

Eliminating from an existing R5 District a C1-3 District bounded by a line midway between Montgomery Street and Empire Boulevard, Lamont Court and its northerly centerline prolongation, a line 100 feet southerly of Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn Avenue, a line midway between Empire Boulevard and Sterling Street, a line 100 feet westerly of Brooklyn Avenue, Empire Boulevard and Brooklyn Avenue;
2. Eliminating from within an existing R7-1 District a C1-3 District bounded by:
 - a. Empire Boulevard, a line 100 feet westerly of Brooklyn Avenue, a line midway between Empire Boulevard and Sterling Street, and a line 150 feet westerly of Brooklyn Avenue; and
 - b. A line 100 feet southerly of Empire Boulevard, Lamont Court, a line 150 feet southerly of Empire Boulevard and Brooklyn Avenue;
3. Changing from an R5D District to an R7A District property bounded by a line midway between Montgomery Street and Empire Boulevard, Lamont Court and its northerly centerline prolongation, a line 100 feet southerly of Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn Avenue, Empire Boulevard, a line midway between Empire Boulevard and Sterling Street, a line 100 feet westerly of Brooklyn Avenue, Empire Boulevard, and Brooklyn Avenue; and
4. Establishing within a proposed R7A District a C2-4 District bounded by a line midway between Montgomery Street and Empire Boulevard, Lamont Court and its northerly centerline prolongation, a line 100 feet southerly of Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn Avenue, a line midway between Empire

Boulevard and Sterling Street, a line 100 feet westerly of Brooklyn Avenue, Empire Boulevard, and Brooklyn Avenue;

To facilitate the development of a 7-floor mixed use building with 68 dwelling units, with more than 24,000 square feet for retail approximately 21,600 sf for community facility space and 66 enclosed parking spaces at 529 Empire Boulevard.





(b) In R8A districts in Western Subarea C2, including #Commercial Districts# mapped within such R8A districts, the following special regulations shall apply:

- (1) Inclusionary Housing Program
(i) R8A Districts in Other Areas, west of Tenth Avenue, shall be #Inclusionary Housing designated areas#, pursuant to Section 12-10 (DEFINITIONS), for the purpose of making the Inclusionary Housing Program regulations of Section 23-90, inclusive, applicable as modified within the Special District.

(2) Maximum #floor area ratio#

Within such #Inclusionary Housing designated areas#, the maximum #floor area ratio# for any #zoning lot# containing a #residential use# shall not exceed a base #floor area ratio# of 5.4, except that such base #floor area ratio# may be increased to a maximum #floor area ratio# of 7.2 through the provision of #affordable housing#, pursuant to the provisions relating to #Inclusionary Housing designated areas# in Section 23-90. However, any units for which a #floor area# increase has been earned, pursuant to Section 23-90 shall be located within the #Special Clinton District#.

(ii) Optional provisions for #affordable housing#

For #developments# or #enlargements# located within the #blocks# bounded by West 51st Street, 11th Avenue, West 53rd Street and 10th Avenue, the special optional regulations as set forth in paragraph (b)(1)(ii) of this Section, may modify the provisions of Section 23-952 (Floor area compensation in Inclusionary Housing designated areas).

The #residential floor area# of a #development# or #enlargement# may be increased by 0.833 square feet for each one square foot of #moderate income floor area#, or by 0.625 square feet for each one square foot of #middle income floor area#, provided that for each square foot of such #floor area compensation#, there is one square foot of #floor area compensation#, pursuant to Section 23-952. However, the amount of #affordable housing# required to receive such #floor area compensation# need not exceed the amounts specified as follows. If #affordable housing# is provided for both #low income# and #moderate income households#, the amount of #moderate income floor area# need not exceed 15 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor

area#, on the #zoning lot#, provided that the amount of #low income floor area# is at least 10 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#. If #affordable housing# is provided for both #low income# and #middle income households#, the amount of #middle income floor area# need not exceed 20 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#, provided that the amount of #low income floor area# is at least 10 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#.

For the purposes of this paragraph, (b)(1)(ii), #low income floor area# may be considered #moderate income floor area# or #middle income floor area#, and #moderate income floor area# may be considered #middle income floor area#.

