything whatsoever, or take any photograph, or perform any per- sonal service for hire in any park or park- way, or in any street, square, or public place under the jurisdiction of the respec- tive Commissioner of Parks having juris- diction or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permit, provided, however, that the provisions of this sec- tion shall not apply to public hack stands maintained in streets adjacent to public parks, pursuant to section 99, article 8, chapter 14 of the Code of Ordinances.

The efficiency Report of Joseph Gat- ringer for the last quarter was rated in accordance with the rating of previous quarters.

Communication was received from R. G. Packard Co., protesting against re- jection of bid for dredging in North River.

The Secretary was instructed to write a letter in reply to R. G. Packard Co., stat- ing that the bid was rejected because amount of bid exceeded the amount of appropriation allowed for the purpose

by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

Notification was received from the Central Purchasing Committee that bids for lumber would be received at their office at 12 o'clock noon on Monday, February 7th, for the Department of Parks, Brooklyn and Bronx.

Communication from the New York Zoological Society, in reference to incorporating rules governing use of Zoological Park as part of Park Ordinances, was referred to Commissioner Whittle for report to the Board.

The Secretary was instructed to place on the Calendar of the next meeting the question of revising the Park Ordinances, fixing the rate of vehicular traffic at eight miles an hour, as a special order of business.

#### Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held January 4th, 1916, at 3.30 p. m.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; Messrs. Paulding, O'Keefe, Sachs, Stern, Farley and Robbins, Trustees. Excused, Mr. Kingsbury, Commissioner of Public Charities.

The minutes of the meeting of December 28th, 1915, were held as read and approved.

Doctor O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

It has been customary in January of each year to obtain permission from the Board of Aldermen to buy fresh fruits and vegetables in the open market, without public letting, for the various hospitals, the total amount not to exceed \$12,000. Your approval is requested. It is also necessary to renew our request to the Board of Aldermen for permission to buy, without public letting, three ambulances and a motor truck, funds for which were provided in the budget for 1916.

Several members of the house staff were transferred on Friday and Saturday to the rooms in the new building; the surgical children were transferred on Friday last, and the remaining special services will be moved within the next few days.

The Board of Health has vacated the building used as an eye clinic in the rear of Gouverneur Hospital. Permission has been given by the Board of Health to use this building temporarily for the open air classes and children's clinic, which were formerly on the "Westfield."

Kate Conway has been in the service of the hospital in the capacity of Helper, for 36 years, and asks to be retired on pension.

The daily average census at the various hospitals, during the month of December, 1915, was as follows: Bellevue, 1,229; Gouverneur, 192; Harlem, 210; Fordham, 176; Neponset, 84.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent, as follows:

It was resolved to request the Board of Aldermen for permission to purchase in the open market, without public letting (a) fresh fruits and vegetables to an amount not exceeding \$12,000, and (b) three ambulances and a motor truck.

It was moved, seconded and carried, to approve the temporary use of the building near Gouverneur Hospital (recently vacated by the Department of Health) for the open air classes and the children's clinic from the "Westfield," and it was further

Resolved, To appoint Mr. Stern as a member of the Special Committee appointed by the Trustees, with power, to inquire into and make arrangements to obtain a place for the patients formerly cared for on the boat "Westfield."

It was resolved to request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to retire Kate Conway, Helper, at Bellevue Hospital, from active service with a pension.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS.

The President presented a tabulation of bids received at the office of the Central Purchasing Committee on December 29th, 1915, for stock vegetables required for the first two months of 1916. Contracts were awarded to the low formal bidders.

A tabulation of bids received at the office of the Central Purchasing Committee on December 31st, for motor vehicle tires and tubes was presented. Contracts were awarded to the low formal

bidder on class A-4, and bids were rejected on classes A-1, A-6 and A-10.

The Conference Committee on Gouverneur Hospital recommended the appointment of Doctor Morris I. Goldberger as Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients, gynecology, and Doctor Samuel I. Turken, as Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved and appointments made accordingly.

Mr. Paulding presented a report relating to the age at which physicians and surgeons in various hospitals in the United States and Europe are retired from active service. After discussion, it was

Resolved, That on and after the first day of March, 1916, it shall be the rule in each and every hospital under the control of the Board of Trustees that the entire service of all surgeons attached to the several visiting staffs of said hospitals shall terminate at the age of 60 years, and of all physicians at the age of 62.

