I. Permanent Housing Need for Fiscal Year 2022

Families

In FY2022, DHS expects to place 8,457 families into permanent housing based on actual FY2020 placements as reported in the FY2020 Mayor's Management Report. Of course, every effort will be made to exceed this projection. When available, appropriate families will be referred to NYCHA and Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) housing. Families may also be referred to other rental assistance programs, including CityFHEPS, FHEPS A&B, SOTA (Special One Time Assistance), and Section 8, as appropriate.

Single Adults

In FY2022, DHS expects to place 7,890 single adults into permanent housing based on actual FY2020 placements as reported in the FY2020 Mayor's Management Report. Of course, every effort will be made to exceed this projection. Where appropriate, these individuals will be referred to rental assistance programs such as CityFHEPS and SOTA, placed in private housing, placed into supportive housing, or re-housed with family.

II. Transitional Housing for Fiscal Year 2022

Families

We expect to need 11,513 units to house homeless families within the system in FY2022, based on the census of families on March 1, 2021. (Note: Family shelter usage has been altered dramatically in the period after the COVID-19 emergency and is subject to change.)

Single Adults

We expect to need 19,479 beds to house homeless individuals within the system during FY2022. This is based on an analysis of the census of single adults on March 1, 2021. (Note: Single Adult shelter usage has been altered dramatically in the period after the COVID-19 emergency and is subject to change.)