(2) Special #use# and #bulk# regulations for existing electrical utility substations

Electrical utility substations, operated for public utility purposes, existing on June 14, 2011, and located wholly or partially within the portion of Western Subarea C2 east of 11th Avenue, shall be considered conforming #uses# that are subject to the #bulk# regulations of the underlying district and the #use# regulations of an M1-5 District. Any change of #use# on a #zoning lot# occupied by any such electrical utility substation shall be permitted only pursuant to the regulations of the underlying district. In the event any such electrical utility substation is damaged or destroyed, in whole or in part, by any means, including demolition, the provisions of Section 54-40 (DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION IN NONCOMPLYING BUILDINGS) shall not apply and such electrical utility substation may be reconstructed, provided that such reconstruction shall not create a new #non-compliance# nor increase the degree of #non-compliance# with the applicable #bulk# regulations. However, in the event there is a complete cessation of #use# of the #zoning lot# as an electrical utility substation for a continuous period of five years, such electrical utility substation shall no longer be considered a conforming #use# on such #zoning lot#.

96-32 Special Regulations in R9 Districts

In R9 Districts in Western Subarea C2, the provisions of Section 23-633 (Street wall location and height and setback regulations in certain districts) for R9A Districts shall apply to all #buildings or other structures#. In #Commercial Districts# mapped within R9 Districts in Western Subarea C2, the provisions of Section 35-24 (Special Street Wall Location and Height and Setback Regulations in Certain Districts) for C2-7A Districts shall apply to all #buildings or other structures#. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of Section 23-011 (Quality Housing Program), in all such R9 Districts and #Commercial Districts# mapped within such R9 Districts, the provisions of paragraph (b) of Section 23-011 shall apply.

(a) Inclusionary Housing Program

- (1) R9 Districts in Other Areas, west of Tenth Avenue, shall be #Inclusionary Housing designated areas# pursuant to Section 12-10 (DEFINITIONS) for the purpose of making the Inclusionary Housing Program regulations of Section 23- 90, inclusive, applicable as modified within the Special District.

(b) Maximum #floor area ratio#

Within such #Inclusionary Housing designated area#, the maximum #floor area ratio# for any #zoning lot# containing a #residential use# shall not exceed a base #floor area ratio# of 6.0, except that such base #floor area ratio# may be increased to a maximum #floor area ratio# of 8.0 through the provision of #affordable housing#, pursuant to the provisions relating to #Inclusionary Housing designated areas# in Section 23-90. However, any units for which a #floor area# increase has been earned pursuant to Section 23-90 shall be located within the #Special Clinton District#.

(2) Optional provisions for #large-scale general developments# within Western Subarea C2

For #developments# or #enlargements# located within the #blocks# bounded by West 51st Street, 11th Avenue, West 53rd Street and 10th Avenue, the special optional regulations as set forth in paragraph (a)(2) of this Section, may modify the provisions of Section 23-952 (Floor area compensation in Inclusionary Housing designated areas).

The #residential floor area# of a #development# or #enlargement# may be increased by 0.833 square feet for each one square foot of #moderate income floor area#, or by 0.625 square feet for each one square foot of #middle income floor area#, provided that for each square foot of such #floor area compensation#, there is one square foot of #floor area compensation#, pursuant to Section 23-952. However, the amount of #affordable housing# required to receive such #floor area compensation# need not exceed the amounts specified as follows. If #affordable housing# is provided for both #low income# and #moderate income households#, the amount of #moderate income floor area# need not exceed 15 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor

area#, on the #zoning lot#, provided that the amount of #low income floor area# is at least 10 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#. If #affordable housing# is provided for both #low income households# and #middle income households#, the amount of #middle income floor area# need not exceed 20 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#, provided that the amount of #low income floor area# is at least 10 percent of the total #floor area#, exclusive of ground floor non-#residential floor area#, on the #zoning lot#.

For the purposes of this paragraph, (a)(2), #low income floor area# may be considered #moderate income floor area# or #middle income floor area#, and #moderate income floor area# may be considered #middle income floor area#.