Resolved, That physicians and surgeons who shall be retired in accordance with this rule, shall be transferred automatically to the Consulting lists of the several hospitals they have served.

Doctor Brannan reported that under date of December 27th, he requested the Sinking Fund Commission to give favorable consideration to the communication of the Department of Public Charities for the removal of the old morgue building from the foot of East 26th Street, and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund replied under date of December 31st, that there is no such request before the Commission. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to present an urgent appeal to the Commissioner of Public Charities for the removal of the old morgue, and also to remind him of the strong feeling of the Trustees in this matter.

Mr. Paulding referred to the crowded condition in the out-patient department of Bellevue Hospital. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, to instruct the General Medical Superintendent to arrange as expeditiously as possible for the use of parts of the administration building, in order to relieve the situation in that branch of the service.

Reference was made to the department's request of November 26th, 1915, to the Board of Aldermen to exempt from public letting the contract for the employment of the Croker National Fire Prevention Engineering Company for four months ending December 31st, 1915, which was not reported out of Committee of the last Board of Aldermen. On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was resolved to renew this request.

On the recommendation of the Building Committee, it was moved, seconded and carried to authorize the employment of John C. Quinn as Combustion Engineer, in accordance with the provisions of Schedule No. 2096 of the budget for 1916, to prepare plans and specifications for the equipment and alterations in the power plants of the department to permit the burning of cheaper fuel; and it was further

Resolved, To authorize such changes in the power plant equipment.

Reference was made to the expenditure of funds for the purpose of buying toys for the children at Neponset Beach Hospital. On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was resolved to authorize the withdrawal of that part of the interest that may be required for this purpose from the account No. 703491, in the Emigrant Industrial Savings Bank.

Doctor Brannan reported that Doctor P. W. Roberts has made a request for the appointment of an Assistant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Neponset Beach Hospital for Children. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the creation of this place was approved.

#### COMMUNICATIONS.

A letter dated January 4th, was presented from the New York University, acknowledging the receipt of the Trustees' communication in regard to the reorganization of the services at Bellevue Hospital, concurring in the proposals and replying that the manner of conducting the services is under consideration, details of which have not yet been worked out, and it is proposed to appoint directors to the general medical, general surgical and gynaecological services.

A letter was also presented from Cornell University under date of January 4th presenting a preliminary reply in regard to the reorganization of the services of Bellevue Hospital in so far as it relates to that University.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, action on these two communications was deferred, pending a further report and consideration.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Executive Committee of the Medical Board of Bellevue Hospital for December 31st, 1915, were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the tentative plan of the children's surgical service and the organization to be followed, together with the nominations for appointment and reappointment on the Fourth

Division were referred to the Conference Committee.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital for December 28th, were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the nominations of Doctors Graboff, Uran and Celano, as well as the request that Doctor Somerville be transferred to the tuberculosis clinic were referred to the Conference Committee; the appointment of a neurologist to have charge of the neurological cases in the hospital and in the out-patient department was approved; the creation of the position of Pathological Intern to serve for one year, and the appointment of Doctor W. M. Fielding as Resident Obstetrician, as well as the request that action be taken on the nominations of Doctor Somerville as Assistant Pathologist, and Dr. Sponsler, as Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients, were referred to the Conference Committee; the recommendations of Doctor Norris, Director of Laboratories, for an improved laboratory service at Harlem, were considered, and it was resolved to make provision in the budget for next year for the salary of a pathologist; the appointment of a technician, the lengthening of the service of Pathological Intern, from four to six months, and offering the facilities of the laboratory for the use of graduates of Harlem Hospital was approved; the applications of Dr. Fenwick Beekman and Dr. Herbert Stein for the place of Adjunct Assistant Visiting Surgeon, were referred to the Conference Committee for record when a vacancy occurs; the recommendation that the clinical records of the obstetrical service be kept on sheets of a prescribed form suggested by the Medical Board, was referred to the General Medical Superintendent.

A letter dated January 1st, 1916, was presented from Doctor John J. Moorhead, in regard to his appointment to the place of Visiting Surgeon to Harlem Hospital. It was moved, seconded and carried, to inform Doctor Moorhead that the records of this department show that he is senior in length of service, and his promotion does not affect that seniority.



The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street and the openings of the main sewer in the street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a resale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and he is further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

### PROPOSALS FOR BIDS AND ESTIMATES FOR THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

#### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

#### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock, or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately.

The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
