IN THE MATTER OF an application, submitted by the Department of Transportation, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, for an amendment to the City Map involving:

- the modification of legal grades on Union Street between Classon Avenue and Franklin Avenue;

in Community District 9, Borough of Brooklyn, in accordance with Map No. X-2637 dated September 30, 2010, and signed by the Borough President.

The application (C 010415 MMK) for an amendment to the City Map was filed by the Department of Transportation on February 23, 2001 in order to facilitate the reconstruction of the Union Street Bridge over the New York City Transit Franklin Avenue shuttle and its approaches between Classon Avenue and Franklin Avenue in Brooklyn.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Transportation (DOT) is requesting a change to the City Map to reflect the reconstruction of the Union Street Bridge over the New York City Transit Franklin Avenue shuttle and its approaches between Classon Avenue and Franklin Avenue, in the Crown Heights neighborhood of Brooklyn. The reconstruction of the bridge and its approaches was completed in 1999. DOT requests that the legal grades on the City Map be modified to reflect the new grades used for the reconstruction of the bridge.

Reconstruction of the approximately 45-foot-long bridge included replacement of bridge structural and safety members and reconstruction of the roadway pavement and sidewalks. The reconstructed section of Union Street is City-owned, open to one-way eastbound traffic and is mapped to a width of 70 feet. The area affected by the grade change is approximately 305 feet in length. The modification of grades is due to the bridge profile being changed to more closely reflect the existing grade and to ensure minimal impact on abutting properties. The maximum change in legal grade is approximately twelve inches.

The Franklin Avenue shuttle is a shuttle service running between Prospect Park and Franklin Avenue providing an important connection between the A&C Subway lines and the B&Q Subway Lines. The site is located within R6A and R8A residential districts. The surrounding area is predominately developed with residential and commercial uses.

In response to a polling letter issued to affected City agencies and utilities, no agencies had indicated any opposition to the proposed map change.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 010415 MMK) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq., and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The designated CEQR Number is 01DOT005K. The lead agency is the Department of Transportation. This application was determined to be a Type II action which requires no further review.

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 010415 MMK), was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on October 21, 2013, and was duly referred to Community Board 9 and the Brooklyn Borough President in accordance with Title 62 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-02(b).

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 9 held a public hearing on this application (C 010415 MMK) on December 17, 2013, and on the same day, by a vote of 28 to 0 with 0 abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending approval of the application.

Borough President Recommendation

This application (C 010415 MMK) was considered by the Borough President of Brooklyn, who issued a recommendation approving the application on December 23, 2013.

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On January 8, 2014 (Calendar No.4) the City Planning Commission scheduled January 22, 2014 for a public hearing on this application (C 010415 MMK). The hearing was duly held on January 22, 2014 (Calendar No. 6).

There were no speakers on this application and the hearing was closed.

CONSIDERATION

The City Planning Commission believes that this amendment to the City Map is appropriate. The Commission notes that many of the city's 1,500 bridges, which are owned, operated and maintained by DOT, are nearly a century old, and from time to time need to be replaced. Such was the case with the subject bridge on Union Street. The Commission further notes that the elevations of the bridge profile and approaches on Union Street required minor modification. The Commission believes that proposed grade changes are necessary to accommodate the new structure and complete the reconstruction of a formerly failing bridge.

RESOLUTION

Therefore, the City Planning Commission, deeming the proposed amendment to the City Map and any related acquisition or disposition to be appropriate, adopts the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the City Planning Commission finds that the action described herein will have no significant impact on the environment; and be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, that based on the environmental determination and the consideration described in this report, the application (C 010415 MMK) for the amendment to the City Map

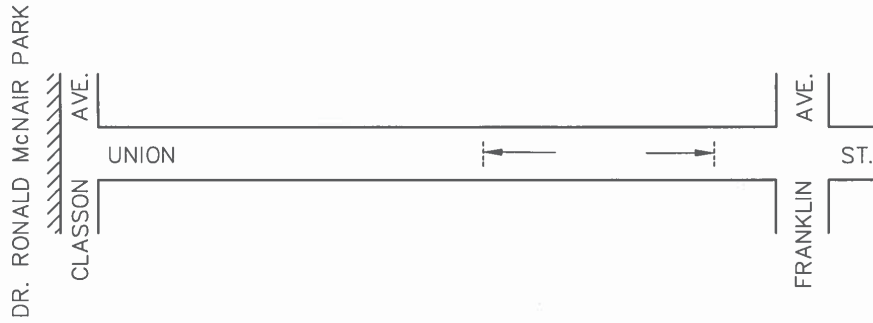
involving the modification of legal grades on Union Street between Classon Avenue and Franklin Avenue, in Community District 9, Borough of Brooklyn, in accordance with Map No. X-2637 dated September 30, 2010 and signed by the Borough President, is approved;

The subject amendment to the City Map shall take effect on the day following the day on which certified counterparts of Map No. X-2637 are filed with the appropriate agencies in accordance with Section 198 subsection c of the New York City Charter.

The above resolution (C 010415 MMK), duly adopted by the City Planning Commission on February 19, 2014 (Calendar No. 9), is filed with the Office of the Speaker, City Council and the Borough President, in accordance with the requirements of Section 197-d of the New York City Charter.