(b) #Uses# in Western Subarea C2 located within a #large scale general development#

- (1) Within a C2-5 District mapped within an R9 District within Western Subarea C2, the following #uses#, when located wholly within a #large-scale general development#, shall be considered permitted #uses#:

Use Group 8:

Lumber stores, with no limitation on #floor area#

Use Group 10:

Photographic or motion picture production studios

Use Group 12:

Art galleries, commercial

Use Group 13:

Theaters

Use Group 16:

Automotive service establishments

Use Group 17:

Scenery construction.

- (2) #Uses# listed in paragraph (b)(1) of this Section shall be subject to the #commercial bulk# regulations of Article III, Chapter 2, applicable within a C2-5 District mapped within an R9 District.

- (3) The supplemental #use# provisions of Section 32-421 shall not apply to #commercial uses# located in a #building# with frontage on West 52nd Street.

The boundaries of #Inclusionary Housing designated areas# are shown on the maps listed in this Appendix F. The #Residence Districts# listed for such areas shall include #Commercial Districts# where #residential buildings# or the #residential# portion of #mixed buildings# are governed by the #bulk# regulations of such #Residence Districts#. Where #Inclusionary Housing designated areas# are mapped in #Commercial Districts#, the residential district equivalent has instead been specified for each map.



Since renewal applicants are being undercharged twenty-five dollars for each triennial renewal, it is proposed to amend this rule to require a triennial renewal fee of seventy-five dollars.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rules

On February 23, 2012, the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") issued a Request for Proposals ("RFP") to identify a vendor to provide training, testing, and business education services to current license holders and new applicants seeking to obtain a license to operate a vehicle licensed by the TLC to provide for-hire transportation. The RFP is part of a continuous effort to provide a better customer experience for passengers and to consolidate and improve the TLC's driver education program.

Prior to the RFP, for a driver to obtain a TLC license, he or she was required to attend and pass a series of approved courses offered by different vendors. To ensure consistency in driver training and that all drivers receive the same information, the RFP created a comprehensive curriculum that will be administered by only one vendor.

These proposed rules amend the rules governing driver education requirements to reflect the terms of the contract and the goals of the RFP. Specifically the proposed rules:

- Add a definition of "Authorized Driver Education Services Provider".
- Amend the rules to clarify that all courses drivers can or must take must be taken from the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider.
- Reduce the minimum number of hours required for training to reflect the actual number of training hours provided in practice to cover the required curriculum.
- Require all applicants for a Taxicab Driver's renewal license to take a License Renewal Course.
- Require all new Taxicab Driver's license applicants to take a Wheelchair Passenger Assistance Training Course.
- Eliminate the required remedial course for persistent violators, as all drivers, not just persistent violators, will be required to take refresher courses at frequent intervals.

These rules are authorized by Section 2303 of the Charter and Sections 19-503 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York.

Section 1. The definitions of the terms "Authorized Taxicab Training," "Authorized Taxicab Training Refresher Course," "Defensive Driving Course," and "Distracted Driving Course" as set forth in section 51-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended, and a new definition of the term "Authorized Driver Education Services Provider" is added, in alphabetical order, to read as follows:

Authorized Driver Education Services Provider refers to the entity which, under contract with the Commission, will provide all English proficiency testing and all Authorized Taxicab Training, Authorized License Renewal, Defensive Driving, Distracted Driving, Wheelchair Passenger Assistance Training, and Voluntary Point Reduction courses and accompanying exams to Licensees.

Authorized Taxicab Training refers to a course of training [approved] authorized by the Commission that contains at least [80] 40 hours of instruction on Commission-required topics such as Commission rules and procedures, geography, map reading, Passenger relations, and courtesy.

Authorized [Taxicab Training Refresher] License Renewal Course refers to a [four] five-hour course of training [approved] authorized by the Commission that is required for renewal of a [Probationary] Taxicab Driver's License, and that includes topics such as an update of Rule

changes, a review of Driver Responsibilities and duties, passenger relations, and an awareness of serving passengers with disabilities.

