A "wide street" is any #street# 75 feet or more in width. (ADD PROPOSED SPACE BETWEEN LINES HERE) In C5-3, C6-4 or C6-6 Districts, when a #front lot line# of a #zoning lot# adjoins a portion of a #street# whose average width is 75 feet or more and whose minimum width is 65 feet, such portion of a #street# may be considered a #wide street#; or when a #front lot line# adjoins a portion of a #street# 70 feet or more in width, which is between two portions of a #street# 75 feet or more in width, and which portion is less than 700 feet in length, such portion may be considered a #wide street#, and in that case, for the purposes of the height and setback regulations and the measurement of any #publicly accessible open area# or #arcade#, the #street line# shall be considered to be a continuous line connecting the respective #street lines# of the nearest portions of the #street# which are 75 feet or more in width.

Proposed Rule Amendment

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Commissioner of Buildings by Section 643 of the New York City Charter, and in accordance with Section 1043 of the Charter and Section BC Q104 of the New York City Building Code, the Department of Buildings proposes to amend Subchapter Q of chapter 3600 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York by adding a new section 3616-05.

This rule proposes to remove the requirement for Group R-3 one- and two-family dwellings as such connections are not necessary under standard operating procedures of the Fire Department of New York City.

This rule was not included in the agency's regulatory agenda. New matter is underlined.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

This rule amendment is proposed pursuant to the authority of the Commissioner of Buildings under Sections 643 and 1043 of the New York City Charter.

Pursuant to Section Q104.1 of the New York City Building Code, this rule establishes the technical standards for the installation of fire department connections as per NFPA 13R, *Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems in Residential Occupancies up to and Including Four Stories in Height*, 2002 edition, for purposes of applying such referenced standard in the City of New York in relation to sprinkler system design.

The original standard, as modified and adopted, requires fire department connections for sprinkler systems designed for Group R-2 and R-3 occupancies in accordance with the standard. This rule proposes to remove the requirement for Group R-3 one- and two-family dwellings as such connections are not used under standard operating procedures of the Fire Department of New York City. The removal of this requirement would also reduce an unnecessary cost burden on one- and two-family homeowners.

The fire department connections for sprinkler systems are typically used by the fire department to increase the water pressure within a sprinkler system. However, for one- and two-family dwellings, the domestic water supply can provide adequate pressure to the sprinkler system, and the fire department will not use the fire department connections even if they are provided in sprinkler systems serving one- or two-family dwellings. The proposed rule will reduce the cost burden on these homeowners by removing the requirement to install fire department connections within the sprinkler system.

Subchapter Q of chapter 3600 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new section 3616-05, to read as follows:

§3616-05 National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") 13R amendment relating to exemption from Fire Department connection requirements in one- and two-family residential buildings.

Pursuant to Section 28-103.19 of the New York City Administrative Code, paragraph 6.6.4 of NFPA 13R-02, as modified by Section Q104.1 of the New York City Building Code, is amended by adding language at the end of the paragraph to read as follows:

Exception: Fire department connection is not required for installations in one- and two-family dwellings.
