The minutes of the meeting held January 24, 1881, were read and approved.

The Comptroller offered the following resolutions:

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand eight hundred and one dollars and seventy-one cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "St. Joseph's Asylum," for the support of 208 children committed to said institution by magistrates, pursuant to law, for the months of October, November, and December, 1880, aggregating 17,023 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand three hundred and eleven dollars and fourteen cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "Association for the Benefit of Colored Orphans," for the support of 93 children committed to said institution by Police Justices, pursuant to law, for the months of October, November, and December, 1880, aggregating 8,089 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of nineteen hundred and forty-five dollars and ninety-three cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "American Female Guardian Society and Home for the Friendless," for the support of 79 children committed to said institution by magistrates, pursuant to law, for the months of October, November, and December, 1880, aggregating 6,837 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred and seventy-three dollars and forty-three cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "Asylum of St. Vincent de Paul," for the support of 42 children committed to said institution by magistrates, pursuant to law, for the months of October, November, and December, 1880, aggregating 3,057 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand five hundred and seventy-eight dollars and twenty-eight cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "St. Stephen's Home for Children," for the support of 208 children committed to said institution by magistrates, pursuant to law, for the months of November and December, 1880, aggregating 12,524 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of seven hundred and seventy-eight dollars and sixty-eight cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "Home for Fallen and Friendless Girls," for the support of 33 inmates, for the months of October, November, and December, 1880, at the rate of one hundred and fifty dollars each per annum, pursuant to chapter 868, Laws of 1873.

Resolved, That the sum of six thousand and eighty-eight dollars and eighty-six cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "Asylum of the Sisters of St. Dominic," for the support of 393 children committed to said institution by Police Justices, pursuant to law, for the months of November and December, 1880, aggregating 21,311 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

Resolved, That the sum of fifteen thousand one hundred and sixty-four dollars and eighty-five cents be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Excise Fund to the "Institution of Mercy," for the support of 919 children committed to said institution by Police Justices, pursuant to law, for the months of November and December, 1880, aggregating 53,077 days, at two dollars per week, being at the rate of about 28 57-100 cents per day for the support of each child; the appropriation being made in accordance with the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation dated January 16, 1877; provided that the said commitments be found by the Comptroller to be correct and legal.

1881," amounting to \$735,000, specified the amount of \$40,000 "For Removing Snow and Ice;" and,

Whereas, The said amount of \$40,000 has already been nearly expended in removing snow and ice, and to properly prosecute said work a large sum of money in addition thereto will be required; therefore,

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment be and is hereby requested to transfer the sum of \$19,000 from the unexpended balance of account entitled "Cleaning the Streets under Police Department—Removal of Ice and Snow for the year 1880," which is in excess of the amount required for the purposes and objects thereof, to the account entitled "Cleaning the Streets under Police Department—For Removing Snow and Ice for the year 1881," which is insufficient.

APPLICATIONS FOR EXEMPTIONS WILL BE heard here, from 9 to 4 daily, from all persons hitherto liable or recently serving who have become exempt, and all needed information will be given.

Those who have not answered as to their liability, or proved permanent exemption, will receive a "jury enrollment notice," requiring them to appear before me this year. Whether liable or not, such notices must be answered (in person, if possible, and at this office only) under severe penalties. If exempt, the party must bring proof of exemption; if liable, he must also answer in person, giving full and correct name, residence, etc., etc. No attention paid to letters.

Persons "enrolled" as liable must serve when called or pay their fines. No mere excuse will be allowed or interference permitted. The fines, received from those who, for business or other reasons, are unable to serve at the time selected, pay the expenses of this office, and if unpaid will be entered as judgments upon the property of the delinquents.

All good citizens will aid the course of justice, and secure reliable and respectable juries, and equalize their duty by serving promptly when summoned, allowing their clerks or subordinates to serve, reporting to me any attempt at bribery or evasion, and suggesting names for enrollment. Persons between sixty and seventy years of age, summer absentees, persons temporarily ill, and United States and District Court jurors are not exempt.

Every man must attend to his own notice. It is a misdemeanor to give any jury paper to another to answer. It is also punishable by fine or imprisonment to give or receive any present or bribe, directly or indirectly, in relation to a jury service, or to withhold any paper or make any false statement, and every case will be fully prosecuted.