Defensive Driving Course refers to a course in defensive driving given by a school, facility or agency [approved] authorized by the Commission and certified by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

Distracted Driving Course means a course of training [approved] authorized by the Commission about the dangers of driving while distracted by Using an Electronic Communication Device and about the rules governing the Using of an Electronic Communication Device. The course must last at least [one] two hours.

Section 2. Paragraphs (3), (4), and (7) of subdivision (c) of section 54-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

(3) Authorized Taxicab Training refers to a course of training [approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider that contains at least [80] 40 hours of instruction on Commission-required topics such as Commission rules and procedures, geography, map reading, Passenger relations, and courtesy.

(4) Authorized [Taxicab Training Refresher] License Renewal Course refers to a five[four]-hour course of training [approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider that is required for renewal of a [Probationary] Taxicab Driver's License, and that includes topics such as an update of Rule changes, a review of Driver Responsibilities and duties, passenger relations, and an awareness of serving passengers with disabilities.

* * *

(7) Defensive Driving Course refers to a course in defensive driving given by [a school, facility or agency approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider and certified by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

Section 3. Subdivision (k) of section 54-04 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(k) Training. The Commission requires that Applicants for a new License pass all prescribed tests, both oral and written, as administered by the Commission or at its direction. All Applicants filing an application on or after a date to be set by the Commission must take the courses listed in paragraphs (1) through (3) below from the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider.

* * *

(3) [Authorized Taxicab Training Refresher Course. During the last 60 days of the initial one-year Probationary term, Probationary Licensees must attend and pass an Authorized Taxicab Training Refresher course in order to qualify for a renewal License.] Authorized License Renewal Course. A Taxicab Driver's License Renewal Applicant must complete the Authorized License Renewal Course within the 45 days prior to expiration of his/her Taxicab Driver's License expiration.

Section 4. Subdivisions (l), (m), and (n) of section 54-04 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

(l) Training Providers. [Providers of Authorized Taxicab Training and Refresher Training services] The Authorized Driver Education Services Provider must be [approved] authorized by the Commission, must administer the curriculum required by the Commission, and must have Commission approval of all fees charged to Taxicab Drivers License Applicants.

(m) Continuing Training Requirements. All renewal Applicants are required to attend and complete an authorized Defensive Driving Course [at least every three years. No Taxicab Driver's License will be renewed unless the Applicant submits a certificate of completion of the Defensive Driving Course from an authorized provider dated less than three years prior to the date of the renewal application] and submit a Certificate of Completion dated less than three years prior to the date of the renewal application.

(n) Wheelchair Passenger Assistance Training.

(1) Training Must be [Approved] Authorized by Commission. [In order to become a driver of an Accessible Taxicab or an Accessible Street Hail Livery, a Driver must attend a Commission-approved training course regarding Wheelchair Passenger assistance] All new applicants must attend a Wheelchair Passenger assistance training course offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider. All renewal Applicants must

attend a Wheelchair Passenger assistance training course offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider in order to become a driver of an Accessible Taxicab or Accessible Street Hail Livery. (Note: this requirement does not apply to a Paratransit Driver operating an Accessible Street Hail Livery).

(2) Requirements of the Course. Wheelchair Passenger assistance training must be a minimum of three hours and must include the following:

* * *

(v) Coordinate with the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher to include training on the devices used by the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher to ensure efficient service to the customer.

Section 5. Subdivision (f) of section 54-07 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(f) [Refresher Training Course] License Renewal Course Fees. Participants of an Authorized Taxicab [Training Refresher] License Renewal Course must pay the fee charged by the [authorized provider] Authorized Driver Education Services Provider.

Section 6. The penalty for violation of paragraph (1) of subdivision (e) of section 54-14 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(e) Use of Electronic Communication Device.

(1) A Driver must not Use an Electronic Communication Device while operating a Vehicle. A Driver can Use an Electronic Communication Device only while the Vehicle is lawfully standing or parked.

§54-14(e)(1) Fine: \$250 if plead guilty before a Appearance NOT hearing; \$350 if found guilty following REQUIRED a hearing, and suspension. The suspension is deferred for 60 days; if the driver completes an authorized Distracted Driving Course within the 60-day period then the driver will not be suspended.

