TOMORROW: DE BLASIO ADMINISTRATION, ADVOCATES AND ELECTED OFFICIALS TO CALL FOR MORE SPEED CAMERAS AT NYC SCHOOLS

NEW YORK—Tomorrow, members of the de Blasio Administration, elected officials and street safety advocates will gather at P.S. 264 Bay Ridge Elementary School for the Arts to urge for the passage of A7798C/S6046C, a bill that would preserve existing speed cameras near school zones while also expanding them to additional, high priority school zones where speeding is prevalent. Currently, A7798C/S6046C has bipartisan support in the state Senate and 33 co-sponsors. The bill has yet to reach the floor for a vote where only 32 votes are needed to pass any given bill. A7798C/S6046C passed the Assembly overwhelming in June 2017.