Points: 3 for the first offense and for the second offense in any 15-month period; 4 for the third offense in any 15-month period.

Section 7. (5) Point Reduction for Voluntary Course Completion.

(i) Before suspending or revoking a Driver's License, the Commission will deduct two points from the total points of any Licensee who voluntarily attends and satisfactorily completes a remedial or refresher course [approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider.

Section 9. Subdivision (f) of section 55-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(f) Defensive Driving Course refers to a course in defensive driving given by a school, facility or agency [approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider and certified by the New York State DMV.

Section 10. (5) Point Reduction for Voluntary Course Completion.

(ii) Before suspending or revoking a Driver's License, the Commission will deduct two points from the total points of any Licensee who voluntarily attends and satisfactorily completes a remedial or refresher course [approved by the Commission] offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider.

Section 12. Subdivision (c) of section 56-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(c) [Approved Motor Vehicle Accident Prevention Program. An accident prevention] Authorized Defensive Driving Course. A Defensive Driving course offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider and approved by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

Such point reduction will count only towards points accumulated by the Licensee as a result of violations that occurred within 15 months prior to the date of the completion of the course. In order for the [motor vehicle accident prevention course] Defensive Driving Course to reduce the Licensee's Critical Driver's Program points and avoid suspension or revocation of the Driver's Commuter Van Driver's License, the course must be satisfactorily completed prior to the issuance of a critical driver program summons. Completion of the [motor vehicle accident prevention course] Defensive Driving Course after the issuance of a critical driver program summons will reduce the Licensee's Critical Driver's Program points only after the Licensee completes his or her suspension.  - (1) *Training Must be [Approved] Authorized by the Commission.* The Owner of an Accessible Taxicab must make sure each Driver of such Accessible Taxicab has attended a [Commission-approved] training course offered by the Authorized Driver Education Services Provider regarding Wheelchair Passenger assistance.
 - (2) *Requirements of the Course.* Wheelchair Passenger assistance training must be a minimum of three hours and must include the following:

President Obama signed the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2) into law on January 29, 2013. Among other appropriations, the Act included \$16 billion in CDBG-DR funds "for necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from Hurricane Sandy. This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order 11988 for Floodplain Management and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20(b) for the HUD action that is within and/or affects a floodplain. Under 24 CFR Part 58, the City, as the Recipient of the grant funds, has identified its Office of Management and Budget (OMB) as the Responsible Entity (RE) for maintaining the CDBG-DR Environmental Review Record (ERR).

Projects funded with CDBG-DR would be located in areas of impact from Hurricane Sandy throughout the five Boroughs of New York City. The City anticipates that most of the grant would be targeted toward rehabilitation or reconstruction activities designed to help victims of Hurricane Sandy, including homeowners and tenants of rental properties to achieve permanent, sustainable housing solutions that allow them to remain in New York City, and return to their neighborhoods where possible.

The City's initial allocation of CDBG-DR funds is \$1,772,820,000. Of this total, the City has allocated \$648 million in funding for assistance to address the various unmet housing needs it has identified so far. The focus of this notice is the Multi-family Building Rehabilitation Program, which will be administered by the Department of Housing Preservation & Development ("HPD"). Of the initial \$648 million of CDBG-DR allocated to housing, \$225 million would be provided to HPD for the rehabilitation of multifamily buildings (5+ units) and 3-4 unit buildings that are not owner-occupied. The activities will occur in areas served by existing infrastructure. All interested persons, groups and agencies are invited to submit comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support a project located in a floodplain. Request For Information Regarding Vehicle "Black Boxes" and Related Equipment

In coordination with the NYPD, DOT, other City agencies and members of the for-hire industries, the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") is exploring initiatives to work toward the City's "Vision Zero" goal of zero traffic fatalities. One initiative TLC is currently exploring is the usefulness and feasibility of black box recording devices, which record driver behavior, as tools to reduce driving behaviors that lead to collisions.

What should responders focus on for this RFI?

TLC is exploring inviting interested parties to participate in a pilot program involving the use of black box recording devices in TLC-licensed vehicles. Information obtained through this RFI may be used to help determine the scope, timing, participation criteria, and evaluation metrics of the pilot program. Although black boxes have many uses, such as facilitating post-collision investigations, TLC is particularly interested in learning how black box recording devices have been or could be used as tools to improve driving behaviors. Information on this topic would be particularly useful.

Some black box recording devices work with equipment that provides additional functionalities, such as driver alerts or speed governance. TLC plans to request information on these types of equipment in a future RFI. Respondents to this RFI may include information on these additional functionalities at this time or may wait for more specific questions on these technologies in the forthcoming RFI.

About what types of black boxes is TLC requesting information?

TLC's focus in this RFI is to collect data on "black boxes" rather than event data recorders (EDRs). "EDR" is the term the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration uses to refer to the device very commonly installed in vehicles that records technical data for a brief period in the event of a collision. This is in contrast to the "black boxes" we refer to in this RFI, which record data continuously while a vehicle is in operation and capture more data than do EDRs.

TLC invites interested parties to submit information regarding one, several, or all of the below topics. Each section of a submission should begin by referencing which of the below numbered topics it is addressing.

All information or suggestions should be submitted by March 31, 2014.

General Information Requested

TLC welcomes input from the public, safety experts, individuals with legal or legislative expertise on black box data collection and use, and entities that participate in the NYC taxi industry on how black boxes are currently being used and ideas for how they could be used to promote safety in TLC-regulated industries.

This Request for Information ("RFI") seeks to obtain information regarding:

- 1. Current Uses of Black Boxes.** The ways in which different entities, such as fleets, drivers, owners, bases, regulators, law enforcement, and insurance companies, currently use black box data. Examples could include investigation of insurance claims, identification of areas in which drivers need additional training, identification of drivers who may be in distress, identification of unsafe drivers, investigation of alleged criminal activity, enforcement of vehicle traffic law, or other uses.
- 2. Effectiveness of Black Boxes.** Evidence of the efficacy (or lack of efficacy) of black boxes and related technologies (e.g., cameras) in reducing collision rates or reducing dangerous driving behaviors, such as speeding and distracted driving.
- 3. Business Models for Black Boxes.** Business models surrounding black box equipment, including which party or parties pay for the equipment and what financial or non-financial incentives fleets, vehicle owners, and drivers have to use black box recording devices.
- 4. Parties Interested in Working with Black**

- Boxes in TLC-Regulated Industries.** Existing or potential partnerships between TLC-regulated vehicle/medallion owners and other organizations, such as black box equipment providers, insurance companies, or banks/lenders, which could facilitate implementation of a potential pilot program.
5. **Challenges Associated with Using Black Boxes.** Common challenges black boxes and related equipment face, such as connectivity problems, opportunities for user error/tampering, need for manual retrieval of data storage devices from equipment, privacy concerns, legal constraints, etc.
6. **Legislative or Regulatory Action Surrounding Black Boxes.** Actions regulators or organizations that set professional standards are undertaking or plan to undertake that could impact whether or how black boxes could be most effectively used to promote safe driving.

Specific Information Requested

TLC welcomes information about specific equipment capabilities from hardware/software makers, black box users, and other individuals who are knowledgeable about black boxes.

Basic Black Box Features

7. Descriptions of black box recording equipment and related equipment (e.g., cameras).
8. Data points collected (e.g., speed, high G-force incidents, braking and acceleration patterns) including the source of each (e.g., GPS unit, camera, black box, accelerometer) and ability to flag from processed data certain types of driver behavior, such as speeding, distracted driving, aggressive driving, or erratic driving.

Black Box System Costs

9. Description and cost per unit of primary recording equipment.
10. Descriptions and costs per unit of complementary equipment, such as cameras that are integrated with black box recording systems.
11. Installation, maintenance, and ongoing/recurring costs per black box/camera unit, per vehicle and/or per megabyte as applicable (e.g., data storage and/or transmission).
12. Durability of the systems, including the typical lifespan and crashworthiness of system components.

Relationship between Black Box and Rest of Vehicle

13. Installation/wiring diagrams detailing the black box hardware components' touch points to the vehicle's mechanical equipment and other data sources.
14. Relationship between black box operation and the operation of the vehicle itself and other in-vehicle systems (e.g., the battery draw of the system, the interaction between black box wireless transmittal and other wireless devices in the vehicle/shielding, regulations governing black boxes, placement of black box and related hardware in vehicle, necessary vehicle disassembly/assembly for installation).

Data Transmission Frequency and Mechanism.

15. Frequency of data collection (i.e., whether data streams are continuously recorded and retained or triggered by specific events), and whether this differs among component parts (e.g., whether video data are recorded with same frequency as speed data or other vehicle data).
16. Means of data transmission from black boxes by authorized users, such as real-time cellular transmission, wireless or wired aggregate data transfers, or physical removal of memory cards, and whether this differs among component parts (e.g., whether video data are transmitted by same means as speed data or other vehicle data).

Black Box Data Processing and Analytics

17. Data viewing and retrieval platforms available (e.g., in-vehicle displays, online portals, smartphone applications, other diagnostic software) and features included in the platform, and whether raw data can be accessed outside of these software platforms.
18. Timeliness of access to data via platform (e.g., real-time alerts and querying, daily data processing, and aggregation).
19. Credibility, accuracy and reliability of data collected, including examples of black box data being used successfully or unsuccessfully in legal settings.
20. Ability of software platforms to integrate with additional data sources, such as TLC's Taxi/Livery Passenger Enhancement Program (TPEP/LPEP) taximeter point of sale system trip data, TLC electronic administrative databases, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data such as road network data, and real-time traffic, construction, and weather alert data, either through an API or through other means.
21. Ability of software platforms to integrate with a wide range of black box hardware solutions and

sources (e.g. through a common hardware/software standard and/or API or other means).

22. Data storage and transmission requirements (e.g., storage space per 100 vehicles, reception equipment requirements, limitations (if any) on number of vehicles that could be monitored at once).

Privacy and Security

23. Security and privacy precautions used to safeguard collected data, manage access to it, and prevent tampering.

Other Questions

24. The technical feasibility, costs, and advantages/disadvantages of integrating black box data recorders with other in-vehicle technologies (e.g., TPEP/LPEP, security cameras).
25. Case studies of similar implementation of specific black box technology or platforms, particularly as they pertain to promoting safe driving.



READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in The City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays.

NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptroller's Office at www.comptroller.nyc.gov, and click on Prevailing Wage Schedules to view rates.

CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$17 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. Registration for these lists is free of charge. To register for these lists, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application, which can be found online at www.nyc.gov/selltonyc. To request a paper copy of the application, or if you are uncertain whether you have already submitted an application, call the Vendor Enrollment Center at (212) 857-1680.

SELLING TO GOVERNMENT TRAINING WORKSHOP

New and experienced vendors are encouraged to register for a free training course on how to do business with New York City. "Selling to Government" workshops are conducted by the Department of Small Business Services at 110 William Street, New York, NY 10038. Sessions are convened on the second Tuesday of each month from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. PRE-QUALIFIED LISTS

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstances. When an agency decides to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR. Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such lists may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification questionnaire may be submitted to an Agency Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated, and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH). Section 3-10 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists. For information regarding specific pre-qualified lists, please visit www.nyc.gov/selltonyc.

NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board Rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, and the Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders lists for Non-Mayoral entities should contact these entities directly at the addresses given in the Vendor Information Manual.

PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 9:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays. For more information, contact the Mayor's Office of Contract Services at (212) 341-0933 or visit www.nyc.gov/mocs.

ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. To obtain a copy of the certification application and to learn more about this program, contact the Department of Small Business Services at (212) 513-6311 or visit www.nyc.gov/sbs and click on M/WBE Certification and Access.

PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City pays interest on all late invoices. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest; these are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year: in January and in July.

KEY TO METHODS OF SOURCE SELECTION

The Procurement Policy Board (PPB) of the City of New York has by rule defined the appropriate methods of source selection for City procurement and reasons justifying their use. The CR procurement notices of many agencies include an abbreviated reference to the source selection method utilized. The following is a list of those methods and the abbreviations used:

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.
